Introduced by M. of A. DINOWITZ -- read once and referred to the Committee on Codes

AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to increasing penalties for assault, obstruction and harassment of election officers

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 11 of section 120.05 of the penal law, as
2 amended by section 2 of part Z of chapter 55 of the laws of 2024, is
3 amended to read as follows:

4 11. With intent to cause physical injury to a train operator, ticket
5 inspector, conductor, signalperson, bus operator, station agent, station
6 cleaner, terminal cleaner, station customer assistant, traffic checker;
7 person whose official duties include the sale or collection of tickets,
8 passes, vouchers, or other revenue payment media for use on a train,
9 bus, or ferry the collection or handling of revenues therefrom; a person
10 whose official duties include the maintenance, repair, inspection, troubleshooting, testing or cleaning of buses or ferries, a transit signal
11 system, elevated or underground subway tracks, transit station structure, including fare equipment, escalators, elevators and other equipment necessary to passenger service, commuter rail tracks or stations,
12 train yard, revenue train in passenger service, a ferry station, or a
13 train or bus station or terminal; or a supervisor of such personnel,
14 employed by any transit or commuter rail agency, authority or company,
15 public or private, whose operation is authorized by New York state or
16 any of its political subdivisions, a city marshal, a school crossing
17 guard appointed pursuant to section two hundred eight-a of the general
18 municipal law, a traffic enforcement officer, traffic enforcement agent,
19 prosecutor as defined in subdivision thirty-one of section 1.20 of the
20 criminal procedure law, sanitation enforcement agent, New York city
21 sanitation worker, public health sanitarian, New York city public health
22 sanitarian, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, emergency

41 § 2. Section 195.05 of the penal law, as amended by section 16 of part
42 G of chapter 55 of the laws of 2024, is amended to read as follows:

43 § 195.05 Obstructing governmental administration in the second degree.

44 A person is guilty of obstructing governmental administration when:

45 1. Such person intentionally obstructs, impairs or perverts the admin-
46 istration of law or other governmental function or prevents or attempts
47 to prevent a public servant, including an election officer, from
48 performing an official function, by means of intimidation, physical
49 force or interference, or by means of any independently unlawful act, or
50 by means of interfering, whether or not physical force is involved, with
51 radio, telephone, television or other telecommunications systems owned
52 or operated by the state, or a county, city, town, village, fire
53 district or emergency medical service or by means of releasing a danger-
54 ous animal under circumstances evincing the actor's intent that the
55 animal obstruct governmental administration; or

1 2. With the intent to violate a closing order, order to seal, tempo-
2 rary closing order, or temporary order to seal issued by a governmental
3 entity to address a public health or safety concern, such person damages
4 or removes any padlock or other device installed for the purpose of
5 effectuating such order.

6 Obstructing governmental administration is a class A misdemeanor.

7 § 3. Section 240.30 of the penal law is amended by adding a new subdi-
8 vision 3-b to read as follows:

9 3-b. With the intent to harass, annoy, threaten or alarm an election
10 officer, such person strikes, shoves, kicks, or otherwise subjects
11 another person to physical contact, or attempts or threatens to do the
12 same while such election officer is performing such election officer's
13 official duties; or

14 § 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
