AN ACT to amend the education law and the public health law, in relation to the administration of immunizations by medical assistants

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 6526 of the education law is amended by adding a  
2 new subdivision 9-a to read as follows:

3 9-a. Any medical assistant when drawing and administering an immuniza-  
4 tion in an outpatient office setting under the direct supervision of a  
5 physician or physician assistant.

6 § 2. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 2113 to  
7 read as follows:

8 § 2113. Administration of immunizations; medical assistants. Notwith-  
9 standing any other law, rule, or regulation to the contrary, physicians  
10 and physician assistants are hereby authorized to delegate the task of  
11 drawing up and administering vaccinations to medical assistants in an  
12 outpatient office setting; provided, however, that such vaccinations are  
13 recommended by the federal advisory committee for immunization practices  
14 and centers for disease control and prevention; and provided, further,  
15 that medical assistants receive appropriate training and adequate super-  
16 vision in administering immunizations pursuant to regulations determined  
17 by the commissioner in consultation with the commissioner of education.

18 § 3. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after  
19 it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the addition, amend-  
20 ment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implemen-  
21 tation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made and  
22 completed on or before such effective date.
