Introduced by M. of A. NORBER -- read once and referred to the Committee on Local Governments

AN ACT to amend the village law and the public officers law, in relation to residency requirements for clerk-treasurer or deputy clerk in the village of Baxter Estates

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 3-300 of the village law is amended by adding a new
2 subdivision 36 to read as follows:

3 36. Notwithstanding any provisions of this chapter or any other gener-
4 al law, local law, ordinance or special act, the village board of trus-
5 tees of the incorporated village of Baxter Estates, Nassau county, may,
6 by resolution, provide that the office of village clerk-treasurer or
7 deputy clerk of such village may be held by a person who is not a resi-
8 dent of such village, provided that such person resides in the county of
9 Nassau or in an adjoining county within the state of New York.

10 § 2. Section 3 of the public officers law is amended by adding a new
11 subdivision 76 to read as follows:

12 76. In the village of Baxter Estates, in the county of Nassau, the
13 provisions of this section requiring a person to be a resident of the
14 political subdivision or municipal corporation of the state for which
15 such person shall be chosen or within which such person's official func-
16 tions are required to be exercised, shall not prevent such person from
17 holding the office of village clerk-treasurer or deputy clerk of the
18 village of Baxter Estates, provided that such person resides in Nassau
19 county or an adjoining county within the state of New York; provided,
20 however, any person performing such functions of village clerk-treasurer
21 or deputy clerk in any other village shall be a resident of such
22 village, unless otherwise provided by law.

23 § 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
