AN ACT to amend the veterans' services law, in relation to establishing a voluntary veterans' registry

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. The veterans' services law is amended by adding a new  
2 section 29-f to read as follows:

3 § 29-f. Voluntary veterans' registry. 1. The department shall establish a voluntary veterans' registry for the purpose of providing information on federal, state, and local governmental benefits, programs, and services available to veterans, and to link veterans with resources that can provide assistance.

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8 2. For the purposes of this section, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

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10 (a) "State agency" means any department, board, bureau, division, commission, council, or committee within the executive branch, the state university of New York, the city university of New York, or any public authority under control of the executive branch of the state of New York.

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15 (b) "Voluntary veterans' registry" or "registry" means the voluntary veterans' registry established pursuant to subdivision one of this section.

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18 (c) "State veterans' service agency" means a state veterans' service agency established pursuant to section thirteen of this article.

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20 (d) "Local veterans' service agency" means a local veterans' service agency established pursuant to section fourteen of this article.

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22 3. Upon a veteran's registration with the registry, if permission is granted by such veteran, such veteran's information shall be shared with other state agencies, state veterans' service agencies, and local veterans' service agencies.

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27 4. The department shall coordinate with other state agencies that have contact with veterans to establish a paper and online voluntary veterans' registry form to enable state agencies to assist the department in

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1 registering veterans who wish to be included in the registry. The  
2 department shall provide access to such paper and online voluntary  
3 veterans' registry form which shall contain a statement indicating the  
4 purpose of the registry and that filling out such form does not guaran-  
5 tee that a veteran is eligible for any benefits. Such form shall include  
6 but not be limited to the following information:

7 (a) name;

8 (b) address;

9 (c) gender;

10 (d) branch of military service;

11 (e) dates of military service;

12 (f) contact information, including phone or email;

13 (g) a signed statement, or for the online version, a box that is  
14 checked, indicating that the veteran grants permission to the department  
15 to store and share such veteran's information with the local veterans'  
16 service agencies' directors and with the other state agencies to ensure  
17 that the state provides such veteran assistance in receiving earned  
18 benefits; and

19 (h) any other information that the department may request.

20 5. Each state agency shall:

21 (a) utilize the paper or online voluntary veterans' registry form to  
22 develop a mechanism to identify veterans the agency serves for the  
23 purpose of expanding the registry;

24 (b) for each veteran who wishes to be included in the voluntary veter-  
25 ans' registry, the agency shall provide assistance in filling out the  
26 paper or online registry form for the department to add each such veter-  
27 an to the registry; and

28 (c) submit a veteran's paper registry form to the department within  
29 sixty days from the date the veteran opts in to the voluntary veterans'  
30 registry.

31 6. Information collected under this section shall not be sold or used  
32 for commercial purposes or used for purposes not specified under this  
33 section. Information regarding a veteran's status shall be protected as  
34 personal confidential material and shall only be used to assist in  
35 providing information about benefits and entitlements for veterans  
36 residing in the state on the federal, state, and local government level.  
37 Data collected under this section may be used by the department to  
38 assist in formulating future policy initiatives and shared with the  
39 veterans' services commission pursuant to section three of this article  
40 in its role of assisting the commissioner in the formulation of policies  
41 affecting veterans.

42 7. On or before December thirty-first, two thousand twenty-seven, and  
43 annually thereafter, the commissioner shall submit a report to the  
44 governor, the speaker of the assembly, and the temporary president of  
45 the senate. Such report shall include, but not be limited to, the total  
46 number of voluntary veterans' registry forms that were completed for the  
47 calendar year and a breakdown of registered veterans by gender and  
48 location.

49 § 2. Subdivision 5 of section 3 of the veterans' services law is  
50 amended to read as follows:

51 5. The commission shall have power, and it shall be its duty, to  
52 assist the state commissioner in the formulation of policies affecting  
53 veterans, including using data collected pursuant to section twenty-  
54 nine-f of this article, and in the coordination of all operations of  
55 state agencies relating to veterans' services.

1 § 3. This act shall take effect one year after it shall have become a  
2 law. Effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any  
3 rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its  
4 effective date are authorized to be made and completed on or before such  
5 effective date.
