AN ACT to amend the retirement and social security law, in relation to providing for prior service credit for county fire marshals in the county of Nassau

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

1 Section 1. Subdivision e of section 89-w of the retirement and social  
2 security law, as amended by chapter 476 of the laws of 2018, is amended  
3 to read as follows:

4 e. Credit for service as a member or officer of the state police or as  
5 a paid firefighter, police officer or officer of any organized fire  
6 department or police force or department of any county, city, village,  
7 town, fire district or police district, as a forest ranger I, forest  
8 ranger II, forest ranger III, assistant superintendent of forest fire  
9 control, or any successor titles or new titles in the forest ranger  
10 title series in the department of environmental conservation, as a  
11 police officer in the department of environmental conservation, as a  
12 park police officer trainee, park police officer, sergeant park police,  
13 lieutenant park police, major park police, or any successor titles or  
14 new titles in the park police title series in the office of parks,  
15 recreation and historic preservation or other state park authority or  
16 commission, as a member of the capital police force in the office of  
17 general services, as a fire protection specialist trainee 2, fire  
18 protection specialist trainee 1, fire protection specialist 1, fire  
19 protection specialist 2, fire protection specialist 3, or any successor  
20 titles or new titles in the fire protection specialist title series of  
21 the division of homeland security and emergency services, as an airport  
22 firefighter apprentice, airport firefighter I, airport firefighter II,  
23 airport firefighter III or training and safety officer in the division  
24 of military and naval affairs, as a uniformed court officer or peace  
25 officer employed by the unified court system, or as a criminal investi-

1 gator in the office of a district attorney shall also be deemed to be  
2 creditable service and shall be included in computing years of total  
3 service for retirement pursuant to this section.

4 § 2. Section 89-w of the retirement and social security law is amended  
5 by adding a new subdivision e-1 to read as follows:

6 e-1. Credit for paid service as an emergency medical services techni-  
7 cian, paramedic or in another title where the member performs emergency  
8 medical services for any county, city, village, town, fire district or  
9 police district, and paid service as a public safety dispatcher, emer-  
10 gency responder, emergency operator, emergency complaint operator, emer-  
11 gency services dispatcher or in another title where the member performs  
12 emergency communication services for any county, city, village, town,  
13 fire district or police district shall also be deemed to be creditable  
14 service and shall be included in computing years of total service for  
15 retirement pursuant to this section.

16 § 3. All past service costs associated with implementing the  
17 provisions of this act shall be borne by the county of Nassau and may be  
18 amortized over ten years.

19 § 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, none  
20 of the provisions of this act shall be subject to the appropriation  
21 requirement of section 25 of the retirement and social security law.

22 § 5. This act shall take effect immediately.

FISCAL NOTE.--Pursuant to Legislative Law, Section 50:

This bill would allow members of the New York State and Local Employees' Retirement System (NYSLERS) employed by Nassau County as a fire marshal to receive credit for prior service in a variety of titles. This includes, but is not limited to, service as a regional state park police officer, environmental conservation police officer, forest ranger, airport firefighter with the Division of Military and Naval Affairs, emergency medical services technician, and public safety dispatcher. No payment by the member would be required.

Insofar as this bill affects NYSLERS, there are approximately 25 benefiting members with annual salary of \$4 million as of March 31, 2025. These members would be immediately granted about 75 years of service credit, generating a past service cost of \$4.01 million to be borne by Nassau County as a one-time payment. If Nassau County elects to amortize this cost over 10 years, the cost for each year will be \$512,000.

The number of future members who could be affected by this legislation cannot be readily determined. For each additional year of service credit granted pursuant to this legislation, there will be additional costs averaging 25% of the member's compensation.

Summary of relevant resources:

Membership data as of March 31, 2025 was used to measure the impact of the bill, the same data used in the Actuarial Valuations dated April 1, 2025. Distributions and other statistics can be found in the 2025 Report of the Actuary and the 2025 Annual Comprehensive Financial Report. The actuarial assumptions and methods used are described in the 2025 Annual Report to the Comptroller on Actuarial Assumptions, and the Codes, Rules and Regulations of the State of New York: Audit and Control. The fair value of assets and GASB disclosures can be found in the 2025 Financial Statements and Supplementary Information.

Assumptions, demographics, and other considerations may have been modified to better reflect specific provisions of any proposed benefit change(s).
