AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to licensing of independent adjusters

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Paragraph 1 of subsection (f) of section 2108 of the insurance law is amended to read as follows:

(1) The superintendent shall, in order to determine the trustworthiness and competency to act as an independent adjuster of each individual applicant for such license, and of each proposed sub-licensee, except in the case of a renewal license, require every such individual to take and pass, to the satisfaction of the superintendent, a personal written examination. The superintendent may prescribe the types of written examinations according to the kind or kinds of insurance claims ~~which~~ that the applicant is to be licensed to investigate and adjust. The exam requirement shall be deemed met for individuals holding a claims certification issued by a national or state-based claims association with a certification program that consists of at least forty hours of pre-exam coursework, a proctored exam of sufficient length to adequately determine the competency of the individual, and twenty-four hours of continuing education required for certification renewals on a biennial basis, subject to the approval of the superintendent.

§ 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
