AN ACT to amend the public service law, in relation to electric vehicle charging station fee transparency

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 66-x to read as follows:

§ 66-x. Electric vehicle charging station fee transparency. 1. "Electric vehicle charging station" shall have the same meaning as in subdivision one of section three hundred thirty-nine-11 of the real property law.

2. The department is hereby authorized and directed to, no later than June first, two thousand twenty-seven, promulgate rules and regulations for any electric vehicle charging station for which payment is required:

(a) establishing fee transparency standards for electric vehicle charging stations, provided such standards shall:

(i) require electric vehicle charging stations to clearly post and update the total price for the use of the electric vehicle charging station at the point of sale;

(ii) prohibit electric vehicle charging stations from requiring users to pay a subscription fee in order to use such station; provided, however, that owners and operators of public electric vehicle charging stations may have separate price schedules conditional on a subscription or membership; and

(iii) prohibit requiring payment via mobile device as the only accepted form of payment; and

1 (b) defining "significant upgrade", which shall be the basis for  
2 determining what changes to electric vehicle charging stations  
3 constructed prior to January first, two thousand twenty-eight, including  
4 but not limited to, increasing the capacity of the electric vehicle  
5 charging station or substantially updating the electric vehicle charging  
6 station's user interface or payment system, would trigger compliance  
7 with the provisions of this section; and

8 (c) defining "subscription fee" as a recurring payment made to a  
9 service or product over a set period, such as a month or a year.

10 3. Standards established pursuant to subdivision two of this section  
11 shall apply to publicly available electric vehicle charging stations  
12 that have received a rebate, grant, tax benefit or other direct funding  
13 from the state, or that have received funds through a commission  
14 approved charge on ratepayers, including funds for the purpose of  
15 preparing necessary electrical infrastructure for any such electric  
16 vehicle charging station.

17 § 2. This act shall take effect immediately and any regulations  
18 adopted pursuant to this act shall apply to electric vehicle charging  
19 stations constructed, or significant upgrades made thereto, after Janu-  
20 ary 1, 2028.
