AN ACT to amend the economic development law, in relation to technical assistance provided to municipalities related to college and university closures; and to repeal section 153 of the executive law, in relation thereto

The People of the State of New York, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Section 153 of the executive law, as added by a chapter of the laws of 2025 amending the executive law relating to providing technical assistance to any municipality that has had a college or university close within such municipality, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 1525 and A. 2007, is REPEALED.

§ 2. The economic development law is amended by adding a new section 12 to read as follows:

§ 12. Technical assistance to municipalities related to college and university closures. The department shall provide to any municipality, upon request, technical assistance in the event of a college or university closing in such municipality, on topics including but not limited to:

1. workforce transition and development;
2. attracting new employers and economic opportunities;
3. developing plans for the land and buildings formerly occupied by such college or university; and
4. recommendations and planning assistance for dealing with creditors and other entities having a financial interest in such college or university's assets located in such municipality, provided, however, that the state shall not become a party to any legal proceedings pursuant to this section.

§ 3. This act shall take effect on the same date and in the same manner as a chapter of the laws of 2025 amending the executive law relating to providing technical assistance to any municipality that has had a college or university close within such municipality, as proposed in legislative bills numbers S. 1525 and A. 2007, takes effect.
