And I would like to, at least within their ranks, recognize, as we like to do, the speaker from the Plateau State House of Assembly, Speaker Simon Lalong, as well as all of the other members of their delegation.

SENATOR SALAND: They are accompanied by Patrick McCorry, of the International Programs component of NCSL.

And tomorrow our colleagues in the Assembly will also be going through a number of processes and issues with them as we in the Senate have today.

Thank you, Madam President.

THE PRESIDENT: Senator Paterson.

SENATOR PATERSON: Madam President, I wanted to thank Senator Saland for extending to me the opportunity to meet with this great delegation from the different

states of Nigeria.

This is a country that meant a lot to me when I was 9 years old. I wrote a report about Nigeria in the fourth grade when, at the time, the president's name was Abubakar Balewa.

And from that time, this country's great contribution to the economic development and cultural history of the African continent is certainly regaled and was best represented by their presence here today.

And again, along with Senator Saland, we welcome them and hope they enjoy their visit until they leave on Thursday.

And who knows, maybe in the upcoming World Cup tournament we'll be rooting for the Super Eagles.

Thank you.
