15	a lot of respect and admiration for, and that
16	is former Senator Rick Dollinger, who is going
17	to be appointed to the Court of Claims.
18	ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank
19	you, Senator Sampson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Yeah, I just 16 17 want to congratulate former Senator Dollinger, 18 and also former Justice Dollinger, but now Court of Claims Judge Dollinger as well. 19 20 He's a very good man. I got a 21 chance to work with him, and I think he's the 22 right man for the job at the right time. 23 God bless you and God bless your 24 family as well.

I think that his 13 experience as a justice and his experience in 14 15 the Senate will serve him well. And unlike what Liz says, that he's 16 limited in what he can talk, when you're the 17 18 judge, you're in charge of the whole room, because he can talk whenever he wants. So for 19 20 those of us that served with him, I can't think of anything he'll enjoy more. 21 22 (Laughter.) 23 SENATOR STACHOWSKI: So I'd like 24 to congratulate not only Rick and his family,

I also rise to 10 second the nomination of Frank Gulotta to the Supreme Court Fourth Judicial District. 11 12 Now, if you take a look at his resume, it is extensive. His legal background 13 14 is second to none. We'll ignore your past 15 leadership in certain Republican clubs; that's okay by me. 16 But I think what's really important 17 18 for me when it comes to getting 19 recommendations and seeking advice on 20 approving judicial nominations is to reach out 21 to those who serve or work with the nominee. I welcome your brother Tom, who 11 12 served with distinction in Nassau County as the county executive, who I worked with for a 13 14 couple of years in Nassau County. It's great to see you, Tom, joining us and joining your 15 brother as well. 16 But congratulations, Justice 17 18 Gulotta, on your nomination and hopefully confirmation. 19 20 Thank you very much, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank 21 22 you, Senator Johnson. 23 Senator Fuschillo, on the 24 nomination.

Senator Volker, on the nomination. 11 12 SENATOR VOLKER: Mr. Collins, although he resides in the Bronx, is being 13 appointed in the Eighth Judicial District, 14 15 which is Western New York. He did not appear at the Judiciary 16 hearing. For the information of those here, I 17 18 am the senior person on the Judiciary Committee, although the Senator here is the 19 20 former chairman. 21 But I want to say this. Ι 22 understand what happened here, but I would 23 ask, if this ever happens again, that we be 24 notified that a person who is not part of the

judicial district be appointed.

There is no candidate at this point in the Eighth Judicial District. So what is happening here, actually -- and I read his bio, and he is a very competent judge. I do not deny that he is a very competent judge.

And Senator DeFrancisco agreed with that.

But I will have to vote against him, because there was no notification that the reason for this -- and I understand why it is -- is that this gentleman is going to become 70 years old. And what will happen is at that time he will be able to be a senior judge. And if he is not appointed now, he would not be able to be a senior judge.

But I would say please, in the future, at the very least we be given the courtesy -- and by the way, this has happened before. I want to tell you, this has happened before under Republicans. And so I just want to make that clear. But we should be notified that somebody who is going to be representing our district, even though they don't live in it, is being named.

And as a result of that, I'm going to have to vote no, although I admit that this person, as I read his biography, appears to be extremely competent. I vote no.

ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank you, Senator Volker.

Senator DeFrancisco.

SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes, I'm not quite certain why an individual who is getting a benefit like this -- namely, getting the opportunity to serve beyond the mandatory retirement age, and being appointed to a district nowhere near his home -- would not be required or would not want to appear at a Judiciary Committee hearing or the confirmation.

He has the most to gain in this particular situation. There are many competent, qualified people that would love to have this position.

So I don't think this is good precedent at all -- not necessarily that he's from a different area of the state, but not to have the person appear. And if the person

couldn't appear on this day, there certainly could be other days, so that he can answer questions if there were any.

So I think it's bad precedent and we shouldn't have this process. I'm going to vote no as well.

The other thing that concerns me is there were two people that were skipped, Mark Cohen and Lawrence Marks. If I'm not mistaken, they were on the lists that were to be confirmed on June 8th, but something else happened that day so that they had to sit here and not be confirmed.

So there's been over a month for anybody in this Senate to air their grievances or their concerns or to look up anything that might be of interest about that candidate.

Over a month, these people could have been vetted out.

Today they go through the Judiciary

Committee hearing, and they're all moved to

the Senate. Now, I have no clue what the

reason is for them not being confirmed when

they're here a second time. But whatever the

reason is, I personally, even though I have no 1 control whatsoever over this process, 2 3 apologize for both of them, because there was 4 an awful lot of time, plenty of time to check 5 out their backgrounds and give them the common courtesy of not having to appear on two 6 7 occasions and not have the courtesy of a vote. 8 So I vote no on this particular 9 nominee. Thank you. 10 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank 11 you, Senator DeFrancisco. 12 Senator Montgomery, on the nomination. 13 14 SENATOR MONTGOMERY: Yes, 15 Mr. President. I do not intend to vote no on this nominee, certainly, but I just want to 16 17 take this opportunity to agree with Senator 18 Volker. 3 SENATOR SMITH: Yes, thank you

4 very much, Mr. President.

Colleagues, six months ago the people of the State of New York basically elected a Senate majority of Democrats for the first time in 40 years.

Over the last 12 or 13 years there has been a number of colleagues in this chamber who have continually fought for reforms of the rules by which this body was governed. We have heard from organizations such as the Brennan Center for Justice, who has basically labeled New York State very broken, dysfunctional. We also had an organization called "Reform for New York," another report by the Brennan Center, that talked about unfinished business.

Today, this Resolution 2844 makes a very historical journey for us as colleagues in terms of how we will reform the business that's conducted in this house, how members are treated as rank-and-file members, how

committees will function, how this body will not only recognize rank-and-file members as members with the authority to function as Senators, but the people of the State of New York for the first time will be able to rely on and to get the necessary responses and adequate services from each one of their members.

This particular report, which was put together and drafted by a number of members, was basically channeled by a committee that was put together, a rules reform committee, back several months ago that Senator Bonacic and Senator Valesky, the presiding officer there, chaired. A number of members were involved with that committee. It was a breakthrough committee that put together a number of rules reforms that we are taking up in this particular resolution.

The Senate as people know it in the State of New York will never be the same again.

A number of our colleagues have been involved with these rules reform changes.

Senator Klein has been very much involved,
Senator Liz Krueger, Senator Schneiderman. Of
course we have Senator John Sampson, our
conference leader. There's been a number of
members who have continually advocated for
change -- Senator Squadron. And I would
daresay every single member in this chamber
has looked forward to this day.

Our reporters, news reporters, all of which from time to time continuously ask for reform, well, today, at 3:00 a.m. in the morning on Thursday, July 15, 2009, we have reached a milestone for the New York State Senate. This will be the day, this will be the time that it is recorded that promises were kept, that reform has happened in the State Senate of New York, and that no longer will organizations like the Brennan Center, nor other editorial boards, be able to polish the name of New York State Senate by the color of being dysfunctional. We will put that to rest today, this morning.

I want to thank our colleagues, in particular in the Democratic conference, who

fought for so many years to be able to have a voice that is heard.

I want to thank my colleagues on the other side of the aisle for being patient, yet and still understanding that all that they've heard over the last 12 to 15 years was something that they recognized over the last six months is the change that needs to happen.

This resolution is the birth of the 62 members of this body. And I think the child that is born as of today is one that is going to grow up, one that will become quite famous in their own right, one that will be able to make change not only on behalf of this the chamber but on behalf of the 19.5 million other people in the State of New York.

Mr. President, this is a great day for so many people in the State of New York.

It's a great day for our body. And I want to thank all of our colleagues for such great work, time, and effort; the staff as well.

Though the hour is early on this Thursday morning, this will be a day that will go down in history for the State of New York.

Thank you. 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank 3

Certainly I rise in support of this resolution. And it was a long time coming. And if I could give my own thoughts on it, the move towards these historic reforms, in my opinion, began on June 8th. It began on June 8th when a coalition was formed at that time that said no longer can the Senate operate the way it has, whether under Republican control or under the first six months of Democrat control here in the State Senate.

I think the 30 members here and two members, Senator Monserrate and Senator Espada, at that time said it was time for change, it was time to change the way the Senate has operated in really not respecting the rights of individual members to represent their constituents the way we all should be

able to represent our constituents.

The deeds of the past, whether it was under Republican or Democrat control, in my opinion and my hope is that they are the ways of the past. And that with these reforms, many of which were actually enacted on June 8th, these rules reforms, that we continue to not only observe them in the future but also try to even enhance and improve them.

So I'm delighted on behalf of my 30 Republican -- 29 and myself -- 30 Republican colleagues, that we're delighted that on June 8th, that was the motivating factor. And the weeks that followed that, when sometimes the public will not totally understand what occurred -- but look right now on the reforms that we're passing, the way members will be treated.

And even more important, with the proper resources going to individual members, our constituents will be treated fairly throughout the State of New York. It doesn't matter whether it's a Republican or a

Democrat, upstate or New York City, all the 1 2 members will now have the resources to be able to represent their constituents in an 3 4 appropriate way. 5 So, Mr. President, certainly I support this resolution. 6 7 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank 8 you, Senator Skelos. 9 Senator Bonacic, on the resolution. 10 SENATOR BONACIC: Thank you, Mr. President. 11 I rise first of all to thank all my 12 colleagues for supporting this resolution. 13 14 want to thank particularly Senator Winner, 15 Senator Griffo, their hard work, and the members of the reform committee. 16 But rather than name names, there 17 18 are many silent elected officials on both sides of the aisle that believe in changing 19 20 the culture of Albany and empowering members. And I want to thank Senator Skelos 21 for allowing this to go forward, and Senator 22 Malcolm Smith. 23 24 I'd just like to -- I know it's

late, I'm not going to speak long. But this is a blueprint. Reform does not happen because we adopted a resolution. It's going to be a work in progress. And it's going to have to depend on the goodwill of the men and women in this room to see how it's implemented next year, to make it a model for which we all can be proud of that will, in my mind, start to resurrect the reputation of this Senate that has been damaged badly.

So today is a historic day, but it's only a beginning. And I'm going to continue to look for bipartisan support of the good men and women we have in this chamber to get this thing done the right way. And it will put pressure on the other house. And I hope the good government groups and the press talk about this resolution that's been over 40 years waiting for.

So I thank you all for tonight.

Thank you, Mr. President.

ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank

you, Senator Bonacic.

Senator Robach, on the resolution.

SENATOR ROBACH: Yes, the hour is late. I too will appreciate the efforts of everyone that made this happen.

And this is substantial changes that certainly will be good, as my colleagues have said before. Certainly putting the term limit on leadership and committee chairs, very, very important, I feel, to ending what the public's talked about a lot, the superpower of small individuals. The concept of three men in a room, I think we all agree time to change that -- and we did.

The equal resource part is important. I may be one of the few people in here who has experienced that in my days in the Assembly when we all in the same party wanted to change leadership, felt we had agreement that didn't work out. That individual was able to fire staff, take away everything from chairmanships to paper clips -- no mail -- and even personal income from a member who didn't agree with them.

I think every one of us should never have to experience that, nor our

constituents who suffer from that when that superpower exists. We changed that today with a little bit more equal resources for every individual.

And lastly -- and I could talk about this for a long time, but the hour is late -- the procedural motions to get more things aired is a good one. People should get an airing of their issue. And there's nowhere where it's printed that because a bill comes out, it absolutely has to pass. Yet that's what we've always operated under. That will change today.

This is big. This is historic. I agree it really, really will change the culture here. And I hope it really will spread to the other house as well.

The public, now more than any time before, is watching. And I think they're starting to get a little bit of what the trouble is. Because every one of them will stay, "I like my person, and I think they try and stand up but they can't, it's those leaders or those guys in Albany." Hopefully

this really, really will change it. And as my 1 colleague says, John Bonacic, maybe even have 2 3 us work together to even make more changes 4 that will open it up, make it more transparent 5 and small "D" democratic. 6 So I'm very happy to support this 7 measure. 8 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank 9 you, Senator Robach. 10 Senator Adams, on the resolution. SENATOR ADAMS: 11 Thank you. Someone once said a bend in the 12 road is not the end of the road unless you 13 fail to make the turn. 14 15 June 8th was the bend in the road. We started on January 7th. That's when we got 16 on the right road moving towards reform. 17 18 And we cannot become revisionist and attempt to rewrite history. We need to 19 20 thank people like Liz Krueger, who for years talked about these reforms. And people 21 22 laughed at you and said it was impossible, but you did it. 23 24 Eric Schneiderman, who people

constantly criticized and stated that he was the enemy of the people, but now everyone is on board. Anyone can rewrite history, but reality states you were here long before that.

The person who led our call, Dave Valesky, and others -- and some great people on the other side of the aisle, say what you want: Lanza, Leibell, Bonacic. Countless number of people.

Even when we were going through our periods of pain in the last 30 days, the public needs to know we were still talking and communicating with each other, trying to find a solution to how to fix the Senate.

So everyone may want to join in now, but the reality is individuals like you, David, made sure that the beginning of the process that took place on January 7th when we saw Malcolm Smith become the Majority

Leader -- we may have hit a bend in the road, but it was not the end in the road, because we made the turn and now we're here to celebrate that together.

The success started when we decided

as a party to become members of the Senate and 1 2 the Majority Leader put us in the right 3 direction. And I thank you and others who 4 have been long servants of dealing with the 5 term reform, and we're finally there. 6 Thank you. 7 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank 8 you, Senator Adams. 9 Are there any other Senators who 10 wish to be heard? 11 Senator Liz Krueger. 12 SENATOR LIZ KRUEGER: Thank you 13 very much. Well, it's 3:00 in the morning --14 15 excuse me, 3:10 in the morning. And thank you, Senator Adams. When I joined the 16 New York State Senate in a special election in 17 18 February 2002, within the first five months I wrote a report about 34 recommended reforms 19 20 for New York State Senate to reinvigorate 21 democracy. And it is 3:10 in the morning in 22 23 mid-July in 2009. But yes, I think we all can 24 be proud of what we've done here tonight. And

Senator Bonacic said it took 40 years, but here we are on this road.

And now I think the challenge for all of us is to uphold the agreement that we've made tonight and the rules that we've put into place. Because I think now the public will be expecting us to do what is the right thing. We got this far; we all need to read those rules and figure out how we're going to incorporate them into a change in how we operate. I think it will affect every part of our lives as Senators.

And as I said to my colleagues
earlier tonight when we were discussing these
in conference, I think it will make things
harder, but I think we will all be better
Senators because of it. And we will be a
better Senate, and we will deliver better laws
for the people of New York State.

So I am very pleased to be here among you at 3:10 in the morning supporting these changes in our rules. Thank you very much.

ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank

you, Senator Krueger.Senator Schneiderman, on the

3 resolution.

SENATOR SCHNEIDERMAN: Thank you.

I appreciate the opportunity for us to be here, however late it is, and coming back to the way Senator Smith started us.

This is an extraordinary moment, and I would just like to say to all of my colleagues on both sides of the aisle, this has been a rough process to get here. We all know that.

I do feel that this is a process that reflects a long historical trend. And many of you know the houses of the Legislature in New York were a little -- there was a little less autocracy 30, 40, 50 years ago. This is not something that's a matter of any individual leader; this is not a matter of party. It happened in both houses. Committee chairs lost power to the central leadership and staff. We were on a bad trend.

In this house, our efforts at reform really began -- and we confirmed Rick

Dollinger as a judge. I remember when I first got up here, he was always trying to bring these motions to bring reform issues to the floor. And then Senator Krueger, as she noted, issued her report "Waking Up the State Senate," which was -- she was the chair of the Democratic Task Force on Legislative and Budgetary Reform in 2002. In 2004, I released a report called "Albany 101," which popularized this.

And then you all remember the report of the Brennan Center, which essentially blew the whole situation up. And let's all give credit to where credit is due; we were dealing with the consequences of that report for a long time.

So this was all stimulated -- and quite honestly, let's not kid ourselves, this became a great campaign theme for us in our efforts to take the majority. And I'm proud to say today, as we stand here, we have been able to remain true to the campaign promise.

And I would like to thank my colleagues on the other side of the aisle for

helping us to remain true to our campaign promise. So there is shared credit here.

But let us not for a moment give into the notion that we cannot change things, that this is a perpetually dysfunctional body. This is a monumental change. This is something that when the members of the other house get up tomorrow morning and read about it -- did anyone ever believe we were going to have something like this happen, and this quickly? This is an extraordinary accomplishment. I hope it will be reported that way.

And I share the views of all of my colleagues who have spoken that this is indeed a work in progress. We can do better, we have to move forward and use the new procedural tools we've got to bring more bills to the floor, to have more hearings, to be a more functional, energetic, transparent and small "d" democratic body -- although it hurts me to say small "d." We will be that. We can be that.

I look forward to working with all

of you, on both sides of the aisle. Thanks to everyone in this room for making this happen.

Thanks to our leaders for getting us started with the committee that Senator Valesky and Senator Bonacic chaired. Thanks to a couple of members for giving us a little extra kick maybe when we needed it.

And I'm very proud to stand here in support of this resolution. I'm very proud to be a member, with all of you, of the New York State Senate tonight.

ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank you, Senator Schneiderman.
