And in our desire to make us share 21 22 in this love, God calls us to aid, in gentle 23 kindness, all those that are weak, sick or 24 unfortunate. In God's love of us, we're

Yesterday, in the State of 1 Washington, Tacoma, outside of Fort Lewis, 2 Washington, four police officers -- three 3 4 male, one female -- sitting at a table to 5 discuss the priorities of the day were shot and killed in view of the public. б 7 I think that a moment of silence is 8 in order to show respect for the number of law enforcement officers who are being killed. 9 10 But specifically, at this time of 11 the year and how they were murdered is 12 certainly something that we as a nation should be ashamed of. And we should do everything to 13 strengthen the law enforcement efforts so that 14 15 these things do not continue. Thank you, Mr. President. 16 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 17 Δt 18 Senator Larkin's suggestion, would all present please rise to observe a moment of silence for 19 20 the law enforcement officers who were recently murdered and all law enforcement officers who 21 22 put their lives on the line each and every day for each and every one of us. 23 24 (Whereupon, the assemblage rose and
