

PROCEEDINGS 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: The 3 Senate will please come to order. 4 I ask all to rise and repeat with 5 me the Pledge of Allegiance. (Whereupon, the assemblage recited б 7 the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.) 8 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: The 9 invocation will be given by the Reverend Peter 10 G. Young, of Mother Theresa Community in Albany, New York. 11 12 Father Young. 13 REVEREND YOUNG: Let us pray. 14 We're reminded in February of the 15 cupid shooting arrows of love. May we be motivated to prioritize our love to one 16 another and to all of our constituents on this 17 18 Groundhog Day. 19 Doing the people's business with 20 love is what God has commanded. The bill of 21 God's love is on our calendar; now it is asking for your vote of approval. God is 22 23 asking for your acceptance for the motion 24 direct to the Third Reading Calendar for

immediate passage. 1 2 Amen. 3 (Laughter.) 4 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: Thank 5 you, Father Young. 6 The reading of the Journal. 7 The Secretary will read. 8 THE SECRETARY: In Senate, 9 Monday, February 1, the Senate met pursuant to 10 adjournment. The Journal of Friday, January 29, was read and approved. On motion, 11 Senate adjourned. 12 13 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: Without objection, the Journal stands approved 14 15 as read. 16 Presentation of petitions. 17 Messages from the Assembly. 18 Messages from the Governor. 19 Reports of standing committees. 20 Senator Klein. 21 SENATOR KLEIN: Mr. President, I believe there's a report of the Finance 22 Committee at the desk. 23 24 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: The

Secretary will read. 1 2 THE SECRETARY: Senator Kruger, 3 from the Committee on Finance, reports the following nominations. 4 5 As a member of the Board of Trustees of the State University of New York, б 7 Eunice A. Lewin, of Buffalo. 8 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: 9 Senator Kruger. 10 SENATOR CARL KRUGER: Please move the nomination. 11 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: 12 Are 13 there any Senators wishing to be heard on the nomination? 14 15 Senator Stachowski. SENATOR STACHOWSKI: 16 Yes, Mr. President, I stand to second the 17 18 nomination of Eunice Lewin. I think she's going to be a great addition to the Board of 19 20 Trustees of the State University. She is very involved in our 21 community. There's practically no charity 22 23 event you can go to that she's not there. 24 She's very, very committed to the University

of Buffalo. She also sees the value of having 1 2 Buff State in the City of Buffalo. So I think with her love of higher 3 4 education, and particularly those institutions 5 that are right near us, that will give her a great sense of purpose as being a new member б 7 of the SUNY Board of Trustees. 8 And I might add that while she was waiting, I kept telling her do we think they 9 10 sent her nomination to the Orient and it finally got back here and that's why we're 11 12 confirming her today. So it's my pleasure to second her 13 nomination. 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: Thank you, Senator Stachowski. 16 Senator Maziarz. 17 18 SENATOR MAZIARZ: I'll defer to Senator Volker, Mr. President. 19 20 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: Senator Maziarz will defer to Senator Volker. 21 SENATOR VOLKER: 22 Mr. President, I 23 just want to say that this nominee is a 24 long-time friend of mine. Her family, they

are distinguished citizens of the community in 1 2 the Buffalo area, fine contributors to the cultural well-being of our city and our 3 4 county. 5 And there's no question in my mind that Eunice will become a wonderful addition б 7 to the SUNY Board of Trustees. And I 8 certainly congratulate her. 9 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: Thank 10 you, Senator Volker. Senator Maziarz. 11 12 SENATOR MAZIARZ: Thank you very much, Mr. President. 13 I too rise with my colleagues from 14 15 Western New York to second this excellent nomination by Governor Paterson. I said in 16 the Higher Ed Committee that it's great to see 17 18 somebody, somebody from Western New York get appointed to something. 19 20 And this is a great nomination. Ιt will be a great appointment. Eunice has 21 22 done -- as Senator Volker pointed out, and 23 Senator Stachowski -- a great deal, has been 24 very active in the community.

I've worked with Eunice as a member 1 2 of the Niagara Frontier Transportation 3 Authority. And even though she lives in 4 Buffalo and in Erie County, when it came to 5 Niagara County, she was always at the forefront of helping us in Niagara County б 7 establish a new transportation center for our 8 buses. And our new airport in Niagara Falls I 9 can say would not have happened without the 10 help and support of Eunice Lewin on the 11 Niagara Frontier Transportation Authority. 12 This is an excellent appointment by the Governor, and she's going to do a great 13 job for the citizens of all of New York State. 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: Thank you, Senator Maziarz. 16 17 Senator Thompson. 18 SENATOR THOMPSON: Good afternoon. Mr. President, I want to just 19 20 thank you for the opportunity to say a few brief remarks on behalf of this new appointee. 21 22 I am very humbled by the fact that the Governor has supported this candidacy, her 23 candidacy. Ms. Lewin has given a lot in 24

public service and community service. 1 I was 2 proud to support, when asked, her candidacy to 3 the Governor. And I know that she's going to 4 do a great job for Western New York and all of 5 New York State. We wish you well, and let's make б 7 sure that we take care of all of SUNY, 8 especially those in Western New York as well. 9 Thank you. We wish you well. And I'm proud 10 that she does live in my district, right by the park that I run in all the time. And 11 12 hopefully I run enough that you'll see me out there running from some of those dogs in the 13 14 park sometime. 15 Thank you. I wish you well. God bless you. 16 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: 17 Thank 18 you, Senator Thompson. 19 Are there any other Senators 20 wishing to be heard? 21 The question is then on the 22 nomination. All those in favor please signify 23 by saying aye. 24 (Response of "Aye.")

21	SENATOR STAVISKY: Yes. Thank
22	you, Mr. President.
23	We have three outstanding nominees
24	before the Senate today, and each brings a

different dimension to service in the higher 1 2 education system. Eunice Lewin has been confirmed as 3 4 a SUNY trustee. She has two master's degrees 5 from SUNY Buffalo, and she has spent 30 years working for the Buffalo Board of Education. б 7 Sheryl WuDunn brings a different 8 perspective. She's a journalist, a foreign 9 correspondent, the coauthor of three books, 10 the most recent one, Half the Sky, which talks 11 about women in developing nations. She is a 12 former foreign correspondent for the New York Times, and in fact has won the Pulitzer Prize, 13 the Polk, and the Overseas Press Club Awards. 14 15 And she brings a background in business as well as reporting to Cornell's Board of 16 17 Trustees. 18 And David Ourlicht, for the SUNY Construction Fund, is an investment banker. 19 20 He's senior vice president of Amalgamated Bank. As I told him earlier, Amalgamated 21 22 Bank, the labor bank, many people, particularly, in New York City used 23 Amalgamated Bank to purchase their cars and 24

their homes. It's an outstanding institution. 1 2 And I know that he will bring a financial 3 background as well to the Construction Fund. 4 So I'm delighted with these 5 nominations. I congratulate each individual. They all came before the Higher Education 6 7 Committee this morning. And I think that 8 their service is going to be an exciting 9 experience not for them but for the people of 10 our state. Thank you, Mr. President. 11 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: 12 The 13 question is on the nomination of David E. Ourlicht, of New York City, as trustee of the 14 15 State University Construction Fund. the chamber by his wife, Marybeth, and sons 1 2 David and Bart. 3 Congratulations. 4 (Applause.) 5 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: The Secretary will read. 6 7 THE SECRETARY: As a member of 8 the Board of Trustees of the State University 9 of New York, Philip A. Berry, of New York 10 City. As a member of the Board of 11 Trustees of the State University of New York 12 13 College of Environmental Science and Forestry, Matthew J. Marko, of Syracuse. 14 15 As members of the Board of Visitors of the New York State Home for Veterans and 16 Their Dependents at Montrose, Charlotte 17 18 Craven, of Poughkeepsie; Daniel Griffin, of 19 White Plains; and William T. Mahan, of 20 New City. 21 As a member of the Board of Visitors of the New York State Home for 22 23 Veterans and Their Dependents at Oxford, John 24 DePersis, of Johnson City.

And as a member of the Board of 1 2 Visitors of the New York State Home for Veterans and Their Dependents at St. Albans, 3 4 Marjorie Smith, of South Ozone Park. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: б Senator Kruger. 7 SENATOR CARL KRUGER: Please move 8 those nominations. 9 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: Are 10 there any Senators wishing to be heard? Senator Golden. 11 12 SENATOR GOLDEN: Thank you, 13 Mr. President. I rise for all of these trustees 14 15 that have been named today and all of the members of the New York State Home for 16 Veterans and Their Dependents at Montrose, 17 18 those for the New York State Home for Veterans and Their Dependents at Oxford, and of course 19 20 the New York State Home for Veterans and Their 21 Dependents at St. Albans. But most of all, for the trustees 22 23 here that have been named to our colleges --24 Philip Berry for his reappointment and David

Ourlicht for his new appointment as a trustee 1 to the State University Construction Fund. 2 3 In our audience today we have young 4 men up here from Xaverian High School who will 5 be graduating shortly and going on to many of these schools that we have mentioned here б 7 today. And it is our job to make sure that we 8 trust and put good trustees into these schools 9 so that these young men, these young leaders 10 of the future, get the education that they so 11 justly deserve. So I commend all of our 12 appointments today, those particularly to the 13 14 City of New York and those from the University 15 of Buffalo, Cornell University, and the State College of Environmental Science and Forestry. 16 Congratulations to them, to their families. 17 18 And thank you, Xaverian, for being here and witnessing this good day. 19 20 Thank you. ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: 21 The 22 question is on the nominations. All those in favor please signify by saying aye. 23 (Response of "Aye.") 24

ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: 1 2 Senator Foley, to explain his vote. 3 SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you, 4 Mr. President. 5 This particular initiative will enable Lake Ronkonkoma, which is the largest б 7 freshwater lake on Long Island, to be part of 8 the inland waterways, which will enable that particular area to access crucial dollars in 9 10 order to revitalize that particular lakefront. 11 There's a great and long history to 12 this particular lake. It dates back, 13 obviously, to precolonial days and has been 14 one of the major geographic points on Long 15 Island, dating back to the time when three different Indian tribes took claim to 16 different portions of the shoreline. 17 18 In recent years this area has been somewhat in need of revitalization, and by 19 20 this designation it will make this particular waterway eligible for crucial funds that will 21 enable this lake to return to its former 22 grandeur. 23 So this is very important. 24 It has

received bipartisan support from the county 1 2 legislature, and I would hope that we do the 3 same here in the State Legislature. 4 Thank you. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT BRESLIN: Thank б you, Senator Foley. 7 Announce the results. 8 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 61.
