her resolution. 1 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 2 The 3 Secretary will read. 4 THE SECRETARY: By Senator 5 Stewart-Cousins, Legislative Resolution Number 3331, mourning the death of Yonkers 6 7 Fire Department Firefighter Patrick Joyce, Jr. 8 "WHEREAS, A great state is only as 9 great as those individuals and their 10 organizations who perform exemplary service on behalf of their community, and it is the 11 12 custom of this Legislative Body to pay tribute to that outstanding service; and 13 14 "WHEREAS, Patrick Joyce, Jr., was 15 born in the Riverdale neighborhood of the Bronx, New York, to a family that loved him 16 17 dearly, and in that tradition he built a life 18 and family in Eastchester, New York, with his loving wife, Tara, and their daughters, 19 20 Isabella and Charlotte; and "WHEREAS, A veteran firefighter of 21 22 16 years, Patrick Joyce, Jr., exhibited a tremendous passion for his work and a love for 23 24 the community he served. He is remembered by 25 all for his kindness, professionalism, and

humor. And in addition to his duties as a

Yonkers firefighter, assigned to Rescue 1, he

was also an entrepreneur, the proprietor of

the Dunwoody Golf Course, and a visionary who

believed in a promising future for the City of

Yonkers and its waterfront; and

"WHEREAS, City of Yonkers firefighter Patrick Joyce, Jr., heroically gave his life in the line of duty while fighting a fire on October 2, 2009; and

"WHEREAS, A loving and devoted husband, father, son, brother, friend and fellow firefighter, Patrick Joyce, Jr., is survived by his parents, Patrick and Kathleen; his wife, Tara; his daughters, Isabella and Charlotte; his brother Martin and twin brother Peter, sisters Deborah, Julianne, and Katie, and many loving family members and dear friends; and

"WHEREAS, Throughout his life,
Firefighter Patrick Joyce, Jr., touched so
many through his kindness and commitment to
public service. And in this time of such
loss, the entire community joins together to
memorialize his remarkable life and the

immense impact he had on everyone with whom he came in contact; and

"WHEREAS, This Legislative Body
pauses to pay tribute to the immense sacrifice
that City of Yonkers Firefighter Patrick
Joyce, Jr., has made, and to honor this
sacrifice and offer comfort and prayers to his
family and many friends; and

"WHEREAS, The countless lives that have been influenced by this remarkable man will ensure his lasting legacy, and his sacrifice will not be forgotten. Firefighter Patrick Joyce, Jr., will prefer be honored and his memory will always be cherished; now, therefore, be it

"RESOLVED, That this Legislative
Body pause in its deliberations to mourn the
death of Yonkers Fire Department Firefighter
Patrick Joyce, Jr., whose memory will remain
in the hearts of all those who had the honor
of serving with him; and be it further

"RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution, suitably engrossed, be transmitted to the family of Firefighter Patrick Joyce,
Jr., and the Yonkers Fire Department."

SENATOR STEWART-COUSINS: Thank

4 you, Mr. President.

I look up and look at the family, and we heard the very, very tragic story of how Patrick Joyce, in the line of duty, sacrificed his life for others.

And the resolution makes us all very, very sad because we understand what a tremendous loss such as this one means -- not only to the family, but to the entire community. We know that when we send people out to protect us, there's always that possibility that they may not return. But most of us never really think of it until a day like this, like the one we experienced on October 2, 2009.

When this 39-year-old firefighter plunged to his death when he tried to rescue people he thought were in a house, the whole community stopped and the whole community embraced the family that you see up above us.

And while we mourned, the only thing we heard were the stories of "the Irish

Prince," Patrick Joyce. And as much as we were sorrowful when we heard how every moment of his life -- not only on the job, but every moment of his life -- was dedicated to the support of his beautiful wife, Tara, and the children, Isabella and Charlotte, and his mom and dad, who are with us, Patrick and Kathleen, and all of his brothers and sisters, sister-in-laws, nieces, everyone.

And then it extended even beyond that. He was an entrepreneur. He was a man who was making lives better on every level.

And any time anybody needed something fixed in the family, it was Patrick who would come to do that. There was never a moment that he wasn't giving.

And when that fateful day happened, there was no end to what the outpouring of an entire community gave back to that family.

And so from Riverdale, where he was born, all the way through Westchester County, thousands of people came to embrace the Joyces because of the legacy of Patrick.

And although we were not in session during that tragic period, in January this

body passed a resolution. But we didn't want to pass it without inviting you to be part of it -- and in a time where, yes, we can celebrate his life and give respect to the fact that there was a loss, but also let you know that the family extends far beyond the boundaries you could ever imagine. That the family is a New York State family, and that his legacy, represented by you, is something that we all cherish. And that what he did is representative of so many who every day go out and we all hope return safely but know they're there to do a job for us.

So as we give you this tribute and this resolution, it is also not just a mourning but a celebration of his life, and gratitude for all that you've given to us in your strength, your dignity, in your joy in spite of it all, and your willingness to be here to show us that we do go on, we do move on, and we celebrate even new life in the person of Leila, who's there with us who's only one week old.

Thank you so much. God bless you. Thank you.

24	worth mentioning that he's someone who touched
25	many, many lives, not only his job in the

Yonkers Fire Department, but his family and friends.

He grew up in the Riverdale section of the Bronx, he lived his life with his wonderful family in the Town of Eastchester, in Westchester County, which I represent.

And I wish there was something more that we can do in this legislative session. I wish there was a way we can do more for his family, his lovely wife, his mother and father, his children. But unfortunately, we can't. But what we can do is recognize his memory, recognize all he did for his community and his country.

And I know he's looking down at us today with a smile, not only because he's being recognized -- which I don't think he would care about that, because he got up every day and he did a job because he had to do that job -- but I think he would smile because his family is all here today. And I know it's a family he loved very, very much.

So thank you, Andrea

Stewart-Cousins, for recognizing a very brave

firefighter, Patrick Joyce.

SENATOR FOLEY: 6 Thank you, 7 Mr. President. 8 It's indeed an honor today to 9 sponsor this legislation that renames a 10 portion of the state highway system as "Corporal Paulo Marko Pacificador Memorial 11 Bridge." 12 Corporal Pacificador Memorial 13 14 Bridge is located on the William Floyd Parkway 15 passing over Route 127 in Shirley. It will be an homage to Corporal Pacificador, who served 16 17 our country with great courage and bravery. 18 On August 13, 2007, Corporal Pacificador was killed in hostilities in Iraq. 19 20 He was just 24 years of age. Posthumously, he was awarded the Bronze Star and the Purple 21 Heart for his valor and sacrifice to our 22 23 country. He is survived by his fine parents 24 25 Mr. and Mrs. Jose Pacificador, of Shirley.

While I was supervisor, I had the distinct honor to visit their home to speak with them about their loss.

Nothing, obviously, that we do today will bring Corporal Pacificador back in our lives, and no tribute will ever come close to repaying the great debt that our nation owes to Corporal Pacificador and all those who have paid the ultimate sacrifice to protect the United States. However, memorializing this bridge is one way that we can express our appreciation for his service and a promise that we'll never, never forget that the service of Corporal Pacificador will always be remembered by all of our constituents and residents of New York State.

We're grateful for his service. We thank him for his years of service to our country and to his family. And again, this memorial bridge is one way that we can say thank you to his family. And they'll have a small token of relief in the fact that we in New York State are highlighting his great sacrifice and that every time we cross that very busy bridge, it's to remember a very fine

Mr. President, 1 SENATOR KLEIN: 2 can we return to the order of motions and 3 I believe Senator Sampson has a resolutions. resolution at the desk. I ask that the title 4 5 of the resolution be read and move for its immediate adoption. 6 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 7 8 Senator Klein, has this resolution been deemed privileged and submitted by the office of the 9 10 Temporary President? Yes, it has, 11 SENATOR KLEIN: Mr. President. 12 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 13 The Secretary will read. 14 15 THE SECRETARY: By Senator Sampson, concurrent resolution establishing a 16 plan setting forth an itemized list of 17 18 grantees for a certain appropriation for the 2009-2010 state fiscal year for grants that 19 20 are incurred by local government agencies and/or not-for-profit providers or their 21 employees providing civil or criminal legal 22 23 services; for grants in aid for drug, violence and crime control and prevention programs; and 24 25 for grants that prevent domestic violence or

aid victims of domestic violence, as required by subdivision 5 of Section 24 of the State

Finance Law.

ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY:

Senator Bonacic, on the resolution.

SENATOR BONACIC: Thank you,

Mr. President.

I'm going to stand in opposition to this resolution for two reasons.

I believe in the fall of last year this resolution was addressed, and a majority of the members here supported the resolution, including myself. But things have changed from the fall of last year to now, in terms of our fiscal crisis, in terms of how we've got to prioritize state spending. And I do believe that there are more important things that we can spend this money on than those itemized in this resolution.

The second reason I stand and oppose this resolution is because, according to our new rules, which we adopted in January, we said that state resources were going to be distributed more fairly and equally to all of the members throughout the State of New York.

And I think when you look at this resolution, if we're going to spend the money, it's keyed only to a handful. And that is contrary to the spirit of the new rules that we adopted in January of 2010.

For those two reasons, I'm going to vote no. Thank you, Mr. President. And not only on this bill -- this is the Byrne money, and I understand the second resolution is on bullet aid. And for the same reasons, I'm going to vote no.

Thank you.

13 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank
14 you, Senator Bonacic.

Senator DeFrancisco, on the resolution.

SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. It's now March 3rd; it's been almost a month since the Governor has presented us with his budget. And to today there's been absolutely no activity towards trying to resolve that budget situation.

Even more concerning to me is that there is a legislative law that says 10 days after the budget is presented to us, there has

to be a determination, an announcement of conference committees to openly discuss the budget between the Assembly and the Senate and also the composition of those committees and a schedule for that activity, the open discussions of budget components by members, rank-and-file members.

You know, last year that was totally ignored. Despite the promise that we were going to have a new and improved reform system, it was ignored. A budget came out out of a private meeting between the three leaders from New York City, and we had a yea or nay vote on it.

This year I want to make it very clear that at least the people on this side of the aisle aren't going to tolerate that. And this is an opportunity to vote no on this particular part of a spending plan when we haven't even started the procedure for an open, honest debate about the various components of what the budget should be like.

So we're starting today -- and I'm sure you're going to hear this again -- we need the conference committee law abided by.

We're not looking for reform, we're not 1 2 looking for change. We're looking for abiding 3 by the law as it exists that many of us in this house on both sides of the aisle -- I 4 5 think everybody on both sides of the aisle that were there when it was passed -- voted 6 7 for. 8 So I'm going to vote no on this 9 because it's a spending plan that's a segment 10 of our spending. And we shouldn't be spending 11 anything until we start the conference 12 committee meetings and see where the money has to be cut and where we can restore various 13 14 things depending upon the revenues that are 15 available. So I'm going to vote no on this 16 resolution. Thank you. 17 18 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank you, Senator DeFrancisco. 19 20 The question is on the concurrent resolution. The Secretary will call the roll. 21 22 (The Secretary called the roll.) 23 SENATOR MARCELLINO: 24 Mr. President, to explain my vote. 25 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY:

1 Senator Marcellino, to explain his vote.

SENATOR MARCELLINO: Yes,

Mr. President, I will be supporting these resolutions.

But I would also like to add my voice to what Senator DeFrancisco said relative to the process of the conferences.

Today is the 10th [sic]; by law, revenues should have been established, we should have a number to deal with so that we know what we're talking about relative to the budget.

Conference committees should be set up. I'm looking forward to them, willing to participate. And I'm hoping that the process will be different this year than it was last year so that we can have a truly bipartisan budget and one that we can all get behind and yote for.

I don't see the process occurring.

I think it's a mistake if we go forward and do the same mistake and make the same mistake we made last year. This is a time we could do something different. We should be focused on this budget. We're not, apparently; other things are getting in the way.

I urge that we get down to business 1 2 and the business of the people, and that is 3 doing a budget on time. 4 Thank you, Mr. President. Again, 5 aye on the resolution. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 6 7 Senator Marcellino to be recorded in the 8 affirmative. 9 Senator Krueger, to explain her 10 vote. SENATOR LIZ KRUEGER: 11 Thank you. I rise to support this bill. 12 I don't disagree with my colleagues 13 14 who are raising concerns about process and 15 budget. I have any number of recommendations I'm hoping that this house will support for 16 change in the process of the budget. 17 18 But the fact is we have debt 19

obligations, that we need to make sure the state is on time with completing its obligations to make sure that government continues, that we continue to show to the state, to the voters, and to the people who we have borrowed money from in the past that we are fully capable, prepared, and on time in

ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 11 Senator DeFrancisco, on the resolution. 12 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: 13 Yes, I'm 14 going to vote no for the same reasons that I 15 stated in the last resolution. But there's one other thing I'd 16 17 like to add in response to what Senator 18 Krueger mentioned, that she has many, many different ideas on how to reform the system. 19 20 You know, we've been using that term "reform" so very loosely, and it's almost 21 a cure-all, the end-all and the cure-all for 22 everything. The fact of the matter is the 23 24 budget system process was reformed. A bill 25 was passed requiring open committees to be

announced and scheduled 10 days after the 1 Governor provided us his Executive Budget. 2 We haven't done that. And we can't 3 4 complain that it's the Governor fault because 5 he's got all kinds of trouble and we've been distracted in some way. It's the 6 7 Legislature's responsibility to do this. 8 So we can ask for all the reform we want, but we reformed the system, it wasn't 9 10 followed, the law was violated last year. 11 Before we spend any more money, we've got to 12 get the process going the way it should be 13 going so a budget can be done in an open and 14 fair manner. 15 I'm going to vote no on this. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank 16 you, Senator DeFrancisco. 17 18 The question is on the concurrent resolution. The Secretary will call the roll. 19 20 (The Secretary called the roll.)
