Before we came out on the floor today, I had a conversation with Senator Maziarz from Niagara Falls, who's to my immediate left, and I apologized to him because he has one championship team come every 15 years and we keep coming back from Central New York with championship teams after championship teams.

But this is a first, even for the great people and athletes of Central

New York -- namely, having four championship teams out of one school, out of one Senate district. And they're all here in the gallery.

And let me just start very briefly saying a few brief words on each one.

The football team had an 11 and 1 record in their championship season as

Section III champions, and an 11 and 1 record in an extremely competitive, the most competitive league of all leagues, the toughest league. And they did an incredible job, an 11 and 1 record.

Coach Carl Sanfilippo I know is quite a taskmaster. His reputation precedes him. But in order to follow the directions of a good coach, you need good solid kids, good people that know the importance of working together.

And working together is something that you will find will help you all during life. If we could only work together in this chamber as well as you work together on the football field, we'd have a much better legislative body.

That team also had seven All-League First Team players, which is truly, truly remarkable. And we congratulate you.

In addition to the football team, we have a resolution for the boys volleyball team -- a 19 and 1 record, five All-League First Team members, a team that obviously ran over its opposition to its title.

Same thing -- all of you, in each of the teams, so I don't repeat myself, I played baseball in high school -- oh, by the way, they beat my team, my CBA team, twice this year. Despite that, we're honoring them today.

But while I played baseball at CBA and then in college at Syracuse University, I'll tell you one thing. Look to your left and your right. You will be friends with these people your entire life. You'll think back about these championship days and how great it was to be part of what you've been a part of.

So you're extremely fortunate. Me, at my age, a very old age -- but still very much in shape --

(Laughter.) 1 2 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: -- I still am best friends with every single person that 3 4 we played ball with over the many years. And 5 here this team had five All-League players. Now, I hope I don't get out of 6 7 order here, but we also have the championship 8 from the girls volleyball team. They had five All-League players. That was the 19 and 1 9 10 team -- I may have misspoke before -- the girl's volleyball team. 11 12 The boys volleyball team, also they had an 18 and 1 record, three All-League 13 14 players. Same things goes to them, how 15 wonderful they've done. And then the soccer team, what was 16 your record? Pardon me? 17 18 GALLERY MEMBER: Fourteen, five, and zero. 19 20 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Okay, you didn't remember? But you won the sectional 21 22 title. You might want to study a little more so you do a little bit better in quizzes in 23 open public. 24 25 (Laughter.)

SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: 1 But the 2 message is very clear. We have a special 3 school with special coaches and special young 4 people that are going to be the leaders of 5 tomorrow. 6 We congratulate you. We wish you 7 the best of luck in all your future endeavors. 8 And we hope you enjoy your day here in Albany being honored by the New York State Senate. 9 10 Thank you very much.          an Olympic Gold Medalist winner in the 1932

         Olympics. Born and raised in Lake Placid, the

         '32 Olympics took place in Lake Placid, and

         Jack Shea won the first Gold Medal for speed
```

skating in that event.

In January of 2002, Jack Shea, at the age of 91, at 4 o'clock in the afternoon was driving his car just through the village and was anticipating his grandson competing in the 2002 Winter Olympics in the skeleton.

Jack Shea's life was cut short. He was hit when a driver came across, hit him head-on.

The driver was intoxicated or believed to be intoxicated. The police ordered blood work. The blood work showed above a .08 content. But because there was no physician supervising at that clinic -- which is the Adirondack Medical Center -- in their clinic at that particular time, the results of that test were thrown out and there was never any prosecution in the case.

Jack Shea's grandson went on and won the Gold Medal and had a card, his grandfather's Olympic card, attached inside his helmet. It was a very emotional time. It was a very sad time to think that Jack Shea didn't -- needlessly, didn't live through this exciting time in the life of the Shea family.

So thank you for passing this bill.

I look forward to seeing it passed in the 1 2 Assembly and being signed into law. 3 Thank you. 4 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 5 Senator Little to be recorded in the affirmative. 6 7 Senator Fuschillo. 8 SENATOR FUSCHILLO: Mr. President, quickly, I just want to thank my 9 10 colleagues for their support and Senator Little for her comments. 11 What this bill does is it removes 12 an unnecessary restriction that is allowing 13 drunk drivers, even those that kill innocent 14 15 victims, to escape prosecution. We've heard the case here, and it's happening throughout 16 the state. 17 18 We have to continue our fight to rid our streets of drunk drivers. This is 19 20 just another step in the battle.
