selfless devotion of those who would commit their energies and purpose to the ministry of others; and

"WHEREAS, It is the sense of this
Legislative Body to bring full recognition and
just tribute to those individuals who
distinguish themselves and the ministry
through their unremitting commitment and
preeminence of service; and

"WHEREAS, This Legislative Body is justly proud to commend The Reverend Dr. W. Franklyn Richardson upon the occasion of his 35th Anniversary, to be celebrated on Tuesday, April 13, 2010; and

"WHEREAS, Reverend Dr. W. Franklyn Richardson is the senior pastor of the historic Grace Baptist Church in Mt. Vernon, New York. He has been the leader of this vibrant, diverse, multistaffed ministry since April 1975. Under his esteemed leadership, the congregation has grown to more than 4,000 members, and in 2003, the ministry was expanded to Port St. Lucie, Florida; and --

Proceed. 1 2 THE SECRETARY: -- "and WHEREAS, 3 Prior to coming to New York, Reverend 4 Richardson was pastor of Rising Mt. Zion 5 Baptist Church, located in Richmond, Virginia, and St. James Baptist Church in Varina, 6 7 Virginia, concurrently from 1969 until 1975; 8 and "WHEREAS, A graduate of Virginia 9 10 Union University, Reverend Dr. W. Franklyn 11 Richardson received his divinity degree from 12 Yale University Divinity School and his doctorate of ministry as a Wyatt T. Walker 13 14 Fellow from the United Theological Seminary in 15 Dayton, Ohio; and "WHEREAS, Reverend Dr. W. Franklyn 16 Richardson has received many honors for his 17 18 extraordinary leadership in ministry, including the Doctor of Divinity from his 19 20 alma mater, Virginia Union University, and several other colleges and universities. 21 1989, he was inducted into the Martin Luther 22 23 King, Jr., Board of Preachers at Morehouse College in Atlanta, Georgia; and 24 25 "WHEREAS, A community builder and

organizer for decades, Reverend Dr. W. 1 Franklyn Richardson has played a pivotal role 2 in the grassroots efforts of reestablishing a 3 4 cultural bridge between community and 5 education. He has been involved in the brick-and-mortar realities of housing 6 7 development and is singularly responsible for 8 leveling the ground by fighting for equitable opportunities in public education in the 9 10 Mt. Vernon community. His insightful guidance 11 is responsible for two Grace Church-related 12 community development corporations; and "WHEREAS, Reverend Dr. W. Franklyn 13 14 Richardson served as General Secretary for 15 12 years of the 8-million-member National Baptist Convention USA, Inc. This experience 16 led him to the international arena of the 17 18 World Council of Churches, where he served on its prestigious Central Committee. 19 The World 20 Council represents more than 400 million Christians in 150 nations; and 21 "WHEREAS, In addition, Reverend Dr. 22 W. Franklyn Richardson served on the boards of 23 24 the Congress of the National Black Churches, 25 the National Urban League, and the

Constituency for Africa. A life member of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, he is also a member of the Sigma Pi Phi fraternity; and

"WHEREAS, This distinguished theologian is an internationally sought-after preacher, lecturer and facilitator, having preached on several continents. For the past 30 years, Reverend Dr. W. Franklyn Richardson has been heard throughout the tristate area on WVOX Radio is viewed on national television every Sunday morning; and

"WHEREAS, Furthermore, Reverend Dr.
W. Franklyn Richardson is the author of the
widely acclaimed Power of the Pew and has
written several extensive articles on
faith-based community developments. Of note:
"Mission to Mandate" in the National Urban
League's State of Black America. A published
preacher as well, his sermons can be found in
publications including Keep the Faith, by
Welcome Rain Publishers, and Joy to the World,
by Simon & Schuster; and

"WHEREAS, A man of intuitive reason and an incisive mind, Reverend Dr. W. Franklyn

Richardson demonstrates in his persona the marvelous union of passion and intellect. He is a national advocate for economic equity, and his counsel and advice is widely solicited in several major corporate boardrooms throughout America; and

"WHEREAS, Currently, Reverend Dr.

W. Franklyn Richardson serves on the boards of
the Institute of Church Administration and
Management at the Interdenominational
Theological Center in Atlanta, Georgia; Pepsi
Cola Ethnic Advisory Board; the Ujamaa
Community Development Corporation; the Harvard
University Divinity School Summer Leadership
Institute for Church-Based Community and
Economic Development; and the Black Equity
Alliance of New York. He is also the chairman
of the board of the National Action Network
and a trustee of Virginia Union University;
and

"WHEREAS, With him throughout have been his wife, Inez Nunnally Richardson, their two children, and their four grandchildren, all of whom feel privileged to be a part of his life and rejoice in his achievements; and

"WHEREAS, Reverend Dr. W. Franklyn Richardson has brought to his ministry an overwhelming spirit of charity and compassion, acting from vision and enlightenment in conducting his administrative and spiritual duties, while always displaying the highest standards of personal and professional integrity and dedication; and

"WHEREAS, This distinguished man of God has always given enlightenment, guidance and wisdom to the many entrusted to his care and has administered abundantly and unstintingly to the spiritual and corporal needs of all; and

"WHEREAS, It is the sense of this
Legislative Body that when a person of such
noble aims and accomplishments is brought to
our attention, it is appropriate to publicly
and jubilantly proclaim and commend that
individual for the edification of others; now,
therefore, be it resolved

SENATOR HASSELL-THOMPSON: Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

At the time that I asked to speak on the resolution, I wasn't sure that it was going to be read in its entirety. So there's very little that I need to add, except to say that the leadership of Dr. Franklyn Richardson goes way beyond the walls of his churches, as this resolution dictates.

But it also does not include the work that he has done to break the silence around HIV and AIDS. And he has been one of the forward ministers of the National Baptist Convention who has made the world AIDS problem

one of the top issues for the National Baptist Convention, because people were not prepared to put the proper face on who has AIDS in this country.

And so that I want to just commend Dr. Richardson for his committed and focused dedication to the people not only of the community of Mt. Vernon, but to the State of New York and to this country, for the work that he has done and the leadership that he has provided, both spiritual, ecumenically, and certainly as a builder and developer who recognizes the need for poor and not-so-poor people to have more than adequate housing in which to live.

So I thank you, Mr. President, and I certainly would like to invite all members who are present who wish to sign onto this resolution, and I will be more than happy to carry this forth at the celebration of the anniversary.

Vernon, 11 the county. He has a national focus. 12 But he is someone who thinks 13 14 globally and always acts locally. 15 it's human rights or civil rights or whether it's just being there to offer the quiet 16 spiritual counseling from someone who is more 17 18 than willing to be available to whatever shoulder is needed at any point in time, 19 20 Reverend Richardson is there. So I do want to say 35 years, I 21 22 would never have thought he'd serve this long -- but he is becoming more and more 23 influential, powerful, and respected. 24 25 So thank you very much.

ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: 1 2 Thank you very much, Senator Stewart-Cousins. 3 Senator Oppenheimer. 4 SENATOR OPPENHEIMER: Well, we 5 seem to be the fan club of Reverend Richardson. 6 7 A lot has been said about him, and 8 I was going to comment on his passion for social justice and how he has been a leader 9 10 nationwide in that arena. 11 But on a more personal note, I 12 would say that I have been in his church when he has delivered some of the most 13 14 astonishingly beautiful sermons, that you 15 would think he was a great literary scholar. Which he probably is. But the beauty of his 16 17 sermons and the way they are structured, with 18 a beginning, a middle, and an end which relates back to the beginning, they are really 19 20 wonderful examples of literary achievement. So not only does he have a 21 beautiful soul, and working hard to bring 22 social justice, but he also is an 23 extraordinary mind who has a gift for writing 24 25 and preaching. And we thank him for that, and

ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: 6 7 The Secretary will read. 8 THE SECRETARY: By Senator Duane, 9 Legislative Resolution Number 4542, endorsing 10 the application to bring a space shuttle to the State of New York for permanent display 11 12 for the benefit of the public. 13 "WHEREAS, The NASA space shuttle program has been in operation since 1981; and 14 15 "WHEREAS, The space shuttle program represents the most successful continued space 16 17 program in the history of space exploration; 18 and 19 "WHEREAS, The successes of the 20 space shuttle program have benefited our 21 nation and its interests and our entire world 22 in advancing scientific discovery; and 23 "WHEREAS, The National Aeronautics and Space Administration has announced that 24 25 the fleet of space shuttle orbiters will be

permanently retired within the next one to two years; and

"WHEREAS, Institutions around the United States who are interested in permanently displaying a space shuttle to the public have been invited to submit applications to NASA; and

"WHEREAS, The Intrepid Sea, Air and Space Museum in New York has submitted such an application in pursuit of bringing a space shuttle to this great Empire State, and permanently displaying it for the benefit of the general public; and

"WHEREAS, The State of New York is an ideal location to display a shuttle for the benefit of the general public, due to the significant size of the local population, the tens of millions of tourists who visit every year, and the high concentration of educational and cultural institutions that would benefit from the exposition of a shuttle in New York, as well as numerous other reasons; now, therefore, be it

"RESOLVED, That this Legislative Body pause in its deliberations to hereby

endorse the application to bring a space 1 shuttle to the State of New York for permanent 2 3 display, and to encourage all New Yorkers to 4 support this effort; and be it further 5 "RESOLVED, That copies of this 6 resolution, suitably engrossed, be transmitted 7 to the Intrepid Sea, Air and Space Museum in 8 New York and the National Aeronautics and Space Administration." 9 10 ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: Senator Duane. 11 12 SENATOR DUANE: Thank you, Mr. President. 13 14 As we know, the space shuttle 15 program has only three missions left, and then the program is going to be disbanded and the 16 shuttles will be mothballed. And in July, 17 18 NASA is expected to decide, as a result of a nationwide competition, a permanent home for 19 20 the shuttles the Endeavor, the Atlantis, and 21 Discovery. Now, the Intrepid, which is moored 22 on the West Side of Manhattan now permanently, 23 24 played a key role during NASA's early years. 25 It was the primary recovery vessel for

astronauts and space capsules when they 1 2 splashed into the water after the Mercury and 3 Gemini space missions. And the Intrepid is a 4 very important tourist economic engine for the 5 state. It brings in over a million visitors 6 per year. 7 And I would be very pleased and 8 proud if my colleagues would join me in urging 9 NASA to bring home one of the three of the 10 shuttles and give it a permanent home in our state at Pier 86 on Manhattan's West Side. 11 12 And so, Mr. President, I urge everyone to vote in favor. But if I may even 13 14 anticipate a favorable response, I also would 15 welcome everyone to sign onto the resolution, and I would like it to be open to everyone. 16 Thank you, Mr. President. 17 18 ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: Thank you, Senator Duane. 19 20 Are there any other Senators that wish to speak on the resolution? 21 22 The question is on the resolution. 23 All those in favor please signify by saying 24 aye. 25 (Response of "Aye.")

SENATOR ADAMS: Thank you,

2 Mr. President.

This is an important month. This is Autism Awareness Month. And autism is one of the many illnesses that impacts children.

And it just draws attention to the whole issue around children with special needs.

And I just want to make sure that we never forget that behind a child with special needs is a special parent, and that parent must ensure that that child has a countless number of hours of attention. And one of the highest levels of love and affection comes from a parent that shows the attention to a child with special needs.

Autism impacts over 17,000 students in New York City between the ages of 4 and 21. Boys are four times more likely to be impacted by autism, and one in every 58 boys will be diagnosed with autism. So we must ensure that we do all that we can to provide the needed services, provide the needed care.

I've always believed that the three areas of our society that we should give the greatest level of focus and attention during

these budgetary moments is our seniors, our children, and our children with special needs.

And so I believe that by this being Autism Awareness Month, it gives us the opportunity to understand the importance of allocating the necessary resources, services and, more important, the necessary patience for those who are afflicted with autism.

Thank you, Mr. President.

ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON:

SENATOR McDONALD: Thank you,
Mr. President.

I would like to thank everybody for

this resolution. More importantly, I'd like to thank each and every member of the Senate and the Assembly -- each party, each house -- for their commitment to this issue. I have yet to speak to anybody who wasn't genuinely committed to it. And as it was spoken earlier, we're here for people more than

anything else, and this is all about people.

Now, this is a special issue for me. That issue is I have two grandsons, brothers, that are both autistic. It changes your life. It changes your outlook on life. It's very, very important.

And as much as I like the resolution, I know that this year, next year, and unfortunately for years in the future we'll be dealing with this issue. Which means that we're going to have to talk about some very serious things — supporting families, especially single-parent families, economic assistance, educational assistance, all kinds of therapy. And, when these folks grow up to be 21, supporting adult facilities, homes, jobs, whatever is needed.

The numbers are getting staggering. It's frightening. But I think this body, along with our colleagues in the Assembly and our Governor, I think all of us working as a team, we can do this. We can make our folks who have this problem in New York State, we can make their lives a little bit better, a little easier. And I think we can lead this whole country on this issue.

This will be an issue that we will be dealing with, no matter who we are in this chamber, for a long time. And quite frankly, I think everybody here is up to the task, and I'm proud to be part of that team.

Chinese-Canadian wife, who also is a professor of psychology, the two of them are working on autism. And I frankly think that they're doing some great work at SUNY Buffalo.

But the biggest thing is that autism has become a cause that it was not before, because people just didn't realize the importance and the amount of it that there

was. 1 2 So I want to thank everybody involved here, Eric and Roy, for the work that 3 4 you're doing. I have a feeling that we're 5 going to find out that this issue is only going to get bigger as the years went on. 6 And 7 what we're doing in this Legislature will 8 become very, very historic, I believe. 9 ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: 10 The question is on the resolution.
