This act shall take effect on the first of November 16 next succeeding. 17 18 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Call the roll. 19 20 (The Secretary called the roll.) 21 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 22 Senator Klein, to explain his vote. 23 SENATOR KLEIN: Thank you, Mr. President. 24 25 One of the problems that still

exists in our communities throughout the State 1 2 of New York is high insurance rates. And 3 sometimes those rates are exacerbated by the forgery of certificates of insurance and other 4 5 insurance documents. This legislation would enhance the penalty to a felony for anyone б 7 engaged in the forgery of insurance ID cards. 8 So I think this is going to go a 9 long way towards making sure that our rates 10 are reasonable and also that individuals aren't driving in New York without valid 11 12 insurance. 13 I vote yes, of course, 14 Mr. President. 15 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Senator Klein to be recorded in the 16 affirmative. 17 18 Announce the results. THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 58. 19 Nays, 20 1. Senator Duane recorded in the negative. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: The 22 bill is passed. 23 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 587, by Senator Valesky, Senate Print 7542A, 24 25 an act --

SENATOR KLEIN: Lay the bill 1 2 aside for the day, please. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 3 The bill is laid aside for the day. 4 5 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 596, by Senator Foley, Senate Print 4987A, an 6 7 act to amend the Volunteer Firefighters 8 Benefit Law. 9 SENATOR KLEIN: Lay the bill 10 aside for the day, please. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: The 11 12 bill is laid aside for the day. Senator Klein, that completes the 13 14 reading of the noncontroversial calendar. 15 SENATOR KLEIN: Mr. President, at this time can we please go to a reading of the 16 controversial calendar. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 18 The Secretary will ring the bells. 19 20 Senators are asked to proceed to the chamber for a reading of the controversial 21 calendar. 22 23 The Secretary will place Calendar Number 418 before the house. The Secretary 24 25 will read.

THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 1 2 418, by Senator Duane, Senate Print 5000B, an act to amend the Public Health Law and the 3 4 Insurance Law. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: б Senator Hannon. 7 SENATOR HANNON: On the bill, 8 Mr. President. 9 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 10 Senator Hannon, on the bill. 11 SENATOR HANNON: Mr. President, 12 this is a proposal which would purport to limit commercial health insurance plans from 13 14 creating tiers, extra tiers for prescription 15 drug formularies. And it would do so with language that says you can't create tiers that 16 have higher cost-sharing or deductibles or 17 18 co-insurance than now exist. And while I frankly agree with that 19 20 goal, one of the readings of this, in my mind, 21 is that an insurance company not required to cover any specific drug -- because we don't 22 have a formulary that's universal in this 23 state -- might instead of be limited in what 24 25 type of cost-sharing it imposes upon a holder

of the plan by simply dropping the drug 1 altogether, thereby frustrating what we would 2 3 hope to do, which is better the lot of the 4 consumer. 5 And so while I'll support the goal of this, I am troubled by the way it's б 7 presented. And thank you for your chance to 8 explain my vote. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 9 Thank 10 you, Senator Hannon. Senator Liz Krueger, on the bill. 11 12 SENATOR LIZ KRUEGER: Thank you. Briefly on the bill, Mr. President. 13 14 I just wanted to say, in supporting 15 and cosponsoring the bill, I have heard from so many New Yorkers who suffer from long-term, 16 chronic, tragic, tragic diseases about their 17 18 inability to pay for drugs, their fear that if their insurance companies are able to 19 20 skyrocket the rates, are able to put limits on their ability to get these drugs, that they 21 will literally be left home-bound, unable to 22 continue their lives, even at risk of death --23 again, at risk of death -- because of 24 25 inability to pay for the drugs they need.

The United States government 1 2 recently moved forward with an attempt to 3 ensure a national healthcare system and access 4 for everyone to healthcare and health 5 insurance. It doesn't kick in completely for several years, and even then I don't think б 7 anyone in this room thinks it's the end-all, 8 be-all, magic pill solution to the problems of access to healthcare in our country. 9 10 But this bill that we're going to 11 pass today, I hope with everyone's support, is 12 at least an attempt to ensure that people with chronic and severe illness -- where, thank 13 14 you, the pharmaceutical industry has been able 15 to come up with solutions -- that no one who needs these drugs will be prevented from 16 having access to these drugs because of lack 17 18 of affordable. And again, why do you have health 19 20 insurance? So that it's there for you when 21 you need it, when you are the person who ends 22 up sick, when you are the person who ends up needing the medical care, when you need those 23 prescription drugs that are completely 24 25 unaffordable to you as an individual.

We have to make this the law of 1 2 New York State. So thank you, Senator Duane, 3 for sponsoring it. And of course I'll be 4 voting yes. 5 Thank you, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 6 Thank 7 you, Senator Krueger. 8 Are there any other Senators who 9 wish to be heard? 10 Seeing none, the debate is closed. The Secretary will ring the bells. 11 Senators are asked to proceed to the chamber 12 so that we may take up the roll call as 13 14 expeditiously as possible. 15 The Secretary will read the last section. 16 THE SECRETARY: Section 8. 17 This 18 act shall take effect on the 30th day after it shall have become law. 19 20 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Call the roll. 21 (The Secretary called the roll.) 22 23 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 24 Senator Seward, to explain his vote. 25 SENATOR SEWARD: Yes, thank you,

Mr. President, very briefly. 1 I must reluctantly vote in the 2 3 negative on this bill because, as I look at 4 it, I view it as a legislative solution 5 looking for a problem which just currently does not exist in New York State because of б 7 the fact that our State Insurance Department, 8 by regulation -- Regulation 62 specifically 9 prohibits coverage limitations which are based 10 on a type of condition or treatment, and does avoid here in New York some of the abuses and 11 12 problems that admittedly have occurred in other states. 13 14 So we are already protecting some 15 of the individuals that this legislation seeks to protection through the regulation of the 16 17 Insurance Department. 18 We have no higher tiers in New York. There is no Tier 4. The department 19 20 has not approved any additional tiers, which speaks to the good regulation that we have in 21 New York. 22 23 So I reluctantly vote no. 24 Obviously, this regulation would prohibit, 25 going forward, some innovative solutions to

dealing with the problem of the high cost of 1 2 prescription drugs in New York State for those 3 that need them. And particularly in light of the federal healthcare and health insurance 4 5 reforms that we've seen, when we will very much need some of those innovative solutions б 7 going forward. 8 So I reluctantly vote in the 9 negative. 10 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Senator Seward to be recorded in the negative. 11 Announce the results. 12 THE SECRETARY: In relation to 13 Calendar Number 418, Senator Seward voting in 14 15 the negative.
