One, I think this is a very important piece of

legislation. It's about women's health. It's about women who, when they get pregnant, one of the most important things is ensuring that their child, as it grows in utero, has the prenatal vitamins necessary to ensure that child's health when the child is born.

The idea of this legislation
actually came to me from my wife's own OB-GYN
after the birth of our third child, who
remarked that there's a wide range of costs
when it comes to prenatal vitamins, especially
for prenatal vitamins that are dedicated to
women who are at high risk for a high-risk
birth.

But the real fact remains is that in this day and age when you can get a prescription that will help you get somebody pregnant, I think you should have the ability to have insurance coverage to make sure that you take the medicine necessary to let that baby grow and let that baby become healthy.

I urge my colleagues in this Senate body to vote yes, vote yes to allow women to have insurance access for prenatal vitamins.

It is 11 to provide an essential tool so that we can 12 solve violent gun crimes by ensuring that the ballistics analysis of our guns -- which is 13 done already in this state, Mr. President --14 15 has the advantage of having all semiautomatic pistols sold in this state in the future --16 we've got a few years to implement it --17 18 microstamp-ready. They will have identification numbers. 19 20 Guns already have serial numbers. This will just guarantee that for 21 semiautomatic handguns, the favored guns of 22 gangs, the cartridges, the shell casings will 23 be stamped with a number. 24

As has been testified to and

written about by many law enforcement officers and district attorneys, police chiefs, sheriffs in our state and elsewhere, this is something that is on the level of fingerprinting, DNA, vehicle identification numbers. This is a great technological tool to advance the cause of public safety. cannot keep our streets safe if we can't catch qun criminals. 

And I would urge all of my colleagues to support this bill. This is not a gun control bill, this is a crime control bill. By definition, any shell casings that are ejected at the scene of a shooting that the police are investigating, that's a violent criminal -- that came from a violent criminal.

So I would ask the support of all of my colleagues on both sides of the aisle for this important public safety legislation and urge everyone to vote yes.

Thank you, Mr. President. 12 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 13 14 Senator Squadron to be recorded in the 15 affirmative. Senator Craig Johnson, to explain 16 his vote. 17 18 SENATOR CRAIG JOHNSON: Thank you very much, Mr. President. I also rise to vote 19 20 in the affirmative on this bill. I want to commend Senator 21 22 Schneiderman. I also want to thank publicly 23 Assemblywoman Schimel, Michelle Schimel, who represents my area, my home district in the 24 25 7th Senatorial District, for her leadership.

This has been a very important piece of 1 legislation for Assemblywoman Schimel, someone 2 who has advocated tirelessly all across 3 4 New York State on this particular bill. 5 As Senator Squadron talked about, 6 Senator Schneiderman, this is a crime-fighting 7 tool, plain and simple. This will help our 8 law enforcement officers hunt down those who commit violent crimes with guns. I believe 9 10 that in the 21st century our police officers, our detectives, our law enforcement officials 11 12 deserve 21st-century technology, and that's 13 what we're providing here today. 14 I vote yes, Mr. President. Thank 15 you. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 16 17 Senator Craig Johnson to be recorded in the 18 affirmative. Senator Adams, to explain his vote. 19 20 SENATOR ADAMS: Thank you, Mr. President. 21 22 I don't think anything is more challenging or difficult when you go to a 23 family's house and you tell them that their 24 25 child or their family member was the victim of

gun violence. To compound that is when police 1 2 respond to the scene and they see the ballistic evidence lying on the ground and 3 4 there's no indicator or no way to compare the 5 bullets. To vote against this bill after all 6 of our law enforcement communities have 7 8 clearly indicated the importance of this -this sends a very strong message. I vote aye 9 10 for this bill, not only for those crimes and bullets and firearms that are on the street, 11 12 but the countless number of people we can bring, guilty people to justice. 13 14 This is an important bill, and 15 politics should not get in the way of public safety. I vote aye on this bill, and I 16 commend the sponsor of the bill. 17 18 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Senator Adams to be recorded in the 19 20 affirmative. Senator Liz Krueger, to explain her 21 22 vote. 23 SENATOR LIZ KRUEGER: Thank you, Mr. President. I also rise to support this 24 25 bill.

And to be honest, I don't understand anyone voting no. It's simply using 21st-century technology to ensure that we can track where a gun has been used and where bullets have been shot through a gun.

Obviously, if the gun is being used for legal purposes with legal outcomes, there's no issue. But obviously, if a crime has been committed, being able to track the gun that was used in the crime is a critical issue. We talk all the time about modern forensic science making it more possible for law enforcement to find the guilty parties and bring them to justice. And this seems such an elegant and efficient way to ensure that law enforcement has more tools in order to find guilty parties and bring them to justice in the case of gun violence.

I'm really fairly shocked that there are people who are going to vote no on this bill, because it is so commonsense and so important for us to move forward with.

So of course I'll be voting yes.

Thank you very much, Mr. President.

ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY:

SENATOR MONTGOMERY: Yes, thank you, Mr. President.

I rise to thank Senator

Schneiderman for introducing this legislation.

It's extremely important. I represent a

district where there are any number of young

people who are killed by guns. And one of the

most difficult aspects of trying to address

this issue is that we have this "no snitching"

problem in my district.

And so police in my district -- I met with a group of police officers in one of the precincts in my district this past week, and they certainly look for this as one of the opportunities that they would have to address the difficult problem of tracing where the guns come from that are involved in these crimes.

We had a vigil for a 16-year-old young person who was killed by gunfire, and it goes on and on with these problems, with these

1 issues.

And I know that police, sheriffs, and law enforcement officers across the state are advertising on the radio, asking their constituents to call us to ask us to please pass this legislation.

So I rise on behalf of all of those young people who have been killed, in my district especially, that we would like to see this bill pass this house today.

Thank you, Mr. President. I vote aye.

## ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY:

fight crime, it's a tool to show our support
for law enforcement, it's a tool that takes
into consideration modern technology.

And it's a relief on its way to

many of us who have had to suffer in our communities gun violence in such a regular and horrible way.

So this is I think a great tribute to us in terms of trying to fight crime to us in terms of allying ourselves with the law enforcement community that has so thoroughly endorsed this piece of legislation.

So I vote aye and want to thank again Senator Schneiderman and his counterpart in the Assembly as well.

ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY:

Senator Perkins to be recorded in the affirmative.

SENATOR DIAZ: Thank you,

Mr. President.

I just would like to unite with my colleagues and congratulate Senator Sampson for allowing this bill to come to the floor.

Just a few weeks ago, we had a march in the Bronx with the Bronx borough president, Ruben Diaz, Jr., and a lady by the name of Gloria Cruz, who is the leader of Moms Against Gun Violence.

And we have too many gun deaths in the Bronx. Too many. Bodegueros, taxi drivers, senior citizens, and now youth have been killed. And this is something that I don't know, I don't know how anybody could vote against it, because this is not -- this is something -- a tool to find who committed the crime. That's as simple it is, something that will help us find out who is a criminal.

We're not judging the good people of the State of New York. We're not trying to go after the good, decent citizens. This is something that will help the police and the authorities to identify the gun and the bullet, as simple as that. And that will help us in the Bronx, it will help us in the City of New York, it will help us throughout the state.

And I'm proud to vote yes on this one. And thank you, Senator Paterson {sic},

for allowing us this opportunity to bring this
to the floor.

ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY:

Senator Diaz to be recorded in the affirmative.

Senator Smith, to explain his vote.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you very

much, Mr. President.

It has been at least several months now, and I believe many people have heard not only the shot but have heard the call of many young people who have been killed by an unfortunate gun incident.

The Senate majority has taken a position that gun violence, gang violence is an issue that we are looking to deal with, namely in the spirit of a program called Operation SNUG, which is against gun violence, gang violence. And this particular bill by Senator Schneiderman -- who I applaud for bringing it forward -- on microstamping is another part of that program.

I think there is some clarity that needs to be given to this. One, this is not an anti-gun or challenge to the Second

Amendment of any shape or form. It is
strictly giving our law enforcement
individuals the technological tool so that one
can trace and determine, when there was a
particular gunshot or someone was murdered,
unfortunately, we can trace it.

Secondly, Mayor Bloomberg was here
today. He expressed the support of many

Secondly, Mayor Bloomberg was here today. He expressed the support of many mayors around this state. Mayor Miner was here, from Syracuse. The mayor from Utica was here. A number of mayors, over a hundred mayors support microstamping. There are over a thousand murders in the state and City of New York that have not been cleared up.

So this is a commonsense bill. The fact that some people are purporting it to be against those who are hunters is in error.

So, Mr. President, I will be voting yes and I do hope the practical consciences of my colleagues will allow them to vote yes as well.

I recognize that gun owners feel very threatened. They may feel that if they pass one bill, that it's a slippery slope and a lot of other legislation will follow. But this doesn't apply to gun owners. And it's just something that will help us find out more information about who the manufacturer is, perhaps who the robber or the person doing the crime is. I can't understand why anyone wouldn't want to have that kind of information.

I understand the significance of gun ownership and of hunting and have always kept property that I own open to all hunters.

It's an important, important contribution that

And yet in the bill there's no 22 identifiable standards by which the 23 superintendent may judge if this has occurred. I think that needs to be tightened up 24 25 considerably.

Insurers may legitimately drop an entire class of policies, mainly due to cost, and they drag down the entire financial situation for the entire plan, and that jeopardizes the coverage and payment of claims for other policyholders.

So this bill needs a great deal of work, particularly in light of the federal healthcare law that has been passed a few months ago. We need to identify how this type of bill would fit into the federal law.

There's much more work to be done, and therefore I am voting no.
