SENATOR ADAMS: 13 Anything for my 14 good friend Senator Volker. 15 This is an important interstate compact. And on first view it may seem as 16 17 though we're trying to actually regulate or 18 try to damage racing in this state when in fact it's to the contrary, it's to the 19 20 opposite. This compact will authorize 21 22 New York State to participate in an interstate 23 compact for horse racing to provide uniform rules and regulations for the entire industry 24 25 with those participating states.

Participation in the contract will not impact the wagering, it will not impact in any way the takeouts. It will allow New York State to cooperate with other participating states. It is almost equivalent to what we do now with boxing.

Right now all of the states that participate in racing, it's an ad hoc manner in which we do it. We're going to professionalize the sport of racing. We're going to make sure that our horses in New York State are not running against horses that are drugged up on some different types of drugs to impact our horse race.

We're really moving the industry to another level. We're moving the industry away from similar to how boxing used to be, where you had have athletes that are fighting in different states in different manners. We're going to raise the code of conduct and raise the code of racing.

Right now, as you see, drugs have proliferated in the industry. Many of our horses are dying prematurely on the tracks.

Many of our horses are running against other

horses that are drugged up. We want to change that. We want one code or standard, similar to how we do boxing, similar to how we do the NFL, similar to how we do the Major League Baseball.

By creating this compact, it's not going to impact us in any way on the takeout, it's not going to impact us in any way on the amount of revenue someone will win if they win a ticket. But it will move us to the level that we will professionalize our industry. And this is what I want to do as the chair of the committee; I want to continue to see what we can do to make our industry professional and ensure that New York continues to be the great racing capital that it is.

SENATOR VOLKER: Mr. President, if I might, I'm just -- I'm not going to ask you questions, I'll just comment on the bill.

ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON:

Senator Volker, on the bill.

SENATOR VOLKER: I know I don't look like Senator Larkin, but I'm kind of speaking for Senator Larkin now, who had some problems with this bill also.

about that bill is, as I understand what this would do, if New York came in -- and by the way, no other states yet have joined in the compact, if I'm not mistaken. Then what would happen is we are told that some of the other smaller states would join thinking they could get increased revenue from New York, which everybody thinks has a lot of money, and New York could end up financing this racing

interstate compact group.

I think the thing that's very disconcerting here is that the idea is good, but the idea that New York would subject itself to a compact and the fact that we as a legislature, for instance, and the government would have little or no control over it, and yet the other states could demand considerable amounts of money -- I realize that it may well improve the racing standards, and we can always use more oversight of the racing industry and that a lot of the horsemen groups are looking at this and thinking this is a good way that they can make more money.

One of the reasons they're thinking

that is because they're looking at the money that we have in New York, like everybody else, as having tons of money. Of course, if they read the papers lately they'd know --

ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON:

Can we have some order in the chamber, please.

I'm sorry, Senator Volker. I want to give you the opportunity to speak.

SENATOR VOLKER: Sure. Thank you.

I think the problem is this would set up a whole new bureaucracy and there would be a good deal of expense, a lot of expense involved. And this contract group would be able to do contracts, they would be able to set up all sorts of oversight. And what may very well happen is that New York, being the largest state most likely to join this compact, they would then ask us to contribute by far the largest amount of money.

And even if we assume that the handle in New York would increase, the question is where is the money going to come from. Right now, you know, we haven't passed a budget yet, so quite obviously we have a

problem. We didn't pass this in 2009, as I understand, for that very reason, that there was great concern in both the Assembly and the Senate about the fiscal implications of this bill -- not to the racing industry directly, but to the State of New York.

And some people have suggested that it might even be better for us to wait till we see who else gets into the compact to decide whether we really want to get into it or not.

I think the concept is excellent, but the problem I think is, like anything else, New York has had a tendency to get into things and then find out later it's going to cost us a ton of money. I don't have to tell you about Medicaid, I don't have to tell you about so many of the other programs.

Some people have said that they compare this compact obviously not directly to Medicaid, but the biggest problem is we don't know what it's going to cost in the long haul. But we do know one thing, that there's going to be a substantial cost here. Because just reading the bill, you can see that they have enormous powers and they will not only take

1	powers away from the racing industry here in
2	New York but they will also be able to say to
3	us, Well, we're going to help you, but you've
4	got to pay for it.
5	And I think that is by far the
6	biggest problem, is the uncertainty of what

So this actually creates an economic incentive for utilities to actually do repairs and keep up their capital investment on the front end, instead of having to go through cases which doesn't exist now.

So what we have had in the Adirondacks is someone who purchases a home, wants to make an addition to that home, has the APA come in to give a permit for the addition — and while there, the APA may see that 30 years ago the deck that was built was larger than the APA statute allows or that the property was a half a foot or a foot closer to the water than the regulations.

And this may have been built 30, 35 years ago, and yet the APA can enforce that violation with a series of fines and make the person either remove the deck or change the wall or do something to correct it.

What this piece of legislation does is make it a statute of limitations on a violation. The violation has to be discovered within ten years of when it began, and

1	reasonable discovery, and then they cannot
2	enforce anything past that. So it actually

But because they are so underfunded and paid a year after their costs, they find that they must go to the banks in order to borrow money. The interest on RANs -- rate anticipation notes -- the interest is never paid by the state, it is only paid by the Special Act districts. It is these very same districts that are so strapped that now have to borrow from banks and pay the interest on the borrowing. It is really an outrage.

And so what this bill does -- and this is only because we haven't yet changed the methodology -- it says that we will have a

It's been discussed very intensely 16 within the public health community for three 17 18 years. It's supported by the City of New York, I presume still supported by the Health 19 20 Department of the state. And I come to it with mixed 21 emotions, because it's one of those bills 22 23 which has things that I think are essential in terms of lowering the barrier, in terms of in 24 25 some cases doing away with the very formal

consent now required, and, importantly, allowing for testing in cases where there has been a needle stick and a suspicion by a healthcare personnel provider, such as a nurse or a physician, that perhaps they may have been subjected to infection.

But I rise to put on the record my real hesitation as to how far we've gone with the testing. When we started discussing this test and lowering the barriers, people started to talk as if every time a patient goes to see a primary care provider that a consent is written out. And therefore, the initial proposal was we'll modify that consent that's written out.

Turns out most people thought they were writing out a consent but they're not.

They're talking about giving authorization to bill the insurance provider.

So the question became, how do you make the consent more universal, how do you make the test more universal? My recommendation had been do it in settings where there is, by statistics, a high incidence of people with HIV-positive results,

and that will address the majority part of the problem.

Instead, after a considerable amount of time, there has been what is in this bill, a requirement that an HIV test be offered by all primary care physicians in all healthcare settings. That means we're not just talking about an emergency room, we're not just talking about an ambulatory care clinic, we're not talking about a regular clinic, we're talking about every visit in every doctor's office in this state when it's primary care, and that also includes gynecologists.

I just don't think the reach is appropriate. And I would think perhaps a chapter amendment would be the best way possible in dealing with this in terms of limiting the scope and not going to the doctor's office or in terms of, as a compromise, having a short-term effective span for this requirement.

Because I just think that we are going to be surprising, maybe shocking people throughout this state when they go for their

primary care and the doctor has to say to them, "Hey, want an HIV test?" And they're going to go, "Well, how do you get that?" And then they're going to be pretty surprised.

The counter has been, well, it's very widespread, we're missing a lot of people. My point would be this is overreaching. The place where we're missing it tends to be in areas where there's been statistically a high level of HIV-positive results, and I think we should focus on that.

The other part is a little more philosophical about this testing. We're trying to go in and say to a doctor, This is what you must do in terms of how you practice medicine.

I talked to a physician who called me yesterday, one of the best primary care physicians I've come across. She's been serving in the community for years. And she said, "What did it does it mean to offer?"

And so I explained what the bill provides.

She said, "Well, wait a minute.

Anytime I think it's appropriate, I talk the patient into getting an HIV test, and that's

It seems like it's been much longer 16 than that. 17 18 But the language enacted by this house and I assume by the Assembly, the same 19 20 language, was in fact language that told the public that the Governor would have full 21 authority to negotiate all sorts of matters 22 23 with Indians without the appropriate public review, without the appropriate legislative 24 25 approval for those agreements. And those

could be land claims, they could be issues regarding Indian taxation, it could be a whole list of the issues that are normally part and parcel of Indian nation issues in relation to New York State.

This legislation does take a step in the right direction to ensure that the public, through the elected representatives, are the final arbiters and approval process for any decisions and agreements made in Indian matters.

That I may remind this body it was a few governors ago when Governor Mario Cuomo entered into a compact with the Oneida Indians and established a casino. That compact was never approved by this legislative body and, as such, has been fully questioned and appropriately scrutinized by the courts of this state. And the agreement with the Oneidas and the State of New York is in severe doubt because of the lack of appropriate legislative approval.

Senator Klein's bill today I
believe closes a significant loophole that was
established earlier in the week by the law

that required Indian taxation and the issues 1 2 related to the collection of that tax. 3 So I appreciate the sponsor's rapid 4 review of this issue and the appropriate 5 closure of the loophole so that ultimately whatever matters are discussed with Indian 6 7 nations and the Governor of this state -- and 8 what other agreements are put forward -- that 9 this Legislature will have the appropriate 10 scrutiny authority, and as such the public 11 will have an opportunity to review those 12 agreements before they become enacted into law. 13 14 Thank you, Mr. President. 15 ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: Thank you, Senator Nozzolio. 16 17 Senator Valesky, on the bill. 18 SENATOR VALESKY: Thank you, Mr. President, on the bill. And very briefly, 19 20 because my colleague Senator Nozzolio 21 summarized the issue very well and very 22 accurately. 23 I just want to thank Senator Klein 24 for the speed with which he has brought this 25 chapter amendment to Monday's bill to the

1 floor today.

And it is very simple. This is ensuring that the elected representatives have an opportunity to weigh in on any compacts that the Governor of the State of New York would enter into with any Indian tribe across the state.

So I'm very supportive of the bill.

Again, I want to thank my colleague Senator

Klein for bringing this before us. And I urge
a yes vote. Thank you.

ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: Thank you, Senator Valesky.

Senator Volker, on the bill.

SENATOR VOLKER: Mr. President, as somebody who has a lot of Indians in his district -- in fact, I have part of the Seneca reservation; Senator Young has the other part -- I'm actually very happy with this bill except for one thing.

It is my understanding, Senator

Klein -- Senator Klein? Excuse me. Senator

Klein, it is my understanding that the way the

Legislature decides to confirm the Governor's

decision or whatever is through a process that

is like the Regents process where the Assembly 1 2 and the Senate meet together, rather than a 3 separate process the way we normally do where 4 the Senate meets and the Assembly meets. 5 that correct? ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: 6 7 Senator Volker, do you ask Senator Klein to 8 yield? 9 SENATOR VOLKER: Yeah, I'm sorry, 10 I might as well ask him to yield. ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: 11 Senator Klein? 12 SENATOR KLEIN: 13 Mr. President, I'll be happy to yield. 14 15 The agreement that's stated in the text of the legislation, if an Indian nation 16 17 or tribe enters into an agreement with the 18 State and the Legislature approves such agreement, that agreement -- or I guess it 19 20 would also be known as a compact -- would have to be approved by the Legislature, first the 21 22 Assembly, then the Senate. It would not be 23 similar to the Regents. We looked up the example of when we 24 25 had a compact with the St. Regis Mohawk tribe.

1	And that was done by the Assembly and the
2	Senate, both legislative houses.

"WHEREAS, It is with feelings of deepest regret that this Legislative Body mourns the untimely death of Private First Class David Taylor Miller of Wilton, New York, and pays tribute to his courageous actions as

a member of the United States Army; and 1 "WHEREAS, PFC David Taylor Miller 2 3 was killed by a suicide bombing on Monday, 4 June 21, 2010, when he and another soldier 5 were on security checkpoints in the province of Kunar in Afghanistan. Always thinking of 6 7 others, he asked to switch his two-week leave 8 to a later date so a fellow soldier could go home and meet his newborn son; and 9 10 "WHEREAS, This brave soldier, known 11 as 'Taylor' to his friends and family, 12 graduated from Saratoga Springs High School in 2009. He had moved to Wilton from his 13 14 hometown of Amherst, Virginia, during his 15 sophomore year; and "WHEREAS, He was a lineman for the 16 17 Saratoga Springs Blue Streaks Varsity Football 18 Team for two years; and "WHEREAS, The son of a Marine, 19 20 PFC David Taylor Miller joined the United States Army right out of high school in July 21 22 of 2009. He was deployed to Afghanistan in April 2010; and 23 "WHEREAS, PFC David Taylor Miller 24 25 was deployed to Afghanistan in April of 2010,

serving as a designated marksman with the 101st Airborne Division; and

"WHEREAS, He is survived by his parents, Leslie and Jesse Miller, and his sister, Victoria Ferguson; and

"WHEREAS, The banner of freedom will always wave over our beloved New York and all of America, the Land of the Free and the Home of the Brave; and

"WHEREAS, Residents of this great state must never forget the courage with which these men and women served their country, and must recognize that no greater debt is owed than that owed to those who gave their lives for their beloved nation and to those who continue to be missing in action; and

"WHEREAS, The freedoms and security we cherish as Americans come at a very high price for those serving in the military in times of conflict. It is fitting and proper that we who are the beneficiaries of those who risk their lives, leaving their families behind, express our appreciation and eternal gratitude for their sacrifices and courageous acts; now, therefore, be it

You know, 16 it's so sad when you think of -- he was called 17 18 Taylor, David Taylor Miller -- Taylor gave up his leave to come home to see his family so 19 20 that a friend of his, his buddy, could visit his newborn son. 21 22 This young man was killed by a suicide bomber at a checkpoint and gave up his 23 life. 24 25 Now, at 19 years of age and he's

going to be buried in Arlington National
Cemetery in Virginia. He originally came from
Virginia. He lives in the town of Wilton,
which is in my district -- where Senator
McDonald lived for many years and was the
supervisor -- but went to Saratoga Springs
High School and was an outstanding football
player and so forth.

And it's interesting on July 4th that the City of Saratoga Springs, for their annual Fourth of July weekend celebration, will dedicate their entire weekend celebration to Taylor Miller.

You know, it is so sad -- and

Senator Maziarz just lost a constituent this

week, and Senator Little lost a constituent

this week -- it is so sad what is going on in

our world today. But I would ask that all of

my colleagues in this house mourn the death of

Taylor Miller because of all that he's given

for our country. And what a fine young man

that he thought of others before he thought of

himself.

And with that, I would yield the floor to my colleague Senator McDonald, who

would like to speak on this also. 1 ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: 2 3 Senator McDonald. 4 SENATOR McDONALD: Thank you, 5 Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Farley. 6 Thank you, New York State Senate. 7 This is certainly a sad time, our 8 third this week. I know all my colleagues 9 from all over this great state have been going 10 through this. There's a sadness that's almost 11 12 incomprehensible if you're a parent. life, I've evolved from a soldier to a parent 13 14 to a grandparent. You not only think of this 15 wonderful soldier, so many of them -- men and women, all over the place -- you think of 16 their family members right now, the sadness in 17 18 their hearts. I don't know what the answer is. 19 20 As a former soldier, I know one thing: nice to have the people back home carrying 21 about them. 22 I'm proud of this Senate and this 23 24 state because they do care about our soldiers. 25 I'm proud of the soldiers. When I read the

newspapers throughout the state, New York City papers upstate, it's amazing to see the diversity of our military -- men, women, Hispanics, African-Americans, upstate, downstate. One thing in common: They love this country so much they're willing to leave it to protect it.

So we have kind of a special responsibility, and I know we're all up for it, and that is to take care of them, the ones that survive and come back, and to be there for their family structures, like now. It's a tough challenge. Other generations of Americans have had to do it. And I'm sure that future generations will have to do it.

It is without question one of the saddest things that I've ever been involved with. And I'm just amazed that there's so many men and women throughout this great country and state that are willing to do that for us.

So thank you for letting me have the opportunity to express that.

person performing services for a contractor shall be classified as an employee unless the person is a separate business entity under subdivision 2 of this section or all the following criteria are met, and it goes on to list the criteria.

But when I look at Section 2, one of the things -- and again, I'll emphasize the difference between perhaps major construction jobs in New York City and smaller jobs that may occur in communities such as those that I represent. But one of the criteria, and it goes from A through L -- and I assume that's -- I won't assume, that's 12 separate criteria each of which have to be met.

One of them, in order to establish that you are an independent contractor, the business entity must have a substantial investment of capital in the business entity beyond ordinary tools and equipment and a personal vehicle.

Now, many of the independent contractors in my area are one-man operations, perhaps two-person operations, and they get by by working at any number of different sites.

And in the course of doing that, they probably have a pickup truck and they probably have a bin in the back of their pickup truck where they store their tools, and that's pretty much their capital investment.

We're not talking about major companies here. We're not talking about people who have big-time offices with conference rooms. And we're not talking about people who may have a large space where they store materials or the like. These are folks who in many instances are merely trying sustain themselves. So that immediately presents an enormous problem for any number of small entrepreneurs in my district.

Then it goes on to say that the business entity perform services for the contractor under the business entity's name.

Now, I'm not quite sure if that means in the absence of either an LLC, a corporation, or a d/b/a, an assumed name, if Tom Jones isn't sophisticated enough to form an LLC and just goes out and works on the job site as a carpenter or a plumber or an electrician, that because he doesn't have a business name that

somehow or other he's prejudiced.

And the fact that that individual, this one or perhaps two-person operation, may do what is lawfully expected of him and secure workers' compensation insurance as a sole proprietor or partnership, is not binding on any determination.

So you take some little guy or little gal who's out there trying to make a living, trying to scrape by, taking any job that might be available in order to do this, perhaps occasionally working as an independent contractor on a particular job site -- and they're complying with the law. They've got workers' compensation. And one of the things you would think they would attempt to use to establish that in fact they are legitimately in business -- and this says if they do that, it doesn't matter.

Now, I understand the desire to punish those who violate the law, and they certainly should be punished. I understand the efforts to try and inject an element of wilfulness into this. But this has been cast with such a broad brush that you are

effectively going to take, in what is already a horrid economy, a number of people who are desperately trying to sustain themselves by the sweat of their labor -- their hands, their tools, their pickup truck -- and basically say you can't work on a job site as an independent contractor, that's not going to be permitted to you, so you'd better confine yourselves to another universe, you'd better limit yourselves to looking for odd jobs, working at one or another residence or building because you by definition are incapable of being an independent contractor.

And the cards have been stacked, stacked so high and so badly that it greatly prejudices any number -- and I couldn't even begin to hazard a guess. And I assume it would be true in many areas upstate.

To the extent that there's a significant problem in the city, and to the extent that you want to punish those who are wilfully in violation, then by all means they should be punished. But this should not have been crafted in such a blunderbuss fashion and certainly should have been cognizant of those

who are struggling to make a living, who are barely getting by, and who desperately are looking for work and do from time to time, in that capacity, find themselves working on larger job sites as either an independent contractor or perhaps a subcontractor.

I would hope that the sponsor, who I know certainly is a keen advocate as the chairman of the Labor Committee, might consider some way in which to take into consideration some of the points I've just raised and before, in fact, this session is over, which is just around the corner, might look at some means by which to address those issues.

Thank you.

ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: Senator Ranzenhofer.

SENATOR RANZENHOFER: Thank you, Mr. President.

I share many of the concerns that were expressed by Senator Saland. And it appears that the intent of the legislation is focused mainly on a problem that is occurring in New York City.

But what is actually going to

happen here, by casting such a wide net to try to deal with a problem in New York City, in my area in Western New York it's going to be very hurtful to the small businessman or woman that right now serves as an independent contractor.

It's also going to be disproportionately impacting and negatively impacting minority— and women—owned businesses, because many of them are the smaller companies not yet at the larger stage, and will have a real bad affect on women— and minority—owned businesses.

One of the problems that you have here, as Senator Saland said, is that you have companies that are two, five, six, and this is really going to shut them out of the construction industry. They need to rely on not only working on big jobs but working on small jobs. And when you craft this legislation, it's just so onerous that these people are no longer going to be able to work on the types of jobs which they've been working on and they're struggling to work on, because there aren't that many jobs.

One of the things that also concerns me is the way, in the legislation, you defined wilfulness. And the way it's defined is that you knew or should have known that the conduct was prohibited. And that seems more like oversight and making a mistake

than intentionally going out.

I agree that someone who is deliberately cheating the system ought to be punished. But the definition that you have here is going to capture the person who is not knowledgeable, who is not a lawyer. And the penalties that have been assessed are really, really rather extreme, especially for Western New York.

The first thing is that -- and I haven't seen much of this -- is that you're now criminalizing this type of behavior. And a person who is guilty of this section can now go to jail. So what you're doing is you're taking a businesswomen or woman and you're putting them in the same category as someone who is convicted of drunk driving and kills somebody, someone who has committed a criminal offense. The businessman, the businesswoman

is now in that same category, and they can find themselves in jail. Obviously if they could themselves in jail, they're not going to have a company that exists any longer.

Also some of the penalties here, \$25,000, \$50,000 for some of these violations, that may be more than the contractor makes in a year. And yet a penalty of \$50,000 is going to be imposed on that particular individual.

I understand what the intent is behind this. The intent is admirable. But the way that the law is crafted in terms of criminalizing what I believe to be mistakes really is going to hurt small business in my area.

ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON:

Thank you, Senator Ranzenhofer.

Senator Savino, on the bill.

SENATOR SAVINO: Thank you,

21 Mr. President.

First I want to congratulate

Senator Onorato for bringing this bill through

and getting it to the floor, and also for the

support of the Governor's office and the

Assembly, who worked on this.

The misclassification of workers in the construction industry is a problem not just for those employees but it's a problem for the State of New York. There is rampant abuses of workers in the construction industry that are hurting the State of New York's bottom line. A recent study by Cornell University suggests that as many as 50,000 New York City construction workers -- that's nearly one in four -- are either misclassified as independent contractors or they're employed completely off the books. Which makes their employers already in violation of the law.

Over \$4 billion in taxable wages are underreported due to misclassification.

That results in the underreporting of over \$175 million in unemployment tax, which taxes our unemployment insurance system.

An estimated \$150 million in healthcare costs are shifted to employees, taxpayers and honest employers because of misclassification. Misclassification of construction workers actually puts good actors at a competitive disadvantage with the bad.

Now, I understand, from listening to Senator Saland, his concern about real independent contractors. And we believe that in this bill we have found a way to clearly define who is an independent contractor.

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The Fair Play Act creates a presumption that a construction worker is an employee rather than an independent contractor unless the employer can prove either, under the ABC test, (A) the worker is free from control and direction in performing the work -- that means they're free to make their own independent decisions. They may own their own pickup truck, their own tools and go from place to place. They would not be an employee; they would be an independent contractor -- (B) the service is performed outside the employer's usual course of business; and (C) the individual is customarily engaged in an independent trade that is similar to the work in question.

This ABC test has been adopted in 26 other states in an effort to crack down on misclassification in the construction industry.

It is not just harmful to the 1 2 employees who find themselves at the end of 3 the year assuming that their taxes have been 4 collected and transmitted to the federal 5 government and the State of New York when in fact they haven't. It protects them in the 6 7 event they get hurt on the job and they find 8 out that their employer -- who they thought was an employer. They didn't know they had 9 10 this relationship that they were an 11 independent contractor -- they get hurt on the 12 job, there's no workers' compensation coverage 13 for them. They get unemployed, there's no 14 unemployment insurance tax. 15 This costs the State of New York, it costs the workers, and it costs the good 16 actors in the construction industry. 17 18 that's why this is a good piece of legislation. 19 20 ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: Senator Saland, why do you rise? 21 SENATOR SALAND: 22 Will Senator 23 Savino yield? ACTING PRESIDENT CRAIG JOHNSON: 24 25 Senator Savino, will you yield for a question?

SENATOR SAVINO: Certainly. 1 2 SENATOR SALAND: Just one 3 So that means that I can tell all question. 4 of the people I just described earlier that 5 they can disregard Section 2 because it doesn't apply to them, the 12 criteria that 6 7 they also have to meet. 8 SENATOR SAVINO: Section 2 refers 9 to who a contractor is. And what we're trying 10 to define under the law here, who is an 11 employer in the construction industry. 12 And I believe that the language that we've put forth clarifies who becomes an 13 independent contractor. So for a small 14 15 one-or-two-person firm, as opposed to a guy who shows up every day on the job and actually 16 works for somebody else but does not realize 17 18 that he is being misclassified by his employer. 19 20 SENATOR SALAND: I'll ask one 21 last question, if you'll yield, and then I'll 22 sit down. 23 SENATOR SAVINO: Certainly. SENATOR SALAND: 24 So the language 25 that reads "Any person performing services for

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a contractor shall be classified as an
