Young, of Mother Teresa Community here in Albany, to lead us in a 11 12 prayer. 13 **REVEREND YOUNG:** Thank you, 14 Senator. 15 Dear God, on this beautiful first day of spring with the snowflakes, You've made 16 a world where we have become our neighbor and 17 18 to each other we are enabled, therefore, to love one another. Zeldin, I move to commit Senate Print Number 1 2 3638, Calendar Number 169 on the order of 3 third reading, and commit it to the Committee 4 on Finance, please. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: So ordered. б 7 Senator Libous. 8 SENATOR LIBOUS: Thank you, Mr. President. 9 Mr. President, there's a privileged 10 11 resolution at the desk by Senator Perkins. 12 May we please have it read in its entirety, and I believe Senator Perkins would like to be 13 14 called on before it's adopted. 15 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: The Secretary will read. 16 17 THE SECRETARY: By Senator 18 Perkins, Legislative Resolution Number 994, memorializing Governor Andrew M. Cuomo to 19 20 proclaim March 2011 as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month in the State of New York. 21 "WHEREAS, Colorectal cancer is the 22 second leading cause of cancer deaths in men 23 and women combined in the United States; and 24 25 "WHEREAS, It is estimated that in

the year 2011 over 146,970 new cases of 1 2 colorectal cancer will be diagnosed in the 3 United States; and 4 "WHEREAS, In the year 2011 the 5 disease is expected to kill an estimated 49,920 individuals in this country; and 6 7 "WHEREAS, An estimated 9,970 8 individuals in the State of New York were 9 diagnosed with colorectal cancer in the year 10 2009; and "WHEREAS, In November of 1999 the 11 12 United States Senate passed legislation declaring March 2000 as the first ever 13 National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month; 14 15 and "WHEREAS, The Colon Cancer 16 Alliance, Inc., will continue working with 17 18 Congress for coverage, education, and awareness so that colorectal cancer is 19 20 detected early and lives are saved; and 21 "WHEREAS, Screening for colorectal cancer is underutilized. Less than 50 percent 22 of individuals above age 50 receive annual 23 screenings for colorectal cancer; and 24 25 "WHEREAS, Regular screenings, which

1	can detect polyps that lead to colorectal
2	cancer, can save lives; and
3	"WHEREAS, Education can help inform
4	the public about methods of prevention, and
5	about symptoms, to aid in early detection; and
6	"WHEREAS, Adopting a healthy diet
7	at a young age can significantly reduce the
8	risk of developing colorectal cancer; and
9	"WHEREAS, The Ralph Lauren Center
10	for Cancer Care and Prevention is offering
11	colon cancer evaluations for men and women
12	age 50 and over, and prostate evaluations for
13	men age 40 and over, to be held at the Adam
14	Clayton Powell Jr. State Office Building in
15	New York on Wednesday, March 23, 2011, in
16	conjunction with Colorectal Cancer Awareness
17	Month in the State of New York; and
18	"WHEREAS, The State of New York
19	should help inform the public about colorectal
20	cancer prevention and screening; now,
21	therefore, be it
22	"RESOLVED, That this Legislative
23	Body pause in its deliberations to memorialize
24	Governor Andrew M. Cuomo to proclaim
25	March 2011 as Colorectal Cancer Awareness

Month in the State of New York; and be it 1 2 further 3 "RESOLVED, That will copies of this 4 resolution, suitably engrossed, be transmitted 5 to The Honorable Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of the State of New York; The Colon Cancer 6 7 Alliance, Inc., 1025 Vermont Avenue, N.W., 8 Suite 1066, Washington, D.C. 20005; Dan 9 Foster, 8 Dictum Court, Brooklyn, New York 10 11229; Dahlia Rizk, D.O., Director, 11 Hospitalist Program, Beth Israel Medical 12 Center, First Avenue at 16th Street, New York, New York 10003; Jianjun Li, M.D., Maimonides 13 14 Medical Center, Director, Division of 15 Gastroenterology, 4721 Fort Hamilton Parkway, Brooklyn, New York 11219; and the Ralph Lauren 16 Center for Cancer Care and Prevention, 1919 17 18 Madison Avenue, New York, New York 10035." 19 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Senator 20 Perkins. 21 SENATOR PERKINS: Thank you very 22 much. 23 I'm going to be brief because I think that the resolution speaks well for what 24 25 it is that we're trying to acknowledge.

I'm speaking today as a survivor of 1 2 colorectal cancer, and I know all too well that early detection is essential. However, 3 4 less than 50 percent of at-risk individuals 5 have regular screenings. Colorectal cancer is highly treatable with early detection, and if 6 7 everyone at risk received screenings 8 regularly, the number of deaths could be reduced by 60 percent. 9 10 And I know especially African-American men and men of color are 11 often victims of colorectal cancer to the 12 fatal extent. And we've launched a campaign 13 to alert our neighbors and our friends to get 14 15 these prescreenings in order to prevent the mortality that would result without them. As 16 a matter of fact, as was pointed out, we are 17 18 doing some screenings as we speak at the Adam Clayton Powell State Office Building. 19 20 And I want to acknowledge again the Ralph Lauren Center for Cancer Care and 21 22 Prevention for the extraordinary work that 23 they've been doing in alerting our communities about this colorectal cancer problem and 24 25 getting the community united and organized to

deal with it. 1 2 So thank you very much, and I would 3 ask my colleagues to join me in signing onto the resolution. 4 5 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Thank you, Senator Perkins. б 7 Any other Senator wishing to be 8 heard on the resolution? 9 (No response.) The 10 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: question is on the resolution. All in favor 11 12 signify by saying aye. 13 (Response of "Aye.") ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: 14 15 Opposed, nay. 16 (No response.) ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: 17 The 18 resolution is adopted. Senator Libous. 19 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, I 20 21 believe we are on the reading of the 22 noncontroversial calendar, please. ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: 23 Senator Libous, Senator Perkins indicated a 24 25 willingness to leave the resolution open for

cosponsorship. Anyone not wishing to be on 1 2 the resolution please notify the desk. 3 May we please have the 4 noncontroversial reading of the calendar. 5 The Secretary will read. And she didn't tell me 16 why she knew why this bill was important, but 17 18 I was very impressed about that.
