ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: The 1 2 Secretary will read. 3 By Senator Klein, THE SECRETARY: 4 legislative resolution commemorating the 125th 5 Anniversary of the Villa Maria Academy of the 6 Bronx, New York, March 26, 2011. 7 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: The 8 question is on the resolution. All in favor 9 signify by saying aye. 10 (Response of "Aye.") ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: 11 12 Opposed, nay. 13 (No response.) ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: 14 The 15 resolution is adopted. 16 Senator Libous. 17 SENATOR LIBOUS: Thank you, 18 Mr. President. 19 Senator Serrano has a privileged resolution at the desk. He would like to have 20 21 the title read, and I believe he would like to 22 speak on it. 23 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: The Secretary will read. 24 25 THE SECRETARY: By Senator

Serrano, legislative resolution memorializing 1 Governor Andrew M. Cuomo to declare 8:30 p.m. 2 on Saturday, March 26, 2011, as Earth Hour in 3 the State of New York. 4 5 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Senator б Serrano. 7 SENATOR SERRANO: Thank you, 8 Mr. President. 9 Today I'm introducing a very 10 important resolution for the third year in a 11 This resolution declares this Saturday, row. 12 March 26th, at 83:00 p.m. as Earth Hour. Earth hour is a globally observed 13 hour conceived in a statement of action 14 15 against global climate change. It calls upon people from all over the world to turn off 16 their nonessential lights for one hour. 17 18 Last year nearly 2,400 cities, towns and municipalities in over 83 countries 19 observed Earth Hour. This year cities ranging 20 21 from Tel Aviv, Israel, to Copenhagen, Denmark, 22 have already pledged to observe Earth Hour. By flipping the switch for one hour 23 24 and turning off their nonessential lights, 25 citizens around the world signify that they

understand the urgency of climate change and 1 2 are prepared to tackle the challenges head on. New York State is a global icon and 3 4 home to some of the most beloved landmarks in 5 the world, from Niagara Falls in Buffalo to Yankee Stadium in my own district. Actions б 7 taken by the Empire State have both a symbolic 8 effect and a very tangible effect on the rest of the world. 9 10 For the last several years, at my 11 request, the Empire State Building and a number of other sites went dark for one hour. 12 It is my hope that participation will be even 13 14 greater this year and that all of my 15 colleagues here today will join me in helping to increase participation within their own 16 districts and surrounding neighborhoods. 17 18 I hope all of you will join me in support as we designate 8:30 p.m. on March 26, 19 2011, as Earth Hour throughout the great State 20 21 of New York. Thank you. ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: 22 Thank you, Senator Serrano. 23 The question is on the resolution. 24 25 All in favor signify by saying aye.

(Response of "Aye.") 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Those 3 opposed, nay. 4 (No response.) 5 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: The resolution is adopted. 6 7 Senator Libous. 8 SENATOR LIBOUS: Thank you, 9 Mr. President. 10 Mr. President, there is a privileged resolution at the desk by Senator 11 12 Stewart-Cousins. May we please have it read 13 in its entirety and call on Senator Stewart-Cousins before its adoption, please. 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: The 16 Secretary will read. 17 THE SECRETARY: By Senators 18 Stewart-Cousins, McDonald and Johnson, 19 legislative resolution commending Firefighter 20 Michael Giroux in recognition of his heroic 21 action on March 4, 2011, in saving the lives 22 of two citizens. "WHEREAS, It is the sense of this 23 Legislative Body to recognize and commend the 24 25 caring concern and heroic acts of individuals

in public service who take prompt and 1 2 appropriate action in emergency situations, nobly risking their own lives in an effort to 3 4 preserve the life of another; and 5 "WHEREAS, Attendant to such concerns, and in full accord with its б 7 long-standing traditions, this Legislative 8 Body is justly proud to commend Firefighter Michael Giroux in recognition of his heroic 9 10 action on March 4, 2011, in saving the lives of two citizens; and 11 "WHEREAS, The son of Richard and 12 Ann Giroux, Michael Giroux is a native of 13 14 Albany, New York. He attended Shenendehowa 15 schools in Clifton Park before earning his Bachelor of Science degree from the State 16 University of New York at Cortland and later a 17 18 master's degree in Ex-Physiology from Adelphi University; and 19 20 "WHEREAS, Michael Giroux worked at Cornell Medical Center and for several private 21 doctors before accepting a position with the 22 City of Yonkers Fire Department in 2000, where 23 he was assigned to serve Ladder 71, Rescue 24 25 In this capacity, he serves as a One.

specialist in technical rescue who trains 1 2 emergency personnel in saving lives from 3 confined spaces, collapsed trenches and rope 4 rescues from buildings and escarpments; and 5 "WHEREAS, On the afternoon of Friday, March 4, 2011, two workers were б 7 painting the facade of a high-rise building on 8 Nepperhan Avenue in the City of Yonkers, New York, when their platform malfunctioned, 9 10 causing them to dangle perilously 13 stories above the ground; and 11 12 "WHEREAS, Despite high winds, Firefighter Michael Giroux and his dedicated 13 14 colleagues set a plan in action to safely 15 remove the painters. He was chosen for his expertise to rappel down the 27-story 16 apartment building from the building's roof to 17 18 rescue the two men who were trapped; and "WHEREAS, Using the skills and 19 20 techniques he has taught others, Michael Giroux went to work rescuing the first worker, 21 who he deemed to be in the most immediate 22 danger. After successfully harnessing and 23 24 lowering the first man to the ground, he 25 immediately repeated the heroic actions,

1	rescuing the second worker; and
2	"WHEREAS, Michael Giroux's quick
3	command and the heroic efforts of both he and
4	his entire team resulted in the inspiring
5	rescue that saved the lives of these two men;
6	and
7	"WHEREAS, Firefighter Michael
8	Giroux's heroic actions were not possible
9	without the help of Assistant Chief Roger
10	Vitola and Firefighter Jose Caraballo of
11	Battalion 1, Lieutenant Nicholas Sarro,
12	Firefighter Brendan Healy, Firefighter Joseph
13	Golusinski and Firefighter Douglas Higgins of
14	Rescue 1; Captain Rudolph Sarro, Firefighter
15	Timothy Sullivan, Firefighter John Rodriguez
16	and Firefighter Kendrick Geiger of Ladder 71;
17	Lieutenant Brian McCaffrey, Firefighter Brian
18	Curran, Firefighter Kevin Mozdziak and
19	Firefighter William Castillo of Engine 303;
20	Lieutenant Christopher Williams, Firefighter
21	Neill Tyndal, Jr., Firefighter Hugh McGahran,
22	Firefighter Antonio C. Rodriques of Engine
23	304; Captain Joseph Darcy, Firefighter Hung
24	Chun, Firefighter John Spano and Firefighter
25	Christopher Leal of Engine 306; Lieutenant

1	Daniel Flynn, Firefighter Christopher

22	"WHEREAS, Also assisting in the
23	rescue efforts were members of the Yonkers
24	Police Department's Emergency Services Unit,
25	including Captain Thomas Barnett, Sergeant

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Robert Akey, Police Officer Dennis Borelli, 1 Police Officer Jorge Cordero, Police Officer 2 Jamie Molino, and Police Officer Anthony 3 4 Alaimo; and 5 "WHEREAS, Upon getting to the scene, the Yonkers Police Department's б 7 Emergency Services Unit was able to gain 8 access to the victims through an apartment window on the 14th floor, enabling them to 9 10 pass the initial safety line to the men taking them out of imminent danger; and 11 "WHEREAS, The members of the 12 13 Yonkers Police Department's Emergency Services 14 Unit were able to speak and translate to the 15 painters, who spoke only Spanish, while also conducting a medical assessment, keeping the 16 situation under control; and 17 18 "WHEREAS, Due to the help from all of these emergency response crews, who were 19 20 instrumental with the rescue of the two workers after their scaffold collapsed, 21 Firefighter Michael Giroux's efforts were 22 triumphant; and 23 "WHEREAS, With him throughout have 24 25 been his wife, Deana Giroux, and their two

daughters, all of whom feel privileged to be a 1 2 part of his life and rejoice in his 3 achievements; and 4 "WHEREAS, Michael Giroux has truly 5 distinguished himself as one of New York's finest. When an act of such magnanimous 6 7 heroism is brought to our official attention, 8 the same should be memorialized for the edification and emulation of all; now, 9 10 therefore, be it "RESOLVED, That this Legislative 11 12 Body pause in its deliberations to commend Firefighter Michael Giroux in recognition of 13 his heroic action on March 4, 2011, in saving 14 15 the life of two citizens; and be it further "RESOLVED, That a copy of this 16 17 resolution, suitably engrossed, be transmitted 18 to Michael Giroux." 19 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Senator 20 Stewart-Cousins on the resolution. SENATOR STEWART-COUSINS: Thank 21 you, Mr. President. 22 23 And I do want to commend the 24 Secretary, because I know this was the very 25 first time that we've had an opportunity for

you to read.

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2	And I think it's an auspicious time
3	for this to have happened, because there are
4	many days that we stand in this chamber and we
5	talk about heroic acts and we thank people who
6	have done extraordinary things. Many times,
7	however, we do it posthumously. I know the
8	last time I commended a Yonkers firefighter,
9	it was Firefighter Patrick Joyce, whose
10	heroism was just unimaginable, but only his
11	family and his colleagues and friends were
12	here; he was not.
13	So today is a day, I think, which
14	is exceptional because not only are we
15	celebrating heroism, but we have the heroes
16	here to celebrate collectively.
17	So you've heard the story of
18	Firefighter Michael Giroux, and you know that
19	he did things that no one of us would have
20	thought possible. Although we know actions
21	like this happen, but very few of us ever have
22	a bird's-eye view as you see a rescue such as
23	the one that Firefighter Giroux was able to
24	accomplish.
25	He went up one of the tallest
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buildings in Yonkers. When we talked about 1 2 it, it was actually 27 stories, but he had to 3 go up even another story in order to position 4 the ropes properly and come down to rescue two 5 workers who were hanging by their harnesses after their scaffold had broken. We watched 6 7 breathlessly, wondering how this was going to 8 happen, who was he going to rescue, was it going to be successful, was he going to get 9 10 out all right? And after about an hour and a half 11 12 of this partnership that happened between the 13 police and the emergency services, the 14 firefighters, Empress EMS, everybody -- with 15 all of us looking at this wonderful rescue with a magnificent outcome, we were all not 16 only proud of the City of Yonkers but 17 18 indebted, as always, to the heroism of Firefighter Giroux. 19 20 So I thought it was important to bring these heroes here -- you've heard their 21 names and their ranks -- and thank them 22 collectively. 23 This happened in my district in 24 25 Yonkers, but I know that Firefighter Giroux

1	actually lives in Senator Johnson's district
2	and that his parents live in Senator
3	McDonald's district. So not only is it a
4	great event, but it's a celebration that we
5	can all enjoy across the state, remembering
6	how you risk your lives every day to protect
7	all of us, how important it is that we allow
8	you to smell your flowers and get your
9	accolades while you are here to enjoy it, how
10	grateful we are to your family for enduring
11	and supporting you as you make these
12	sacrifices, and how important it is that you
13	continue your work knowing that you have the
14	full community support. And as you've read in
15	this resolution, you certainly have.
16	So I wanted to thank you and
17	recognize that, again, Firefighter Giroux is
18	here with his loving parents, Richard and Ann;
19	his grandmother, Theresa Brassard, who's
20	accompanied by Jim Kelly; uncle Tim Walsh and
21	aunt Jeanie; and you also heard read in the
22	resolution his daughters Gianna and Samantha.
23	There are four generations here to come to
24	celebrate Firefighter Giroux.
25	Congratulations, Firefighter.

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1	(Standing ovation).
2	SENATOR STEWART-COUSINS: And
3	just because all of the EMS people were not in
4	the resolution and they will be because all
5	of the names are there the Empress EMS
6	professionals who were key in the success of
7	the rescue: Chris Pinnock, Michelle
8	Marsalisi, Rich Rivera, Karen Novelli, Thomas
9	Daliy, Brian Hickey, and Marcel Cekuta.
10	And also here, and I think they
11	just went quickly out, was Barry McGoey, who's
12	the president of Yonkers Firefighters Local
13	Number 628, as well as Greg DeSousa, trustee,
14	Yonkers Firefighters Local 628, Captain Kevin
15	Ford, Augie Nigro, the assistant chief,
16	Michael McManus, president of the Professional
17	Firefighters Association of New York State, as
18	well as Sam Fresina, who is
19	secretary/treasurer of the New York State
20	Professional Firefighters Association.
21	We are all very, very proud of you.
22	And again, thank you so much for being heroic
23	and who you are. Congratulations.
24	(Applause.)
25	ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Thank

you, Senator Stewart-Cousins. 1 2 Senator Owen Johnson on the 3 resolution. I would like to 4 SENATOR JOHNSON: 5 add my congratulations, my pride in the accomplishments of Michael Giroux and his team б 7 of firemen. 8 The training he took and the 9 initiative he took showed not only 10 intelligence but bravery and courage. And I wouldn't want to get on a 27-story building 11 and come down on a rope and try to save 12 somebody, but he did it, and he brought his 13 firemen with him. And it's a wonderful 14 15 inspiring story of heroism and rescue. So thank you very much. 16 17 (Applause.) 18 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Senator McDonald on the resolution. 19 20 SENATOR McDONALD: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator 21 Stewart-Cousins. 22 23 And a special gratitude to a home-grown hero and what you've done and all 24 25 your family. What an inspiration. Ιt

certainly shows you that this state is a lot 1 2 smaller than people think it is. Whether it's a New York State 3 4 trooper who's from the metropolitan area or 5 New York City or Long Island doing something courageous in upstate New York, or somebody б 7 originally from Saratoga County and the Albany 8 area going down and doing the same thing, it makes you feel part of a family. 9 An 10 inspiration to us all that we should never forget that we're all here and we're all here 11 12 to help each other. And if there's somebody in need, it doesn't matter who you are or 13 14 where you are, we've got people like 15 Firefighter Giroux and his colleagues in the emergency services to be there for us. 16 So this is a double inspiration for 17 18 Thank you. me. 19 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Senator 20 Klein on the resolution. SENATOR KLEIN: 21 Thank you, Mr. President. 22 23 I want to thank Senator Stewart-Cousins for bringing this resolution 24 25 before us today.

I have the privilege of 1 2 representing a small portion of the City of But I do want to really congratulate 3 Yonkers. 4 Michael on his heroic acts. You know, 5 unfortunately in many cases when we honor police officers or firefighters they're not 6 7 here to accept our congratulations. Thank God 8 Michael's heroic acts, you know, left him still with us. 9 10 You know, again, unfortunately when 11 we read our newspapers or watch our TVs 12 lately, our public sector-workers aren't 13 always getting the best rap. But I think it's 14 not only today but every day we have to say a 15 special thank you to our Yonkers bravest. And I think Michael represents them best. 16 He risked his life. 17 Many 18 New Yorkers were glued to their TV sets watching what Michael was able to accomplish. 19 20 And I think we owe him a debt of gratitude. And sometimes things -- there's a 21 lot of fate in life, people there at the right 22 23 And I think Michael's training, time. Michael's heroic acts, Michael was the perfect 24 25 person to be there on that very day to save

those two workers.

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2 So I thank you, Michael, and I know 3 you'll continue to protect us each and every 4 day in the great City of Yonkers. Thank you, 5 and thank you to your family. ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: 6 Senator 7 Savino on the resolution. 8 SENATOR SAVINO: Thank you, Mr. President. I also want to thank Senator 9 10 Stewart-Cousins for bringing this resolution. And, you know, one of the most 11 12 riveting things I've seen on television in the last month or so was not a movie, was not a 13 14 television show, certainly wasn't a reality 15 show -- it was the opportunity to watch Michael Giroux and his colleagues, the 16 emergency service workers, rescue those two 17 18 workers who were hanging off the side of the building. 19 20 For about an hour, Channel 7 Eyewitness News covered the entire event. 21 And 22 I would like to tell you I was doing something 23 important, but I was actually at the nail salon getting my nails done. And all the 24 25 women in the nail salon were transfixed by

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roof down, a firefighter rappel down the side of the building and then stop and try to figure out which one of those hanging workers he was going to rescue first. It was absolutely amazing. And it just serves to remind us just how difficult the job is that our first responders do every day. And as Senator Klein said, it's very easy to forget because we open the newspaper every day and we hear from county executives and town supervisors and governors and mayors about how we can't afford these guys anymore, they cost us too much money,

their benefits are too high, their disability 1 2 risks are too high. It's very easy to think 3 that we can, you know, just value them in terms of dollars and cents. 4 5 What we saw on March 4th on the б news, what we saw these guys do is priceless. 7 So whatever it is we're paying them, it's not 8 enough money. 9 Congratulations to Michael, to all 10 of his colleagues and the emergency service Thank God we're here today to say 11 workers. 12 thank you to you. And for those two workers 13 that you saved, thank God you were there for 14 them that day. 15 Thank you, Senator Stewart-Cousins for bringing this. 16 17 And congratulations again. 18 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Senator Hassell-Thompson on the resolution. 19 20 SENATOR HASSELL-THOMPSON: Thank 21 you, Mr. President. Just very quickly before 22 they have to leave the chambers. 23 The City of Mount Vernon abuts Yonkers. And one of the things, when I was on 24 25 the city council, that made me very

appreciative of having Yonkers as a neighbor 1 2 was the fact that whenever we had serious 3 emergencies and we could not handle them, 4 Yonkers was always there for us. And Yonkers 5 continues to be there for us. 6 And so I want to add my 7 congratulations and thanks to you, Michael, 8 and to your entire brigade for the work that 9 you continue to do and the support that you 10 continue to give to my city, the City of 11 Mount Vernon. And thank you. 12 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Anyone 13 further wish to be heard on the resolution? The question is on the resolution. 14 15 All those in favor signify by saying aye. 16 (Response of "Aye.") ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: 17 18 Opposed, nay. 19 (No response.) 20 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: The 21 resolution is adopted. 22 Senator Libous. 23 SENATOR LIBOUS: Thank you, Mr. President. 24 25 Mr. President, can we now go to the

reading of the noncontroversial calendar. 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Yes, 3 Senator Libous.
