through strenuous practice, team play and team
spirit, nurtured by dedicated coaching and
strategic planning; and

"WHEREAS, Athletic competition
enhances the moral and physical development of
the young people of this state, preparing them
for the future by instilling in them the value
of teamwork, encouraging a standard of healthy
living, imparting a desire for success, and
developing a sense of fair play and
competition; and

"WHEREAS, On November 20, 2010, the Lady Spartans Williamsville North High School captured the Class A Girls Field Hockey
Championship with a 1-0 victory over
Mamaroneck. It was their second New York
State title in four years, previously winning the championship in 2007; and

"WHEREAS, The 2010 Williamsville
North High School Girls Field Hockey Team
finished the season undefeated with an
outstanding 21-0. The team amassed an
extraordinary 18 shutouts during the season;
and

"WHEREAS, In addition to winning two New York State championships in the past four years, the Williamsville North High School Girls Field Hockey Team has achieved a tradition of excellence over many years. It has vied for the state title six times in the last eight years. They have won eight section titles, nine division titles, and nine league titles since 1999 (eight since 2002), and 31 of its players have earned All-State status and 10 players have reached All-American status; and

"WHEREAS, The Williamsville North High School Girls Field Hockey Team has also been ranked number one on a weekly basis in the All-Western New York Coaches Poll since the 2003 season. Its record since 2002 is an outstanding 162-16-6, and it has compiled an exceptional 130-11-5 record since its first State Tournament team in 2003; and

"WHEREAS, The athletic talent displayed by this team is due in great part to the efforts of Coach Kristine LaPaglia and Assistant Coach Dalton Beaver, skilled and inspirational mentors respected for their

ability to develop potential into excellence; and

"WHEREAS, Coach Kristine LaPaglia has been coaching for 14 years and reached a career milestone this past season by securing her 200th career win in October. Her overall record as a coach is 207 wins, 48 losses and 13 ties; and

"WHEREAS, In 2008 and again in 2009, Coach LaPaglia was named the North Region Coach of the Year by the National Field Hockey Coaches Association; and

"WHEREAS, The team's overall record is outstanding, and the team members were loyally and enthusiastically supported by family, fans, friends and the community at large; and

"WHEREAS, The hallmarks of the 2010 Williamsville North High School Girls Field Hockey Team, from the opening game of the season to capturing the Class A Championship, were a sisterhood of athletic ability, of good sportsmanship, of honor and of scholarship, demonstrating that these team players are second to none; and

I will be voting in the negative on this bill. The only reason I am doing that, I want it to be clear, it seems that certain aspects of this bill might create certain situations that would actually -- if in a situation, for example, where there's a designated driver who is a permitted driver while there is a driver who has been -- who is the supervising driver who is intoxicated, and yet the permitted driver is not, it seems that this bill would put that person in a situation where they might be liable for a Class E felony.

Also, the possibility that if there's no infraction, let's say that there is a checkpoint and the person goes through the checkpoint, is pulled over for no reason except that they went through the checkpoint -- and again, the permitted driver is totally sober, but some of the other folks in the vehicle or the driver to the side might be intoxicated, that might create a situation where they might be held liable for a Class E felony.

For those reasons, although I 1 2 certainly believe that it is important to 3 protect us, all of us, from drunk driving, in 4 this case, in this bill, I'm going to have to 5 vote in the negative. Thank you, Mr. President. 6 7 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Thank 8 you, Senator Rivera. 9 Call the roll. 10 (The Secretary called the roll.) ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: 11 Senator Rivera will be recorded in the negative. 12 Senator Maziarz to explain his 13 14 vote. 15 SENATOR MAZIARZ: Thank you very much, Mr. President. To explain my vote. 16 Mr. President, this legislation 17 18 would provide for additional criminal penalties for an individual, a supervising 19 20 driver -- that is, someone who is supervising an individual who has a learner's permit and 21 who is under the influence of drugs or 22 23 alcohol. This legislation came about because 24 25 of a very tragic incident in Orleans County on September 4, 2009, where Corey Buzard, who had been drinking all day at a family party, and was way to too drunk to drive but he convinced a 17-year-old cousin to drive him to a convenience store to get additional alcohol.

And he put his 8-year-old daughter Abagail in the back seat of car.

It was a dark night, it was a rainy night, Orleans County is an extremely rural county, and this young 17-year-old driver drove off the road into a gully, and little Abagail was killed. A beautiful little red-haired girl; her mother said her eyes were blue like the sky. And she died a horrible death which I won't describe here today.

And her father did absolutely nothing, nothing to try to save his daughter's live. He didn't because he was too drunk to even to attempt to save his 8-year-old daughter.

This legislation hopefully will get voted on here in this house today, and, along with my colleagues in the Assembly, we can hopefully provide that this tragic accident that happened to little Abagail will not

happen again. 1 2 I vote in the affirmative. 3 you, Mr. President. 4 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Senator 5 Maziarz to be recorded in the affirmative. Senator Adams to explain his vote. 6 7 SENATOR ADAMS: I understand my 8 colleague's concern about the bill, but I have to commend Senator Maziarz on this bill. 9 10 Because the point of a supervisor, 11 a driver or person in the vehicle, you know, 12 that is the reason why we put in place these 13 procedures. Because you expect the person who's the intelligent one in the vehicle is to 14 15 actually ensure that no one is on the road that's driving while either under the 16 influence of alcohol or drugs. 17 18 And I thinking this sends a strong message that we have to really concern 19 20 ourselves about, you know, who's on the road. Not only does it impact the individuals in the 21 vehicle, but it impacts others who are on the 22 23 road. So I'll be voting aye for this 24 25 bill. I think this is a good bill. And I

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think it covers a very important aspect. I

16	Freedom of Information, find out records of
17	health problems on specific farms. So let's
18	say a specific farm had an outbreak of
19	documented mad cow disease; there would be no
20	way for the public to find out that
21	information.
22	SENATOR YOUNG: Through you,
23	Mr. President. Actually, the Department of Ag
24	& Markets may disclose such confidential data
25	provided that the department determines that

disclosure is needed for the protection of the 1 2 public or animal health and safety. 3 So if there were, you know, an outbreak of mad cow disease, for example, that 4 5 information could be disclosed by the department if they deem it to be the right 6 7 course to take. 8 SENATOR LIZ KRUEGER: Thank you, 9 Mr. President. 10 On the bill. ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: On the 11 bill. 12 13 SENATOR LIZ KRUEGER: Thank you. 14 I appreciate the sponsor's answer to my 15 question. 16 I have to say I think that when it comes to public health, the public's right to 17 18 find out information -- such as has there been 19 a disease outbreak potentially having a risk 20 to the public if they were to in fact digest 21 that food -- has a greater public good to make 22 sure that that information can be made available. 23 It's not that I don't trust our 24 25 Department of Ag & Markets. We've

historically had wonderful people leading the department. I hope to have a new commissioner there who I'll be very confident in.

Nonetheless, I think that the public's overriding right to be able to find out information about the health conditions of farm animals and whether there is any kind of outbreak of disease and whether there is any kind of risk to those of us in the public who count on making sure that our food supply is healthy and does not cause disease is an overriding right of the public, particularly at a time where we know that unfortunately at the federal level they've decreased the amount of supervision and inspections that take place.

We've seen growing, year after year, an increased rate of disease associated with our food supply not being carefully evaluated before it comes to market. We have a growth in salmonella, we have a growth of food-poisoning cases that track back to our food supply.

And given the fact that government is not always as diligent as we all hope it

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would be, particularly in times of limited
