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THE SECRETARY: Legislative resolution by Senator Breslin, congratulating the Shaker High School Girls Basketball Team and Coach Emily Caschera upon the occasion of capturing the Section II Class AA Championship.

"WHEREAS, In addition, the Shaker
High School Girls Basketball Team was honored
by its school's athletic department as one of
eight winter sports teams which qualified for
the New York State Scholar Athlete Team Award.
The Lady Bison received an honorary pin from
the New York State Public High School Athletic
Association for acquiring an academic team
average of 91.549; and

"WHEREAS, The athletic talent displayed by this team is due in great part to the efforts of Coach Emily Caschera, a skilled and inspirational tutor respected for her ability to develop potential into excellence; and

"WHEREAS, The team's overall record of 20-3 is outstanding, and the team members were loyally and enthusiastically supported by family, fans, friends and the community at large; and

"WHEREAS, The hallmarks of the Shaker High School Girls Basketball Team, from the opening game of the season to participation in the championship, were a

sisterhood of athletic ability, of good sportsmanship, of honor, and of scholarship, demonstrating that these team players are second to none; and

"WHEREAS, Athletically and academically, the team members have proven themselves to be an unbeatable combination of talents, reflecting favorably on their school; and

"WHEREAS, Sports competition instills the values of teamwork, pride and accomplishment, and Coach Emily Caschera and the outstanding athletes on the Shaker High School Girls Basketball Team have clearly made a contribution to the spirit of excellence which is a tradition of their school; now, therefore, be it

to the Shaker High School Girls Basketball 1 Team and to Coach Emily Caschera." 2 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 3 4 Senator Breslin on the resolution. 5 SENATOR BRESLIN: Thank you, Mr. President. 6 7 I'm honored to rise and speak on 8 behalf of the Shaker Girls Basketball Team that, for the first time in 30 years, won the 9 10 Section II AA Championship. More importantly, as read in the resolution, having a team 11 academic average of 91.5, one of the top 12 academic teams in the State of New York. 13 14 And to Emily Caschera, Times Union 15 Coach of the Year, congratulations. And to some of the lead players: 16 17 Madison Rowland, who averaged 18 points, made 18 the Class AA Tournament Team MVP and Times Union 1st Team All-Area. 19 20 And Adrianne Devine, the team 21 co-captain, made the All Tournament Team, averaged 13 points, and prior to the season 22 was a McDonald's All-American candidate. 23 And Lauren Woods, who will be back 24 25 next year, and has already challenged me to a

one-on-one competition, who averaged 12 points 1 2 and made Second Team All-Area. 3 And to others who are up there --4 Christine Alley, who's a junior and co-captain 5 of the team. Erica Vallecorsa, Mallorey Dickson, Madison's two sisters, MacKenzie and 6 7 Merrick, and Emily Mion, a big congratulations 8 for a terrific season. 9 Many of your parents are here to 10 celebrate your successes. And with that team 11 average, both points per game and academic 12 average, we look forward to you being successful for many, many years to come. 13 14 Congratulations. 15 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Thank you, Senator Breslin. 16 17 Senator Sampson. 18 SENATOR SAMPSON: Thank you very much, Mr. President. 19 I just too want to rise and 20 congratulate the Shaker Girls Basketball Team 21 22 for their championship. But what's most attracting to me is your success on the court 23 translates to success in the classroom. 24 25 So it's so important, especially a

SENATOR McDONALD: Thank you,
Mr. President.

This is an annual recognition that becomes more significant every year, and that's to recognize and understand what's happening in our disabilities community as a new illness or situation develops in our family of New York. It's autism and the various forms of it that have now plagued not only our state but the entire country.

It's going to be a difficult year for those people, and it could be difficult years as that population becomes bigger and starts aging. We will be prepared for it. We have a lot of good people. Especially today, we have two good people that we're going to be voting on to confirm their new positions. And we already have a lot of good people in the various state agencies that deal with it.

But we can do better. And that's what we're going to do, with the help of everybody in this room. Because this is an issue that does not recognize boundaries -- race, religion, ethnic group, geography,

anything. This is what America is about, 1 2 helping people who need help. 3 So at this time I want to thank 4 this body for all their support and their 5 continuous support, along with the people in the Assembly, and our Governor, our new 6 7 Governor. And I'm especially waiting in a 8 little while to announce some new appointments 9 by our Governor giving us an opportunity to 10 vote on two outstanding individuals. Thank you. 11 12 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Thank you, Senator McDonald. 13 This resolution has been previously 14 15 adopted, so there's no reason to take a further vote. 16 17 Is there anyone else wishing to be 18 heard? Senator Fuschillo. 19 20 SENATOR FUSCHILLO: Thank you very much, Mr. President. 21 And let me thank my colleagues for 22 23 putting forth this resolution. Autism in families throughout this 24 25 state and throughout the nation is becoming

such a prevalent issue that it's incumbent upon the people of the State of New York and us here as legislators in this house and the Assembly to do something.

And we did something last year when Governor -- it passed this house I believe unanimously, and it passed the Assembly unanimously, and Governor Paterson, to his fault -- and it's probably one of the only times I'm going to criticize the former Governor -- vetoed the bill. And what the bill would have done is provide insurance coverage to families for diagnosis and treatment for those who have children or young adults with autism.

It was the right thing to do. When we look at families throughout New York State that are mortgaging their houses to provide the proper care of their children, it's something they have to do. If they have to give blood, sweat and tears, they'll do it for their children. But it's wrong that the State of New York is not doing the right thing.

Today the Insurance Committee, under the leadership of Chairman Jim Seward,

put out a bill that I've sponsored, and it has 1 2 a same-as bill in the Assembly by Assemblyman 3 Morelle, to just do that and revisit this 4 issue. And I hope the Senate takes it up on 5 the floor. I'll be voting in favor of the 6 7 resolution. Thank you very much. 8 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 9 Thank you, Senator Fuschillo. 10 Senator Libous. 11 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, 12 this was previously adopted; is that right? 13 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 14 Yes, it was, Senator. 15 SENATOR LIBOUS: We'd like to open this for cosponsorship. And as our 16 17 normal policy, if there are any members in the 18 chamber who wish not to be on it, to please notify the desk. Otherwise you will all be on 19 20 as cosponsors. Bearden, 4 of New York City. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Senator DeFrancisco. 6 7 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes, I'm 8 very pleased to move the nomination of Roger A. Bearden for the position of member and 9 10 chair of the State Commission on Quality of Care and Advocacy for Persons With 11 Disabilities. 12 Mr. Bearden has an incredible 13 14 record for such a young man. In fact, I 15 believe my suit may be older than he is. (Laughter.) 16 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: But he's 17 18 done more things in that short period of time than many of us would even attempt to do. And 19 20 it's an incredible record. And just speaking with him briefly 21 at my office earlier, and also from seeing him 22 working for Senator Duane last year on some 23 important issues, he definitely has the 24 25 qualification for this job. And even more

importantly, I believe he has the fire in his 1 belly to do the right thing, being an advocate 2 3 for people with disabilities for many years 4 now. 5 So the Governor made another topnotch appointment here. And I would move 6 7 his nomination and urge the complete Senate to 8 vote for Mr. Roger A. Bearden, of New York City, for this position. 9 10 Thank you. ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 11 Is 12 there anyone else wishing to be heard on this nomination? 13 Senator Breslin, I believe. 14 15 SENATOR BRESLIN: Thank you, Mr. President. 16 I applaud Senator DeFrancisco and 17 18 will second his comments about Roger Bearden, who was a resident of my district and I'm sure 19 20 he will be again. But he's focused his professional 21 22 career on people with disabilities and has a

unique understanding of people with

disabilities. He's a Brown graduate, a

Harvard Law graduate. And again, as we see

day after day and time after time, a wonderful 1 choice by this Governor. And I applaud this 2 3 choice particularly. 4 Thank you, Mr. President. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Thank you, Senator Breslin. 6 7 Is it my understanding you do not 8 hold the fact that the gentleman worked for 9 Senator Duane against him? 10 SENATOR BRESLIN: I quite frankly did not mention that, Mr. President. Senator 11 Duane will be here to explain himself. 12 13 (Laughter.) ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 14 15 understand your reticence, sir. Senator McDonald, please. 16 SENATOR McDONALD: 17 Yes. Real 18 briefly, my committee as well myself had an opportunity to meet with our new chairman. 19 20 And as it was said earlier, not only is he is a bright, dedicated individual, he's got a 21 22 good way about himself and a very strong family person -- his wife, Erin; his children 23 Sarah, Myles and Eli. And he's ready, in a 24 25 very trying time in this particular area,

disabilities, he's ready to help us out. 1 2 You know, we're grateful that the 3 Governor appointed him. And it should be 4 realized that what we'll be going into this 5 year, with the various abuses that have occurred and been reported, it's going to be a 6 7 tough year. I'm honored to speak on behalf of Roger Bearden. He was the chief Health counsel the same year that I became the chair of the Health Committee. And he was incredibly impressive in his knowledge and also in his teaching abilities and to explain very complicated policy questions in a way that made it possible for not only me but other people in my office and other people who he worked with to understand the importance of various policy initiatives that he was so instrumental in moving forward.

You know, Roger could have chosen a completely different career path. He has an incredibly impressive academic background. He probably could be making a tremendous amount of money. But instead, he's making a tremendous difference in the lives of people who don't have that many advocates and really need to have a strong voice fighting for them and protecting them and making sure that their voices are being heard.

It's a 5 very, very challenging time. The area in which he's working is extremely challenging 6 and very much in the public eye right now. 7 8 And I firmly and strongly believe that Roger 9 Bearden is going to do an excellent job. 10 will make the Governor proud, and I am very pleased that the Governor has made this 11 12 appointment. And I consider him not just a 13

And I consider him not just a colleague but in many ways a mentor on issues that I care about but which he knew so much about, and a friend. And I'm optimistic that his nomination is going to go through today, and I certainly will be working as closely as I can with him. And I would encourage everyone else to, because it will be a great experience.

         about some of my ideas, and I reviewed her
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resume and saw that she had a heck of a lot more ideas than I could come up with.

And she has many writings on very, very important issues that are facing the state today. And there's not often that an individual could be a member of a think tank and analyze with such scrutiny the way the state is being run now in specific areas and come up with recommendations as to how it could run better, and then have the opportunity to be appointed to a position where she can do something about the deficiencies that she wrote about, that she thought about, and that she had advocated to correct.

She's an extremely bright individual, well accomplished, and just perfect for this job. And I want to commend Governor Cuomo again. I seem like a broken record, but his appointments this year have just been outstanding, and these two appointments today are a perfect example.

And I'm looking forward to working with Ms. Burke and sharing her ideas as we go through the next budget process as to how we

can do things not only more efficiently and 1 more cost-effectively, but better for the 2 3 recipients that receive these services from the State of New York. 4 5 So I move the nomination of 6 Courtney Burke. 7 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: The 8 nomination is moved by Senator DeFrancisco. Senator McDonald. 9 10 SENATOR McDONALD: Thank you, Mr. President. 11 12 As the chairman of Mental Health, 13 Mental Hygiene and Developmental Disabilities, 14 along with Senator Huntley, the ranker, we had 15 an opportunity to talk at length with this wonderful individual. 16 17 Like the first person, Roger, 18 Commissioner Burke is outstanding, with a great deal of experience and also a great deal 19 20 of compassion for a very important position. And this position, as I mentioned earlier, is 21 22 going to get more important as the year progresses, and we have to deal with some very 23 serious problems. 24 25 She doesn't do it by herself; she

has her husband, Christopher, and her 1 children, Ian and Caroline, with her. 2 And I think she will quickly point 3 4 out that she went to the University of 5 Connecticut and she's a big University of Connecticut basketball fan. And as a Siena 6 7 fan, I can't say too much about that. 8 next year. 9 (Laughter.) 10 SENATOR McDONALD: But certainly, 11 as the chairman of Finance pointed out, the 12 Governor has presented us with two outstanding 13 candidates today. And I'm prepared and really 14 happy to support these folks. 15 Thank you. ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 16 Thank you, Senator McDonald. 17 18 Senator Breslin on the nomination. SENATOR BRESLIN: 19 Thank you, 20 Mr. President. Again, echoing the remarks of 21 Senator McDonald and Senator DeFrancisco, 22 Courtney Burke is perfect for the job. Her 23 educational background in healthcare, her work 24 25 with people with disabilities, and her

extensive writing while at the Rockefeller, it 1 just -- it's such a perfect, perfect choice to 2 become the new commissioner. 3 4 Again, I applaud the Governor. 5 Courtney and her family live in my district and she works in my district and is a friend 6 and I think will just do an exceptional job as 7 8 commissioner. 9 Thank you, Mr. President. 10 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Thank you, Senator Breslin. 11 12 May I advise members that we do not use electronic equipment, cellphones in the 13 14 chambers. Members on cellphones, please take 15 your conversation out of the chamber. That is our rule. 16 Senator Huntley on the nomination. 17 18 SENATOR HUNTLEY: Thank you, Mr. President. 19 20 Again, I would like to commend the Governor for his choice. I met with Courtney 21 22 Burke in my office and also in committee, and Senator McDonald and I agree she was a great 23 choice. And we will support her efforts. 24 25 And again, I would like to

congratulate her and her family. 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 3 Thank you, Senator. 4 Senator Kennedy on the nomination. 5 SENATOR KENNEDY: Thank you, Mr. President. 6 7 I just want to rise and first and 8 foremost commend the Governor on a tremendous selection of Courtney Burke as the 9 10 commissioner of New York State Office for People with Developmental Disabilities. I 11 want to congratulate the commissioner-to-be on 12 the nomination and this confirmation. 13 14 As an occupational therapist, I 15 have worked with hundreds of families who have been impacted by having an individual with a 16 developmental disability. And the work that 17 18 happens in Albany and spreads across the state ripples across this state is extremely 19 20 important to ensure that those individuals and the families of the individuals with 21 22 developmental disabilities get the services 23 that they deserve, that they desire, and that make their lives as independent as possible. 24 25 I look forward to working with you

personally, with my office, and it's an honor 1 and a privilege to be able to stand here at 2 your confirmation, and I vote in the 3 affirmative. 4 5 Thank you. ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 6 7 Thank you, Senator. 8 Senator Carlucci. 9 SENATOR CARLUCCI: Thank you, 10 Mr. President. 11 Again, I'd like to commend Governor 12 Andrew Cuomo for this appointment. Commissioner Burke, in the short time as the 13 acting commissioner, has really hit the ground 14 15 running, already putting forth measures to protect our most vulnerable population. 16 her proactiveness, I'm confident that New York 17 18 will be able to provide services to protect the safety and the welfare of people living 19 20 with developmental disabilities. So with that, Courtney Burke, I 21 22 look forward to working with you. And again, I want to commend the Governor. And I think 23 this is a great appointment, and I think we're 24 25 in good hands with Commissioner Burke.
