"WHEREAS, from 1933 to 1945, 1 2 5.8 million Jews were murdered in the Nazi 3 Holocaust as part of a systematic program of 4 genocide, and millions of other people also 5 perished as victims of Nazism; and "WHEREAS, Jews who fell under 6 7 German control in Eastern and Central Europe 8 were quickly stripped of their rights and 9 property; and 10 "WHEREAS, The Jews who perished at Nazi hands comprised two-thirds of all 11 12 European Jewry, and in countries such as Poland, which before the Second World War 13 14 included parts of the Ukraine and Belarus, the 15 Jewish death toll surpassed 90 percent; and "WHEREAS, The people of the State 16 of New York should always remember the 17 18 atrocities committed by the Nazis so that such 19 horrors are never repeated; and 20 "WHEREAS, Those who survived the 21 killing camps tell us that as many people walked to their deaths, their last words were 22 23 'Remember us'; and "WHEREAS, The year 2011 marks the 24 25 78th anniversary of the beginning of the

genocide of European Jews, the darkest, most murderous moment in history; and

"WHEREAS, We learn in the aftermath of the Holocaust that indifference to genocide cannot be tolerated. Holocaust remembrance imposes a moral obligation to speak out; and

"WHEREAS, The Holocaust represents the darkest period in the civilization of mankind and must always be remembered in order to prevent its reoccurrence anywhere else in the world; and

"WHEREAS, The People of the State of New York should continually rededicate themselves to the principle of equal justice for all people; and

"WHEREAS, The People of the State of New York should remain eternally vigilant against all tyranny and recognize that bigotry provides a breeding ground for tyranny to flourish; and

"WHEREAS, Holocaust Remembrance
Day, known in Hebrew as Yom Hashoah, is a day
set aside for remembering the victims of the
Holocaust and for reminding New Yorkers, all
Americans, and people around the world of what

can happen to civilized people when bigotry, 1 2 hatred and indifference reign; and 3 "WHEREAS, Internationally, 4 Holocaust Remembrance Day is observed on the 5 27th day of Nisan according to the Hebrew calendar, but because it falls on a Sunday, 6 7 this year it will be observed on Monday, 8 May 2, 2011; now, therefore, be it 9 "RESOLVED, That this Legislative 10 Body pause in its deliberations to memorialize 11 Governor Andrew M. Cuomo to proclaim May 2, 12 2011, as Holocaust Remembrance Day in the State of New York; and be it further 13 14 "RESOLVED, That a copy of this 15 resolution, suitably engrossed, be transmitted to the Honorable Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of 16 the State of New York." 17 18 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator Skelos. 19 20 SENATOR SKELOS: Thank you, Mr. President. 21 22 Of course I would open up the resolution for sponsorship. Anybody that 23 wishes not to sponsor the resolution, they 24 25 should notify the desk.

My wife and I, when we were driving up this morning, we were listening to the radio. And the commentator mentioned, in connection with the death of Osama bin Laden, that on April 30th, so right in that same period of time, that Adolf Hitler committed suicide.

And we commemorate and we pray for the souls of those who lost their lives in the Holocaust, and we think about what man's inhumanity to man can be. And today we think about the thousands of people that lost their lives on September 11th, and we say thank you to our President, to our intelligence community, and to the Navy Seals that finally brought Osama bin Laden to justice.

So we think about him being executed. He probably deserved more than that. But also all of us in this room reflect upon the lives -- and I think it's even more important -- the lives of our neighbors, our friends, our relatives who were brutally murdered on September 11th.

Almost ten years have passed by.

But certainly the leadership in our country --

whether it was President Bush, President

Obama, our intelligence community, our

military, and the people of this state and

this country -- at no time wavered from the

prayer and the thought and the wish that this

animal would be brought to justice.

So I ask for the adoption of this resolution. We commemorate and we pray for the souls, as I said, of those who -- the lives of 6 million that were destroyed during the Holocaust, and for those who lost their lives on 9/11.

13 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator
14 Breslin.

SENATOR BRESLIN: Thank you,
Mr. President.

I join with Senator Skelos on this day after we learned of the execution of Osama bin Laden. Osama bin Laden represented everything that we oppose. And he opposed everything that we stood for -- for freedom, for justice. And September 11, 2001, will always be emblazoned in the hearts and minds of all citizens in the United States, but particularly those in New York.

And this is not the end. We will always treasure the memories of those lost on 9/11. But at least it takes a step towards closure for those men and women we lost and the families who lost loved ones. And it's a giant step, because Osama bin Laden represented everything that's evil in this world. And as I said, he opposed everything that we stand for, and most of all our freedoms.

What it shows the rest of the world and Osama bin Laden and his people is that the United States does not forget its obligations. When it strives for peace, it still must oppose those who strive for war.

So justice in the Holocaust, when so many innocent lives were lost, and that we stand today to honor those lives that were lost, we also stand for those lives that were lost on 9/11, 2001, and praise the fact that we no longer have to deal with an enemy that was led by Osama bin Laden.

Mr. President. Let me too join to support this resolution.

Clearly it's very important that we remind ourselves of all the horrors of the Holocaust and when evil goes unchecked. And that the slaughter of innocent people, no matter where and when, should never be acceptable -- not only then, but as a world standard. And we can see in some places of the world what still goes on. There's much work to do. And we should use this as a reminder for that all over the world.

So we continue to need to remind and educate people on this atrocity and others. Recently, just yesterday, in a suburb of Rochester, New York -- Brighton, a very beautiful suburban town, home to many people, but a large population of Jewish Americans, two teens were apprehended burning a swastika that they had made out of wood and material in a park -- completely insensitive, obviously not getting the lesson of what people went through, thinking that it's still okay to do

Head Coach Tony Morabito, while he needs to spend a lot of time being the basketball coach for the Gananda Women's Team, he finds time and has found time for many years to be a volunteer fireman working with the Walworth Fire Department.

Tony, thank you for being such a great coach and wonderful role model, and for giving so much to the community.

As we commemorate and discuss

issues of September 11th, that horrific day brought about many heroes, and those heroes are exemplified in all our volunteer firemen and firewomen from across New York State, across the nation, who are true heroes in that endeavor in that each and every day they put themselves on the line to support their community and to protect their community.

This bill would give 360 days plus 9 10 allow increments beyond that of 90 days. And I believe that we all agree 11 here that it's time, in order to make towns 12 more efficient, villages, cities more 13 14 efficient, that we begin to bring 15 consolidation together. And we applauded the Attorney General at the time. 16 I think this does nothing more than 17 18 waters it down. And accordingly, I will be voting in the negative. 19 20 Thank you, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 21 Senator 22 Krueger to explain her vote. 23 SENATOR LIZ KRUEGER: Thank you, Mr. President. I too rise to explain that I 24 25 am voting no on this bill.

When we did pass the legislation in 2009 to allow local governments to dissolve or to merge, the intention was to provide a mechanism for communities, recognizing that their local costs and their local taxes were excessive, to be able to streamline too many layers of government at the local level.

As I read this bill, the changes being proposed to that law would literally gut the bill, the intention of our existing law, and make it impossible for communities to accomplish this goal.

Given that we constantly hear -again, constantly hear, both sides of the
aisle, that property taxes and other local
taxes are too high, and that the identified
key issue is an overproduction of government
levels, we need to ensure that communities
have the ability to streamline and decrease
the number of layers of government at the
local level to accomplish the public service
goals of government without an overabundance
or an overproduction of staff requiring too
many resources.

So frankly, this bill will put us

back in time rather than move us forward. 1 2 vote no. 3 Thank you, Mr. President. 4 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 5 Krueger and Senator Breslin to be recorded in 6 the negative. 7 Senator Stewart-Cousins to explain 8 her vote. 9 SENATOR STEWART-COUSINS: Yes, 10 thank you, Mr. President. I rise also to -- I will be voting against this bill. 11 And I do want to commend Senator 12 Martins for dealing with some of the issues. 13 14 Because again, when the Attorney General's 15 bill came forward, I was privileged to be able to sponsor the bill because we all understand 16 that we have over 10,000 local taxing 17 18 districts, all of which were doing different things. That bill made it a streamlined 19 20 process, and it put the power in the hands of the citizenry. 21 22 When we first began this discussion 23 in January -- with some amendments, because there are some things that can be done -- I 24 25 mentioned in committee at that time that I was

concerned that the study commission would delay the process. I was also concerned that the study commission did not empower citizens, because in the study commission are only the elected people, and many of the people who might be impacted in consolidation.

We need to make sure that this bill is right so that people can take advantage of consolidation and dissolution. But it cannot take power from the citizens, it cannot prolong a process, it can't make a situation that is difficult even worse.

And that's why I am voting no.
