Legislative THE SECRETARY: 1 2 Resolution Number 767, by Senators Griffo, Hannon and Little, memorializing Governor 3 4 Andrew M. Cuomo to proclaim May 2011 as Lupus 5 Awareness Month in the State of New York. 6 "WHEREAS, Each year the Lupus 7 Agencies of New York State designate May as 8 Lupus Awareness Month to show support for the 105,400 New Yorkers, 1.5 million Americans and 9 10 5 million people worldwide who suffer from the often debilitating effects of lupus, a chronic 11 autoimmune disease that can cause severe 12 13 damage to the tissues and organs in the body, 14 and in some cases death; and 15 "WHEREAS, Each year thousands of people are newly diagnosed with lupus, a great 16 17 majority of whom are young people in the prime 18 of their lives, and 90 percent of whom are women; and 19 20 "WHEREAS, Lupus is the most 21 prevalent among African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans, Asians. And tragically, 22 thousands of people die from lupus each year 23 because a cure remains elusive; and 24 25 "WHEREAS, Many healthcare

professionals are unaware of symptoms and health effects of lupus, causing people with lupus to suffer for many years before they obtain a correct diagnosis and medical treatment, demonstrating the need for increased public and professional awareness of lupus; and

"WHEREAS, Medical research efforts into lupus and the discovery of safer, more effective treatment for lupus patients are underfunded in comparison with diseases of comparable magnitude and severity; and

"WHEREAS, Increasing community
awareness and focusing public attention on
lupus and its devastating impact on patients'
lives will provide hope for a better future
for those affected; and

"WHEREAS, The Lupus Agencies of
New York State are dedicated to 'improving the
quality of life for individuals with lupus and
their loved ones by providing education,
support and outreach services and promoting
programs of awareness, advocacy and research';
and

"WHEREAS, This Legislative Body

recognizes the needs of those chronically ill people who are living with lupus and urges all citizens to support the search for a cure and assist those individuals and families who deal with this devastating disease on a daily basis; now, therefore, be it

"RESOLVED, That this Legislative

Mr. President. I want to thank the members for taking up this resolution today.

SENATOR GRIFFO:

I want to thank those who are in attendance here in the gallery today for being so vigilant and so engaged in this -- Kathleen Arntsen and many people are here from across

New York State to continue to make members of the Legislature and leaders across this state informed and aware of this debilitating disease.

Over 1.5 million Americans are affected by this disease. And we heard how females and African-American women are disproportionately affected, particularly between the ages of 15 and 44. So it is so important, as we try to deal with chronic illness and diseases such as the lupus issue, that we continue to make people aware of the need and the importance of research and putting together the resources financially that are necessary to try to help find a cure.

One example of that is the FDA has just recently approved a drug called Benlysta. It's a new form of therapy which is now being used as a result of clinical trials that they have now authorized. And I think this is why we want to make sure that when we look at pieces of legislation, when we look at clinical studies and the need for resources and funding in order to undertake these kind of studies, that we can find opportunities to

try to treat this disease. 1 2 But also, ultimately, what we're 3 trying to accomplish is a life without lupus. 4 I heard that today from Assemblywoman Gibson, 5 and I think it says it all. So it is so imperative -- and I 6 7 want to thank you -- that we call attention to 8 this, but it's equally important that we 9 continue to be engaged and involved in trying 10 to call attention to this and to ensure that we are diverting and developing policies and 11 12 resources that will help in trying to create that life without lupus. 13 So I want to thank all of you who 14 15 are here today for your efforts. I appreciate I'm proud to be a sponsor of this 16 resolution and will continue to work with you 17 18 to do what we can to combat this unfortunate disease. 19 Thank you. 20 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 21 Senator Hannon. 22 SENATOR HANNON: Thank you, 23 Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 24 25 Excuse me, Senator.

Can we have some quiet in the chamber, please.

Senator Hannon.

SENATOR HANNON: I just want to commend Senator Griffo for sponsoring this resolution and make two points.

One is this lupus, it is necessary to call attention to a disease like lupus because even in our modern society where we think we have healthcare that can treat all, there are these intractable diseases, especially those of the autoimmune system, that still bedevil people throughout the state, throughout the nation, and need to be addressed, need to have research, need to have treatment.

And the second is for those of you who have any familiarity with lupus or the other related illnesses -- fibromyalgia,
Lyme's disease -- it's a whole family of the autoimmune diseases -- there's a display in the Well of the LOB today with lots of information, people have come from around the state. And I would urge that you stop by and say hello and get some of the material and

information that's being displayed. 1 2 Thank you, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 3 Thank you, Senator Hannon. 4 5 Senator Little. SENATOR LITTLE: 6 Thank you, 7 Mr. President. 8 I'd like to join my colleagues in welcoming the women who are here today to show 9 10 all of us a little bit more about lupus. many of them are victims of lupus or know 11 12 someone who is. And I think one of the biggest 13 14 problems that is involved with having lupus is 15 getting that diagnosis, because it takes a long time and people go through a lot of tests 16 and everything before they can actually 17 18 determine what is the problem and what is causing the health issues that that person is 19 20 having. It also becomes a disease that you have to learn to live with as we go forward. 21 So recognition of it, awareness of 22 23 it is very important. And that's what a resolution like this does, and that's what 24 25 their presence here today does for all of us.

So thank you for being here. 1 Thank 2 you for improving the awareness and 3 recognition of this disease. 4 Thank you. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Thank you, Senator Little. 6 7 Senator Savino on the resolution. 8 SENATOR SAVINO: Thank you, 9 Mr. President. 10 I want to thank Senator Griffo for bringing this resolution. Earlier today I 11 12 attended the Lupus Awareness Day event in the Well with Senator Griffo and Assemblywoman 13 14 Vanessa Gibson and Assemblywoman Ellen Jaffee. 15 Assemblywoman Gibson and I sponsor three pieces of legislation which would bring 16 public awareness about lupus to a greater 17 18 number of New Yorkers by directing the Department of Health to establish a lupus 19 20 awareness and education program. Imagine, if we really thought about 21 22 this, if we were to look at the statistics, we know that there are 100,000 women in the State 23 of New York who have been diagnosed with 24 25 lupus. There are 100,000 women in the State

of New York who doctors have been able to determine that the debilitating disease that they have been suffering from is lupus.

How many more women are walking around and don't know it? How many more women are going to their doctors for some of the symptoms, as Senator Hannon talked about, and being treated or misdiagnosed? How many women are suffering? Far too many. If 100,000 have been diagnosed, we know that the likelihood is there's about a million who are suffering and not receiving the appropriate treatment. We can do something about that by raising awareness about lupus through the Department of Health, through education.

We've had some good news in the last year since the last Lupus Awareness Day here in Albany. As Senator Griffo said, the FDA had not approved a new drug for use in treatment of this debilitating disease in over 50 years. Last March they did. They approved the use of a drug called Benlysta. And while it has not provided full relief for all the women, it is providing a significant amount of relief for some.

But we need to do more. But the 1 2 first thing we need to do is to educate 3 doctors, to educate women, and to let people 4 know that those symptoms that they're feeling 5 could be lupus. Don't just assume it's fatigue or that you're overworked or that 6 7 you're just under the weather. It could be a 8 disease that will affect the rest of your 9 life. 10 So I want to thank Senator Griffo for bringing the resolution. And I hope all 11 12 of you will take the time to stop in the Well and pick up the information about lupus and 13 take it back to your district offices and let 14 15 people know that this is a disease that, if it is diagnosed early, can be treated better. 16 One hundred thousand women that we know -- how 17 18 many more don't we know about? 19 Thank you, Mr. President. 20 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 21 Thank you, Senator Savino.
