SENATOR PARKER: But also because 6 7 we represent in our respective districts the largest Haitian populations not just in the state 8 but actually in the world outside of Haiti in 9 10 terms of concentrations of residents. 11 Today is dix-huit mai, right, 12 Haitian Flag Day. And it's actually celebrated as the day that the Haitian flag was created. So 13 14 this is a great day in the history of the first 15 free democracy in the Western Hemisphere. And so it's something that we should pay attention to. 16 Anybody who comes from a free democracy got their 17 18 freedom and their understanding of it from the Haitian people and what they were able to do. 19 20

And so we remember that. We honor that. We remember Boukman and Jean-Jacques Dessalines, and we remember Toussaint L'Ouverture and the many other countless people who gave their lives so that the people of Haiti could be free. And not even understanding at that time

how viral freedom would become in the Western
Hemisphere.

And so we thank you. And so we know that you're not defined by the January 12th earthquake, but we recognize that and remember the lives lost there and use that as a standing point to rededicate ourselves to making sure that Haiti is the kind of democracy and the kind of republic that we'd like to see our country also become.

And so we look forward to continuing to work with you. And even though the folks here don't necessarily live in my district, I invite you down to come to Yoyo and eat and, you know, spend some time and to continue to celebrate this culture that's rich and historic and so important for all of us who care about freedom and democracy.

It would be somewhat surprising to this body to know that in that discussion there were good and vigorous arguments in favor of more gun control, but there were equally as many vigorous arguments against more gun control.

When we took a vote at the end of the session, it was interesting to know that 32 of the students voted in favor of more gun control, 30 students voted for no further gun control.

As we discussed it we talked about, extensively, responsibility and the behavior that must come with people who are licensed to carry weapons. But it was very interesting, someone wanted to change the Constitution. But by the mere fact that we voted 32 to 30 indicated why the Constitution probably will never be changed, because they represent the voice of the people as well.

And so it was an extraordinary session this morning. I appreciate the preparation and work that was done on behalf of the students and by their teachers in preparation
