Today, these 11 12 are our academic champions from our Senate district who have achieved very high in the 30 13 14 school districts that I represent. 15 This morning we were treated by a presentation by the Honorable Jonathan Lippman, 16 our Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals, and Ken 17 18 Adams, that spoke to some of our bright leaders of tomorrow. And I want to thank them for their 19 20 words of wisdom. This act shall take effect immediately. б 7 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Call the 8 roll. 9 (The Secretary called the roll.) 10 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator Saland, to explain his vote. 11 12 SENATOR SALAND: Thank you, Mr. President. 13 Mr. President, this is a very 14 15 important piece of legislation, important to many people, particularly important to the seniors' 16 community. There are a number of memos in 17 18 support, including one from the AARP strongly 19 supporting this legislation. What this bill does is it -- and 20 21 it's a bill which we passed last year, I believe 22 unanimously. This year the Assembly has passed the bill. It will work its way to the Governor 23 shortly. 24 25 What it does is basically says if

1 you are a person who is required to use eye drops 2 and those eye drops are used up before the 3 expiration of the period for which they have been 4 prescribed, you have the ability to go and get a 5 refill. Why is this important? Because 6 7 people, and I happen to be one of those people, who have eye diseases -- in my case, it's 8 glaucoma -- are greatly at risk if they don't 9 10 have the ability to continue to take their eye drops on a daily basis. 11 12 Under the existing law, once that prescription goes dry and you have a number of 13 14 days and sometimes weeks left, you cannot get a 15 refill. So if you're a glaucoma patient, and there are other degenerative eye diseases, your 16 sight is literally at risk. 17 18 The importance of this bill is that a patient will now be able to get those 19 20 desperately needed eye drops and preserve their 21 sight. The Governor of Maryland has signed 22 a very similar if not identical bill no more than 23 24 some two weeks ago. 25 This bill will be an enormous relief

1 to, again, particularly the seniors' community, 2 but anybody who has a problem in getting drops in their eyes -- and certainly the frail elderly 3 4 have a greater problem than most -- will benefit from this bill. 5 Thank you, Mr. President. 6 Quite 7 clearly, I support this legislation. 8 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 9 Saland to be recorded in the affirmative. 10 Announce the results. 11 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 55. 12 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The bill is passed. 13 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 14 15 351, by Senator Gallivan, Senate Print 4052, an act to amend the Criminal Procedure Law. 16 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Read the 17 18 last section. 19 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. (The Secretary called the roll.) 6 7 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 57. 8 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The bill 9 is passed. 10 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 765, by Senator Golden, Senate Print 1989, an act 11 to amend the Public Authorities Law. 12 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Read the 13 last section. 14 15 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This 16 act shall take effect immediately. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Call the 17 18 roll. (The Secretary called the roll.) 19 20 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 57. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The bill 22 is passed. THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 23 767, substituted earlier today by Member of the 24 25 Assembly Lentol, Assembly Print 2440, an act to

amend the Public Authorities Law. 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Read the 3 last section. THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This 4 5 act shall take effect immediately. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Call the 6 7 roll. 8 (The Secretary called the roll.) 9 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 57. 10 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The bill is passed. 11 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 12 773, by Senator Kennedy, Senate Print 3330, an 13 act to amend Chapter 276 of the Laws of 1993. 14 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 15 There is 16 a home-rule message at the desk. 17 Read the last section. 18 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This 19 act shall take effect immediately. 20 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Call the 21 roll. 22 (The Secretary called the roll.) 23 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 57. This 9 act shall take effect immediately. 10 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Call the roll. 11 (The Secretary called the roll.) 12 13 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 57. 14 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The bill 15 is passed. 16 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 801, by Senator Fuschillo, Senate Print 5171B, an 17 18 act to amend the Vehicle and Traffic Law. 19 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Read the 20 last section. 21 THE SECRETARY: Section 5. This 22 act shall take effect on the 90th day. 23 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Call the roll. 24 25 (The Secretary called the roll.)

1 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 2 Fuschillo to explain his vote. SENATOR FUSCHILLO: Just quickly, 3 Mr. President. 4 5 I want to thank my colleagues for their support of this bill. This came out of the 6 7 recent rash of bus crashes we've witnessed now in New York State, but most notably on March 12th, 8 9 when a bus returning to New York City from 10 Connecticut killed 15 passengers on the bus. And it was found out that the bus 11 12 driver was previously convicted of manslaughter and grand larceny. Had this bill been on the 13 books, he would have been permanently 14 15 disqualified from being able to drive a bus here 16 in New York State. So I want to thank my colleagues for 17 18 their support. 19 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Thank 20 you, Senator Fuschillo. 21 Announce the results. 22 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 57. 23 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The bill is passed. 24 25 The Secretary will continue to read.

1 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 2 807, by Senator Fuschillo, Senate Print 5232, an act to amend the Penal Law. 3 4 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Read the 5 last section. This THE SECRETARY: Section 6. 6 7 act shall take effect on the first of November. 8 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Call the 9 roll. 10 (The Secretary called the roll.) THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 57. Nays, 1. 11 12 Senator Hassell-Thompson recorded in the 13 negative. 14 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The bill 15 is passed. 16 Senator Marcellino, that concludes the reading of the calendar. 17 18 SENATOR MARCELLINO: Thank you, Mr. President. 19 20 I would ask that the Senate stand at 21 ease for a minute or two. And I would also ask 22 that members stay close. Because once we come 23 back, there will be several committee meetings called off the floor in rooms in the Capitol. 24 25 And your attendance at those committee meetings

Senator 1 ACTING PRESIDENT ROBACH: 2 Marcellino. 3 SENATOR MARCELLINO: Mr. President, 4 if you could recognize Senator Hassell-Thompson, 5 please. With unanimous consent. ACTING PRESIDENT ROBACH: 6 The 7 Senate will come to order. 8 Senator Hassell-Thompson. 9 SENATOR HASSELL-THOMPSON: Thank 10 you, Mr. President. Good morning. And I would 11 like again to acknowledge in the gallery students from two of my schools in the City of Mount 12 Vernon. 13 Graham Elementary School, their 14 15 principal is Natasha Hunter-McGregor. Their 16 teachers are Kevin Moore, Pat Longworthy, Keith Dembo, and Giselle Slayton. The teacher liaison 17 18 student council is Peggy Crouch, Annabelle 19 Strozza, and Annitra Jones. 20 And from our Longfellow Elementary School, Principal Lynette Harris. The teachers 21 are Mrs. Michelle Bromley, Mrs. Deidre Davis, and 22 Ms. Betsey Dorreliand. 23 Our students this morning had a mock 24 25 session, putting a close to the end of the

sessions that the elementary schools have done from the City of Mount Vernon. Today their issue again was inappropriate dress. And they are very concerned about the image that many of our young people are displaying by having their pants sag and show their underwear.

7 So they came today, but we had a very important lesson about -- because many of 8 them believed that it was a freedom of choice in 9 10 dresswear. And while we agree that they should have freedom of choice, I wanted to caution them 11 12 that each time they made an activity a crime, 13 they were perhaps introducing another opportunity 14 for young men of color to go to prison.

And so while we think that this is a disgusting public display, we think that education and teaching and nurturing of our young people is more important, because it tells them that they have a career other than prison to which they can look forward.

21 So I want to thank them for coming 22 today. I want to thank them for their politeness 23 and for their attendance and their alertness and 24 their good debates. And I think that the future 25 of the Legislature is still in good hands.

Thank you, Mr. President. 1 Thank 2 you, students. 3 (Applause.) 4 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Thank 5 you. On behalf of Senator Hassell-Thompson, we welcome you students here from Graham Elementary 6 7 and Longfellow Elementary, and please enjoy your day in the Capitol. 8 9 Senator Marcellino. 10 SENATOR MARCELLINO: Yes, Mr. President. I believe we have a handup which 11 12 we'd like accepted by the desk, filed with the Journal. 13 14 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: To be 15 filed in the Journal. 16 Senator Marcellino. SENATOR MARCELLINO: Just so the 17 18 members know the schedule, immediately after the 19 Finance Committee meeting in 332 we will be 20 calling the Investigations Committee, the same room. After Investigations, which should go 21 22 quickly, the Health Committee in Room 332. And then the Veterans Committee in Room 332 after the 23 Health Committee. Followed by Crimes and 24 25 Corrections in 123, Transportation in 124.

1 All within the Capitol, and we'll 2 call them in sequence as soon as Finance is 3 finished. 4 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: Thank 5 you, Senator Marcellino. Members, please be advised that 6 7 there will be a meeting of the Investigations 8 Committee immediately after the Finance Committee 9 in Room 332, followed by Health Committee, then 10 Veterans. And then the Crime Victims Committee followed by Transportation. All in Room 332? 11 12 SENATOR MARCELLINO: No. Crime and Corrections will be in 123 of the Capitol, and 13 Transportation will be in Room 124 of the 14 15 Capitol. 16 All of these meetings are being held in consultation and acceptance with the minority. 17 18 Mr. President, is there any further business at the desk? 19 20 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: There is 21 no further business at the desk, no. 22 SENATOR MARCELLINO: Mr. President, if we could stand at ease for a few moments until 23 the next committee meeting is called. 24 25 ACTING PRESIDENT O'MARA: The
