DeFrancisco recorded in the negative. 2 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 3 The 4 bill is passed. 5 Senator LaValle, that completes the reading of the noncontroversial calendar. б 7 SENATOR LaVALLE: Mr. President, with unanimous consent I'd like to recognize 8 Senator Espaillat for a brief announcement. 9 10 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Without objection, Senator Espaillat, you are 11 12 recognized. SENATOR ESPAILLAT: 13 Thank you, 14 Mr. President. 15 Thank you for allowing me to introduce a group that has been coming to the 16 New York State Legislature since February of 17 18 1997. They are the Instituto Duartiano. They celebrate the anniversary of the birth of Juan 19 20 Pablo Duarte, the founding father of the Dominican Republic, who was born the 26th of 21 January of 1813. 22 There's a big delegation this 23 year, headed by the president of the institute, 24 25 Mr. Juan Elliott, and representatives from the

Dominican Republic Consul General's office. 1 2 The consul general, Mr. Maximo Corcino, could not be here today, but he sent Isabel Padilla, 3 4 who's head of the delegation, along with 5 Cecilia Baez, who are both in the balcony. And they're celebrating, they're 6 7 kicking off Juan Pablo Duarte week, and it has 8 been a tradition of this group to visit both the Assembly and the Senate and visit the 9 10 proceedings. So I thank you, Mr. President, for allowing me to introduce them and to make 11 sure that the entire Senate understands what 12 they're about. They're about the legacy of 13 Juan Pablo Duarte, particularly for young 14 15 children, teaching them who he was. And they're doing a fantastic job. 16 So thank you for allowing them to 17 18 visit the Senate chambers. 19 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 20 Senator Rivera. 21 SENATOR RIVERA: Thank you, Mr. President. 22 I also stand to welcome our guests 23 today to the Senate chamber. And there's a 24 25 couple of reasons why I do that. And the most

1	important one is because I represent about
2	100,000 Dominicans in my district. Many of
3	them have actually crossed over from Washington
4	Heights Quisqueya Heights, if you will
5	where many have lived for generations.
6	And I increasingly find that
7	there's many of these folks that are in my back
8	yard. They are my allies locally. In here in
9	the Senate I obviously have two colleagues,
10	Adriano Espaillat and Jose Peralta, which are
11	both Dominican. And I would be remiss if I did
12	not mention my colleague in the Assembly,
13	Nelson Castro, who crosses over with me in the
14	district.
15	This is a community that is a rich
16	community. It is a community that is rich with
17	culture. They are a zesty community. They
18	enjoy participating in politics; to them, it is
19	a full-contact sport. And I enjoy having them
20	as my colleagues here in the Senate, colleagues
21	in the Assembly, but most importantly as people
22	that I represent in my district.
23	Thank you again for coming today.
24	Bienvenidos a senado {in Spanish}. And I hope
25	that all of my colleagues take some time to

also welcome them as well. 1 2 Thank you, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 3 I will 4 continue to acknowledge speakers without 5 objection. Senator Perkins. 6 7 SENATOR PERKINS: Bienvenidos. Ι am a Senator of the Dominican community {in 8 Spanish }. Entiende? Gracias. 9 10 It's a great pleasure that I have to serve as a Senator that represents part of 11 12 the Dominican community. As a community I've 13 had the privilege of working with them for 14 many, many years. 15 Long before he was a great state Senator, I remember working with Senator 16 Espaillat when he actually was a candidate for 17 18 a very local position as a member of the 19 community school board. It was a very historic 20 period because then, in our recognition of the 21 value of immigrants and the value of parents, we allowed them to vote in school board 22 elections. And he was a great organizer of the 23 24 Dominican community in Manhattan to get them 25 out to participate in the electoral process.

And now they have become a political giant, not 1 2 only in Manhattan but in the whole City of New 3 York. 4 And so I want to thank you for the 5 privilege of being here with you and the opportunity to work with your brother from the 6 7 Dominican Republic. Welcome. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 8 Senator 9 Diaz. 10 SENATOR DIAZ: Thank you, Mr. President. 11 12 Ladies and gentlemen, as you know, every country has their heroes and heroines, 13 14 and most of them have specific days in which to 15 honor their heroes. For example, Africa honors Nelson Mandela, America honors George 16 Washington, Abraham Lincoln, Martin Luther 17 18 King, and many others. Puerto Rico honors Don 19 Luis Munoz Marin and Don Pedro Albizu Campus, 20 among others. The Dominican Republic honors the 21 22 birth of Juan Pablo Duarte y Diez, born on July 26, 1813, and who died on July 15, 1876. 23 In his 63 years of life, Juan Pablo Duarte y 24 25 Diez left a legacy of pride, courage, and honor

for all Dominicans to celebrate.

2 Together with Don Francisco del Rosario and Ramon Matias Mella, Juan Pablo 3 Duarte y Diez was a visionary who is widely 4 5 considered as the architect of the Dominican Republic and its independence from Haiti in 6 7 1844. 8 That is why, Mr. President and 9 ladies and gentlemen, today I'm proud to honor 10 my colleague and friend, my brother Adriano Espaillat, in congratulating the people of the 11 Dominican Republic on this occasion and 12 supporting this wonderful resolution declaring 13 14 January 23rd Juan Pablo Duarte Day in the State 15 of New York. 16 To Mr. Juan Elliott, president of the Instituto Duartiano, and the delegation 17 18 from New York City that are here visiting us 19 today, congratulations and thank you all for 20 honoring us with your presence. 21 And to you {singing}: "Quisqueyanos valiantes, alcemos, 22 Nuestro canto con viva emoción." 23 Hey -- {in Spanish}. Muchos gracias. 24 25 (Applause.)

1 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: A new 2 vocalist. 3 Is there any other Senator that wishes to be heard? 4 5 (No response.) ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: We want б 7 to welcome our guests and thank you for being 8 with us today. 9 (Standing ovation.)
