ACTING PRESIDENT ROBACH: Opposed, 14 15 nay. 16 (No response.) 17 ACTING PRESIDENT ROBACH: 18 Mr. Donald T. DeCarlo Southold is now confirmed as Commissioner of the State Insurance Fund. 19 20 Reports of select committees. 21 Communications and reports from state officers. 22 Motions and resolutions. 23 Senator Libous. 24 25 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President,

I'm going to read one motion that I have. 1 I move 2 that the following bills be discharged from their respective committees and be recommitted with 3 4 instructions to strike the enacting clause: 5 2637, 4278, and 4279, by Senator Owen Johnson. ACTING PRESIDENT ROBACH: 6 So 7 ordered, Senator Libous. 8 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, at 9 this time I would ask for unanimous consent to 10 have Senator Maziarz address the body. ACTING PRESIDENT ROBACH: 11 Senator 12 Maziarz. 13 SENATOR MAZIARZ: Thank you very much, Mr. President and my colleagues. 14 It's 15 truly an honor for me today to be here and to be representing my constituency, particularly the 16 County of Niagara. 17 18 I have two guests with me here today, Mr. President. I have Deputy Sheriff 19 20 Jonathan Andres and Deputy Sheriff Shawn Grapes. Deputy Andres and Deputy Grapes were recently 21 22 honored as the Deputies of the Year by the New York State Sheriffs Association. 23 On the early morning hours of 24 25 July 18, 2011, one of their colleagues, Niagara

County Deputy Sheriff Allen Gerhardt, was in his 1 patrol vehicle and was pursuing a fleeing 2 criminal suspect. Deputy Gerhardt unfortunately 3 lost control of that vehicle. He slid into a 4 5 guardrail. The guardrail penetrated his vehicle, going completely through the vehicle. 6 And 7 unfortunately that guardrail severed both of Deputy Gerhardt's legs. 8 9 As Deputy Gerhardt lay there 10 bleeding, Deputy Jonathan Andres came upon the scene, followed by Deputy Shawn Grapes. Both of 11 them took off their belts and applied tourniquets 12 to both of the severed limbs of Deputy Gerhardt 13 and assisted in getting Deputy Gerhardt immediate 14 15 medical attention, which, in the eyes of the -in the opinion of the doctors at Erie County 16 Medical Center, saved Deputy Gerhardt's life. 17 18 Today Deputy Gerhardt is learning to walk again on his artificial legs. 19 He's 20 alive, though, and he's home with his young children because of the heroic actions of Deputy 21 22 Andres and Deputy Grapes. 23 It was a well-deserved honor, well-deserved recognition. What they did on that 24 25 dark night on that very rural, remote highway in

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Niagara County was just beyond the praise of all 1 of us here. They did their job, did their duty, 2 and saved Allen Gerhardt's life and were 3 justifiably recognized by their colleagues from 4 5 across the State of New York. So, colleagues, my colleagues here, 6 7 ladies and gentlemen, I want to introduce you to Deputy Sheriff Jonathan Andres -- Jonathan, you 8 want to stand up? -- and also the second Deputy 9 10 of the Year, Deputy Sheriff Shawn Grapes. Shawn? 11 Congratulations, gentlemen, and 12 thank you for the great work that you do. 13 (Standing ovation.) 14 15 SENATOR MAZIARZ: Thank you, Mr. President. 16 ACTING PRESIDENT ROBACH: 17 Senator 18 Gallivan. 19 SENATOR GALLIVAN: Thank you, 20 Mr. President. 21 And thank you, Senator Maziarz, for 22 bringing our Deputies of the Year to Albany and introducing them and their accomplishments in 23 front of everybody. 24 25 And most importantly, let me thank

Deputy Andres, Deputy Grapes for what you do. 1 Ιt is an incredible honor to serve others in the 2 capacity of a law enforcement officer. Many of 3 4 you know that, as my background, I also served as 5 a member of the State Sheriffs Association Executive Committee and know, in consideration of 6 7 this particular award on an annual basis, how much competition there is. 8 9 So it really is, amongst the 10 thousands of acts of law enforcement officers across New York State, amongst the thousands of 11 heroic efforts, people putting their lives on the 12 line on a daily basis to protect our community 13 and to stand between the potential chaos and the 14 15 order that is so important to all of us, it is incredible that you're singled out. And it 16 really is well-deserved. 17 18 So very simply, I would like to thank you for your service, commend you for your 19 20 actions and, even beyond what you did in this single instance, what you do on a daily basis to 21 22 protect Niagara County and what you and your fellow law enforcement brothers and sisters do 23 across the state to protect all of us. 24 25 Thank you. And thank you,

This legislation comes before us with the input from the Governor's office, the Senate and 16 the Assembly. It is one of the most far-reaching 17 18 pieces of legislation to have oversight on a public authority. 19 It will provide for an independent 20 audit of both the operations and management of 21 22 the Long Island Power Authority and look at every aspect of the business that they do, and also 23 provide a vehicle for the consumer or the 24 25 ratepayer, if they have any problems with the

1 authority. I would like to thank at this time 2 3 one of our colleagues, Senator Fuschillo, who encouraged me for a number of years to stay the 4 5 course and pursue this so that the ratepayers on Long Island would have transparency and a process 6 7 that would affect in a positive way not only the 8 operation but hopefully the rates that our 9 ratepayers pay. 10 I vote yes.
