1 PROCEEDINGS 2 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 3 The Senate will come to order. 4 I ask all present to rise and 5 join with me in the Pledge of Allegiance to our Flag. 6 7 (Whereupon, the assemblage 8 recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.) 9 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: In 10 the absence of clergy, may we bow our heads for a moment of silence. 11 (Whereupon, the assemblage 12 respected a moment of silence.) 13 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 14 15 The reading of the Journal. In Senate, 16 THE SECRETARY: Wednesday, March 21st, the Senate met pursuant 17 18 to adjournment. The Journal of Tuesday, March 20th, was read and approved. On motion, 19 20 Senate adjourned. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 22 Without objection, the Journal stands approved 23 as read. Presentation of petitions. 24 25 Messages from the Assembly.

1 Messages from the Governor. 2 Reports of standing committees. 3 Reports of select committees. 4 Communications and reports from state officers. 5 Motions and resolutions. 6 7 Senator Libous. 8 SENATOR LIBOUS: That was pretty 9 quick, Mr. President. 10 At this time could we go to the reading of the noncontroversial calendar. 11 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 12 The Secretary will read the noncontroversial 13 reading of the calendar. 14 15 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, 16 there's a lot of noise in the chamber. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Τf 18 we could take conversations out into the hallway, please, out into the lobby. 19 20 The Secretary will read. 21 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 22 100, by Senator Seward, Senate Print 1685, an act to amend the Penal Law. 23 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 24 25 Read the last section.

1 THE SECRETARY: Section 3. This 2 act shall take effect on the first of November. 3 4 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Call the roll. 5 (The Secretary called the roll.) 6 7 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 8 Senator Seward. 9 SENATOR SEWARD: Yes, thank you, 10 Mr. President, just briefly to explain my 11 vote. 12 This legislation before us creates the new crime of staging a motor 13 vehicle accident, which would be punishable as 14 15 a felony offense. 16 This is the first bill of several on our agenda today that deals with the 17 18 problem of combating insurance fraud and also at the same time promoting highway safety. 19 20 Now, staging an accident is 21 defined under this bill as intentionally 22 causing a collision for the purpose --23 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Excuse me, Senator. I apologize. 24 25 Ladies and gentlemen, can we

please take the conversations out of the 1 2 chambers. Thank you. The bill before 3 SENATOR SEWARD: 4 us defines staging an accident as intentionally 5 causing a collision for the purpose of committing insurance fraud by inappropriately and illegally 6 7 collecting no-fault benefits. 8 You know, when an accident is 9 staged, it risks the participants' own safety, 10 their victim's safety as well as the entire 11 public. And this bill is referred to as 12 Alice's Law. And it's named after a 71-year-old 13 grandmother, Alice Ross, from Queens, who was 14 15 killed as a result of a staged accident. In fact, today is the ninth anniversary of that 16 accident and the death of Alice Ross. 17 18 Here was a grandmother, a woman driving down the street minding her own business, 19 20 on her way to her daughter's house, intentionally struck from behind by a vehicle carrying three 21 22 men out searching for an unsuspecting victim. The impact forced Mrs. Ross off the highway into 23 a tree and of course caused her death. 24 25 And after the accident, we had

1 these three perpetrators taken to one of these so-called medical centers where they feigned an 2 assortment of injuries and illegally collected 3 4 benefits. Luckily, they were ultimately 5 prosecuted. But this bill, by putting in the 6 7 law the specific offense, will help our efforts 8 to fight fraud and reduce insurance premiums and also make our highways safer. 9 10 Mr. President, I vote aye. ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 11 12 Thank you, Senator Seward. You will be recorded in the affirmative. 13 Announce the results, please. 14 15 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 54. Nays, 1. Senator Duane recorded in the negative. 16 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 17 The 18 bill is passed. THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 19 20 111, by Senator Addabbo, Senate Print 1271A, an act to amend the Vehicle and Traffic Law. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 22 Read the last section, please. 23 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This 24 act shall take effect immediately. 25

1 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Call 2 the roll. 3 (The Secretary called the roll.) 4 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 5 Senator Addabbo to explain his vote. SENATOR ADDABBO: 6 Thank you, 7 Mr. President. 8 This bill is meant to send a clear message to those who even think about driving 9 10 without a license or with a revoked license, and that is to stop and face the consequences, which 11 could be an increased amount of fines monetarily 12 or even up to four years in jail. 13 Unfortunately, we have all seen and 14 15 heard of accidents and incidents that have 16 included fatalities caused by somebody driving without a proper license. Locally, many of my 17 18 constituents have complained about this issue in our local streets. 19 20 So in an effort to make the streets safer, and the reason why I introduced this bill 21 22 based on constituent complaints, again, we are looking to increase the penalties here and 23 increase the amount of jail time. 24 25 I want to thank staff for their

help on this bill, and I will be voting yes on 1 the bill. 2 Thank you, Mr. President. 3 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 4 You 5 will be recorded in the affirmative, Senator. Announce the results, please. 6 7 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 55. 8 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: The 9 bill is passed. 10 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 11 155, by Senator Klein, Senate Print 1042, an act to amend the Penal Law. 12 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 13 Read the last section, please. 14 15 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This 16 act shall take effect on the 90th day. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: Call 18 the roll. (The Secretary called the roll.) 19 20 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 21 Senator Klein to explain his vote. 22 SENATOR KLEIN: Thank you, Mr. President. 23 Unfortunately, in communities 24 25 around the state the crime of car theft is a

still a growing problem. This legislation would 1 2 expand the list of predicate crimes for the charge of unauthorized use of a motor vehicle in 3 4 the second degree by including crimes like grand 5 larceny, motor vehicle criminal possession. Right now someone cannot be 6 7 convicted of unauthorized use of a motor vehicle 8 in the second degree if they commit those other 9 crimes within a 10-year period. Clearly these 10 crimes are just as serious as the original crime. 11 12 So I think this legislation is going to go a long way towards being able to 13 enhance the penalties by including these other 14 15 crimes. 16 I vote yes, Mr. President. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT MARCELLINO: 18 Thank you, Senator. You will be accounted for in the affirmative. 19 20 Please announce the results. 21 THE SECRETARY: In relation to 22 Calendar Number 155, those recorded in the 23 negative are Senators Hassell-Thompson, Montgomery and Perkins. 24 25 Ayes, 52.
