2 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The  
3 Senate will come to order.

4 I ask all present to please rise  
5 and join with me as we recite the Pledge of  
6 Allegiance to our Flag.

7 (Whereupon, the assemblage  
8 recited the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.)

9 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:  
10 Today's invocation will be offered by the  
11 Reverend Peter G. Young, of the Mother Teresa  
12 Community here in Albany.

13 Father Young.

14 REVEREND YOUNG: Thank you,  
15 Senator.

16 Let us pray.

17 Dear God, we thank You for this  
18 beautiful May day. And we thank You too  
19 because You have given us a marvelous example  
20 of charity in the call to us to love one  
21 another.

22 Send down your blessing on these  
23 Senators who generously devote themselves to  
24 helping our New York State citizens.

25 O God, You are the builder of all

1 things, and You have placed on us the  
2 obligation of toil. Grant that the work we  
3 begin may serve to better our lives in  
4 New York State and, through Your goodness,  
5 contribute to the spread of the call to be  
6 Your people.

8 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Thank  
9 you, Father.

10 Reading of the Journal.

22 THE SECRETARY: On page 31,

3 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:  
4 Substitution so ordered.

12 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President,  
13 would you please call on Senator Carlucci.

14 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator  
15 Carlucci.

16 SENATOR CARLUCCI: Mr. President,  
17 on behalf of Senator Klein, I move that the  
18 following bills be discharged from their  
19 respective committees and be recommitted with  
20 instructions to strike the enacting clause:  
21 Senate Numbers 535, 695, and 6184.

22 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: So  
23 ordered.

24 Senator Libous.

25 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, on

1   behalf of Senator Maziarz, I move that the  
2   following bill be discharged from its respective

5                   ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:    So  
6   ordered.

7                   Senator Libous.

8                   SENATOR LIBOUS:    Mr. President, on  
9   behalf of Senator Johnson, on page 20 I offer the  
10   following amendments to Calendar Number 355,  
11   Senate Print Number 3262B, and ask that said bill  
12   retain its place on the Third Reading Calendar.

13                  ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:    The  
14   amendments are received, and the bill shall  
15   retain its place on third reading.

16                  Senator Libous.

17                  SENATOR LIBOUS:    Mr. President, on  
18   behalf of Senator Golden, on page 15 I offer the  
19   following amendments to Calendar Number 129,

22                  ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:    The

25                  Senator Libous.

1                   SENATOR LIBOUS:    On page 21,  
2 Mr. President, on behalf of Senator Zeldin I  
3 offer the following amendments to Calendar  
4 Number 358, Senate Print Number 5634D, and ask  
5 that said bill retain its place on the  
6 Third Reading Calendar.

7                   ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:    The  
8 amendments are received, and the bill shall  
9 retain its place on third reading.

10                  Senator Libous.

11                  SENATOR LIBOUS:    And,  
12 Mr. President, on behalf of Senator Robach, on  
13 page 30 I offer the following amendments to  
14 Calendar Number 571, Senate Print 486A, and ask  
15 that said bill retain its place on the Third  
16 Reading Calendar.

17                  ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:    The  
18 amendments are received, and the bill shall  
19 retain its place on third reading.

20                  Senator Libous.

21                  SENATOR LIBOUS:    Mr. President, I  
22 believe there's a resolution at the desk by  
23 Senator Sampson, Number 4416. Could you have the  
24 title read and move for its immediate adoption.

25                  ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:    The

1 Secretary will read.

2 THE SECRETARY: Legislative  
3 Resolution Number 4416, by Senator Sampson,  
4 mourning the death of Gregory Jackson,  
5 distinguished Brownsville citizen and devoted  
6 member of the Brooklyn community.

7 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: All in  
8 favor of the resolution signify by saying aye.

9 (Response of "Aye.")

10 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:

11 Opposed?

12 (No response.)

13 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The  
14 resolution is adopted.

15 Senator Libous.

16 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President,  
17 could we have the reading of the noncontroversial  
18 calendar, please.

19 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The  
20 Secretary will read.

21 SENATOR BRESLIN: Point of order.

22 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator  
23 Breslin, what is your point of order?

24 SENATOR BRESLIN: Mr. President, I  
25 rise for a point of order.

1                   I have a privileged resolution at  
2 the desk that the Secretary failed to read, and I  
3 would request that it be read.

4                   ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:     Senator  
5 Breslin, we are not on motions and resolutions at  
6 this point in time. We've been called for the  
7 reading of the noncontroversial calendar.

8                   So we would later ask if we want to  
9 presently return to motions and resolutions, with  
10 consent.

11                  SENATOR BRESLIN:     Mr. President, I  
12 believe I was up, standing, waiting to be called  
13 upon.

14                  ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:     Senator  
15 Breslin, with all due respect, Senator Libous --  
16 I was looking out before the audience --

17                  SENATOR LIBOUS:     Mr. President.  
18 Mr. President, that might have been my fault.

19                  I believe that if Senator Breslin  
20 would like to return to motions and resolutions,  
21 I'd be happy to do that at this time.

22                  ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:     Without  
23 objection, we shall return to motions and  
24 resolutions.

25                  Senator Breslin.



1                   SENATOR BRESLIN:    I believe that  
2   there's two privileged resolutions at the desk.  
3   I ask that the reading be waived and I be heard  
4   on the resolutions.

5                   ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:    Senator  
6   Breslin, we've looked at the resolutions before.  
7   And in order for these resolutions to be deemed  
8   privileged and to be brought before the body,  
9   they would need the consent of the Temporary  
10   President.

11                   Has that been obtained?

12                   SENATOR BRESLIN:    Could you repeat  
13   that, please?

14                   SENATOR LIBOUS:    Mr. President --  
15   Mr. President, could you get some order in the  
16   chamber?  There are a lot of conversations going  
17   on.  Staff members should leave the chamber.  
18   Members should take their seats.

19                   I believe that Senator Breslin has  
20   the floor, and it's difficult for me, who is  
21   right next to Senator Breslin, to even hear him  
22   with all of the chatter that goes on in the  
23   chamber.  The chamber is a place where members  
24   are allowed to speak if called on by the chair.  
25   Nobody else should be speaking at that time.

1 Thank you, Mr. President.

2 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Thank  
3 you, Senator Libous.

4 Thank you, Senator Breslin.

5 I appreciate the order in the  
6 chamber.

7 Senator Breslin, upon review of  
8 your point, we deem that the resolutions are not  
9 considered privileged because they must receive  
10 the consent of the Temporary President in order  
11 to be brought before the house as a privileged  
12 resolution. So they are not in order.

13 SENATOR BRESLIN: I would appeal  
14 the ruling of the chair.

15 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Okay,  
16 there's a request for an appeal of the ruling of  
17 the chair. All those --

18 SENATOR BRESLIN: I request to be  
19 heard on the appeal.

20 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: You  
21 may be heard, Senator Breslin.

22 SENATOR BRESLIN: Mr. President,  
23 the resolutions I'm offering today establish  
24 plans setting forth an itemized list of grantees  
25 for certain school districts across the state.

1           The proposed allocations of school  
2 district money, commonly referred to as bullet  
3 aid, conform fully to the provisions of  
4 Senate Rule 9, Section 11, relating to conference  
5 allocations for community projects and local  
6 assistance.

7           The first resolution would allocate  
8 the remaining \$5 million for bullet aid for the  
9 years 2011 and 2012 that was mysteriously absent  
10 from the resolution this house passed just last  
11 week.

12           The second would allocate the full  
13 \$20 million for fiscal year 2012-2013 in an  
14 equitable manner to all Senators' districts,  
15 regardless of party, pursuant to State Senate  
16 rules and the formula for school aid  
17 distribution.

18           Pursuant to the Deputy Majority  
19 Leader's declaration and the urgency of the  
20 proposed and much-needed aid to school districts  
21 throughout the state, I insist that the  
22 resolution be read and considered for adoption.

23           Thank you, Mr. President.

24           ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO:    Thank  
25 you, Senator Breslin.

1                   The question is on overruling the  
2 ruling of the chair. All those in favor signify  
3 by saying aye.

4                   (Response of "Aye.")

5                   SENATOR BRESLIN: We request a  
6 show of hands, Mr. President.

7                   ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: A show  
8 of hands has been requested and so designated.

9                   (Senators raised their hands.)

10                  ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Announce  
11 the results.

12                  THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 23.

13                  ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The  
14 ruling of the chair stands.

15                  Senator Libous.

16                  SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President,  
17 could we have the reading of the noncontroversial  
18 calendar at this time.

19                  ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The  
20 Secretary will read the noncontroversial  
21 calendar.

22                  THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number  
23 322, by Senator Ranzenhofer, Senate Print 3220,  
24 an act to amend the Correction Law.

25                  ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Read the

1 last section.

2 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This  
3 act shall take effect on the first of November.

4 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Call the  
5 roll.

6 (The Secretary called the roll.)

7 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator  
8 Rivera to explain his vote.

9 SENATOR RIVERA: Thank you,  
10 Mr. President, to explain my vote.

11 This is a bill much like ones that  
12 we've voted on in weeks past and sessions past  
13 that deals with sex offenders but yet does not  
14 make the distinction by levels.

15 There is another bill on the agenda  
16 today that does something different; however, it  
17 has the same problem.

18 As I've stated many times on the  
19 floor, I certainly believe that it is our  
20 responsibility to secure citizens from  
21 predators. But when we establish rules -- bills  
22 like this, when we try to establish laws of this  
23 kind which are so broad and do not have the  
24 distinctions that are already established in law,  
25 when someone is a sex offender and has served

1 their time, then we create a law that is too  
2 broad and that certainly I believe has more of a  
3 punitive effect.

4 Which, again, as I've stated, can  
5 certainly be warranted for certain people that  
6 are considered sex offenders, but certainly not  
7 Level 1's.

8 Since this does not have that  
9 distinction, I'll be voting in the negative.

10 Thank you, Mr. President.

11 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator  
12 Rivera to be recorded in the negative.

13 Announce the results.

14 THE SECRETARY: In relation to  
15 Calendar Number 322, those recorded in the  
16 negative are Senators Hassell-Thompson, Krueger,

21                  SENATOR RIVERA:    Thank you,  
22 Mr. President.

23                  This is the second bill that we're  
24 going to deal with today that deals with sex  
25 offenders.

1                   This one in particular, what it  
2 would do is it would eliminate, for all intents  
3 and purposes, the levels that I was just speaking  
4 about. To me, this is probably -- this is  
5 extremely egregious because it does not make the  
6 distinction between someone that is a predator  
7 and someone who is not.

8                   It would make a person a sex  
9 offender, regardless of the level, actually  
10 regardless of the offense. There would be no  
11 levels anymore. So this person, anybody who was  
12 convicted of a sex offense, would have to  
13 register for the rest of their lives.

14                  Now, while I think that certainly  
15 predators that are Level 3's currently need to  
16 have this -- we need to make sure that we know  
17 where they are, we certainly should restrict  
18 where they work or where they can go -- when  
19 we're talking about a Level 1 sex offender, that  
20 distinction -- there is a reason why that  
21 distinction exists.

22                  This law would again make it too  
23 broad a definition. I believe that we should be  
24 very careful about how we establish these levels  
25 on all the bills that deal with sex offenses. I



1 will be voting in the negative on this piece of  
2 legislation.

3 Thank you, Mr. President.

4 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator  
5 Rivera to be recorded in the negative.

6 Announce the results.
