    200 million prescriptions were written for
    painkillers, in a country with a population of
17

    300 million. In New York State, 22 million
    prescriptions were written, with a population of
19
    less than 19.5 million.

                 This is an issue that is really
    destroying families, destroying lives, and
22

    ravaging our state. We have a common-sense
    solution here. This problem is so widespread for
24

    a number of reasons. One of those is because of

    drug dealer behind some burnt-out building to

    we would do to stop that, to prevent that from

    basically says doctors should have information

1 these drugs. Pharmacists should have to report each time they dispense those drugs so that we 3 have a system that understands and appreciates whether or not the people who are getting these 5 drugs dispensed to are people that should be getting them. 6 7 This creates just such a system. Doctors must look, pharmacists must report -- and 8 I know I'm past my two minutes, so let me just 9 10 finish quickly -- nothing good comes without a lot of effort and a lot of partnership. 11 12 everyone here to vote in the affirmative so you can do precisely what you set out to do the day 13 you decided to run for the Senate. 14 15 We have a rare opportunity here. There are a lot of things we do in the Senate 16 that are important, perhaps some not so 17 18 important. I can't imagine anything more important than what we're doing here today, 19 because this will allow each and every one of us 20 to save lives. And that doesn't come about every 21 single day. 22 So let me thank all the people that 23 were involved here. First let me begin with my 24 25 leader, Dean Skelos, for providing leadership,

who said at the beginning of the session we're not going to leave here until this gets done.

Let me thank Governor Cuomo for traveling around the state, advancing the idea that we need to address this problem, and his staff, especially Jim Malatris.

This is a major victory for the people of New York State and for the families of this state that understand firsthand the devastation of prescription drug abuse. It's a health crisis that has had far-reaching and fatal consequences.

Over the months we've been fighting for action on prescription drug abuse, we've met so many New York families that have lost sons and daughters, brothers and sisters to this growing epidemic. Each death has been a tragedy and, sadly, devastating tragedies like this have been happening across New York State every single day.

The families who have channeled their grief into action fueled this movement to combat prescription drug abuse. Without their courage and relentless advocacy, we would not be passing this important legislation today. Their successful lobbying efforts demonstrate the public's power to initiate reform when we stand together to promote positive change.

1 And change is what was desperately 2 In 2007 there were 27,000 unintentional drug overdoses. Since then, this problem has 3 4 grown progressively worse. One person dies every 5 19 minutes as a result of prescription drug abuse across this nation every single day. 6 7 This comprehensive legislation is 8 the right solution to curb the skyrocketing number of overdoses, suicides, and crimes 9 10 connected to prescription drug abuse. When Avi and Julie Israel -- who 11 lost their son, Michael David Israel -- came to 12 my office last year, they outlined how the system 13 had failed their family, how the system had 14 15 failed their deceased son. They shared their ideas of how things could be improved. 16 We put their ideas to work and 17 18 introduced the Michael David Israel laws. Many of these concepts are put forward in this 19 20 comprehensive legislation that we have before us 21 today. For the first time, pharmacists 22 will have access to the Controlled Substance 23 Registry, enabling them to help prevent drug 24

diversion and abuse. This electronic system will

also be an effective diagnosis tool for

   physicians. It will give them the information
    they need to help save lives.

When you look at the numbers, they're off the charts. 8 9 I mean, if you look at the amount 10 of people across the State of New York over the last several years abusing prescription drugs, we 11 have already rivaled the heroin epidemic of the 12 '70s and the crack epidemic of the '80s. 13 very, very clear that for an abuser, the drug of 14 15 choice are prescription drugs. A couple of years ago I noticed it 16 in my own Senate district, when we had these pill 17 18 mills, they have people show up as early as 7 o'clock in the morning with lines around the 19 20 block just to get into these places. 21 I think this is a very important 22 first step, as was said. And I was proud to

cohost two roundtables on this issue with

is very important. This is a step in the right
direction that will help curb the practice
of "doctor shopping" by having doctors look at
the prescription histories of patients, something
that wasn't necessarily required before.

I'm also supportive of the new

I'm also supportive of the new rules that will have the Department of Health analyze the data they have collected in order to spot possible patterns of abuse.

I also applaud the fact that the state will work to create its own drug take-back system. You have many nursing homes and other facilities that really want to get rid of these drugs instead of storing them at these facilities, which can very easily be taken by staff and outsiders.

So I think what we're doing here today is very important, and I think the I-STOP legislation I think is a very important first approach. And I'm glad we're finally doing it, because it sounds very simple, but I think the least that we can ask of doctors and pharmacists is that they play a role in tracking prescription drugs in our society.

concerns over the damage done to our planet have boosted green building into the spotlight of mainstream interest.
