Cuomo to 6 7 proclaim March 2013 as Irish American Heritage 8 Month in the State of New York. "WHEREAS, From America's earliest 9 10 days, Irish immigrants and their descendants have contributed leadership, wisdom, and vitality 11 12 to America, through nine signers of the Declaration of Independence and 22 Presidents 13 with Irish roots, as well as the indelible mark 14 15 Irish Americans have made in the shaping of the great State and City of New York, through 16 numerous governors, legislators, mayors and 17 18 public officials; and 19 "WHEREAS, Throughout their long 20 history, the Irish have been ardent in their 21 passion for liberty, hatred of oppression and 22 renowned for their loyalty. And thus the Irish have, from the beginning, been prominent in the 23 defense of this nation, with twenty of George 24 25 Washington's generals and an estimated quarter of

his army being composed of Irish Americans, among 1 2 them Timothy Murphy, a hero of the pivotal battle 3 of Saratoga, New York; and 4 "WHEREAS, Irish Americans have 5 distinguished themselves ever since whenever their country has called on them, as typified in 6 7 the storied 'Fighting 69th' of New York who fought with courage and sacrifice on the 8 battlefields of the American Civil War and 9 10 World War I and whose Gaelic battle cry of 'Faugh an Beallach' is still heard this day in Iraq and 11 12 Afghanistan in defense of our country; and "WHEREAS, The first Congressional 13 Medal of Honor for the current conflict in 14 15 Afghanistan was awarded to Navy Seal Lieutenant Michael P. Murphy of Smithtown, New York, who 16 made the supreme sacrifice for his country; and 17 18 "WHEREAS, Millions of Irish arrived in New York City in the mid-19th century, 19 20 escaping hunger and injustice in their homeland. New York has long been a haven for immigrants, 21 being the home of the 'golden door' of Ellis 22 Island, where the first immigrant to enter 23 through its passages to a new life in America was 24 25 15 year-old Annie Moore of Cork, Ireland; and

"WHEREAS, Irish immigrants and their 1 2 descendants have contributed to the building of this great society not only by the laying of 3 4 railroads and the building of physical bridges, 5 but also by building bridges of the mind amongst all people through the founding of numerous 6 7 schools, colleges and universities, enhancing the quality of every phase of life for all 8 New Yorkers; and 9 10 "WHEREAS, Irish American women have a long and proud tradition of being visionaries 11 and trailblazers, whether it be Annie Sullivan, 12 the teacher of Helen Keller, crusading journalist 13 Nelly Bly, or New York's own Colonel Eileen 14 15 Collins, the first woman to command a space shuttle; and 16 "WHEREAS, Since 1762, Irish 17 18 New Yorkers have been faithfully celebrating the 19 feast of St. Patrick every March 17th, wherein 20 they renew their connections to the land of their ancestry, pass on their traditions to the next 21 22 generation, and share their pride through joyous festivities enjoyed by all New Yorkers 23 irrespective of ethnicity; and 24 25 "WHEREAS, Irish Americans have made

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an indelible impression upon every human endeavor
