1 PROCEEDINGS 2 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: The 3 Senate will come to order. 4 I ask everyone present to please 5 rise and repeat with me the Pledge of Allegiance. 6 7 (Whereupon, the assemblage recited 8 the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.) 9 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: In the 10 absence of clergy, may please we bow our heads in a moment of silence. 11 12 (Whereupon, the assemblage respected a moment of silence.) 13 14 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Reading 15 of the Journal. 16 THE SECRETARY: In Senate, 17 Tuesday, March 12th, the Senate met pursuant to 18 adjournment. The Journal of Monday, March 11th, 19 was read and approved. On motion, Senate 20 adjourned. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Without objection, the Journal stands approved as read. 22 23 Presentation of petitions. 1 THE SECRETARY: On page 16, 2 Senator LaValle moves to discharge, from the Committee on Higher Education, Assembly Bill 3 Number 1049 and substitute it for the identical 4 5 Senate Bill Number 2897, Third Reading Calendar 171. 6 On page 16, Senator LaValle moves 7 8 to discharge, from the Committee on Higher 9 Education, Assembly Bill Number 1050 and 10 substitute it for the identical Senate Bill Number 2899, Third Reading Calendar 172. 11 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: 12 13 Substitutions ordered. Messages from the Governor. 14 15 Reports of standing committees. 16 Reports of select committees. 17 Communications and reports from 18 state officers. Motions and resolutions. 19 20 Senator Libous. 21 SENATOR LIBOUS: Thank you, Madam President. 22 At this time I believe that you 23 could recognize Senator Klein, and he would like 24 25 to address the body.

Thank 1 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: 2 you. 3 Senator Klein. 4 SENATOR KLEIN: Thank you, 5 Madam President. Thank you, Senator Libous. I want to take a moment to 6 7 recognize a very special guest we have with us 8 visiting us here in Albany and in our Senate chamber. I'm honored to have visiting Ms. Padma 9 10 Lakshmi, who's someone who I think everyone 11 knows her many accomplishments. Host of the 12 Emmy Award-winning show "Top Chef" on the Bravo TV Network, she's an accomplished actress, 13 model, food expert. 14 15 And she's here today for a very 16 special reason, to help us move forward with our teen health education initiative. And she's 17 18 someone who has done so much work on behalf of 19 young people throughout our state, throughout 20 our country. 21 And she's also the cofounder of the 22 Endometriosis Foundation of America. And she's 23 really putting her heart and soul in this organization, doing so much great work. 24 25 And I hope you will join me,

1 Madam President, in welcoming Padma today to the 2 Senate chamber. ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: 3 Thank 4 you, Senator Klein. 5 And welcome. It's really a pleasure and an honor to have you in our midst today. б 7 Everyone has enjoyed knowing of you and what you have done, and we appreciate it. So thank you 8 very much for joining us. 9 10 (Applause.) ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: 11 Senator Libous. 12 13 SENATOR LIBOUS: Thank you, Madam President. I believe there's a previously 14 15 adopted resolution by Senator Carlucci, 16 Number 582, at the desk. Could we please have the title read at this time. 17 18 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Thank 19 you. 20 The Secretary will read. 21 THE SECRETARY: Legislative 22 Resolution Number 582, by Senator Carlucci, 23 memorializing Governor Andrew M. Cuomo to proclaim September 2013 as Suicide Prevention 24 25 Month in New York State.

Senator 1 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: 2 Carlucci. 3 SENATOR CARLUCCI: Thank you, Madam President. 4 5 Today I rise to get a head start and proclaim September as Suicide Prevention Month in 6 7 the State of New York. 8 And today we've probably all been 9 visited by mental health advocates from across 10 the state that have really talked to us about the 11 importance of making sure that we don't run away 12 from the stigma, that we talk about this very important issue. 13 14 And in fact, it's troubling, the 15 statistics. Believe it or not, right now about 16 20 percent of our military personnel succumb to suicide -- 20 percent. Startlingly, the tenth 17 18 highest cause of death in the United States is 19 currently suicide. 20 The statistics are startling, and 21 there's something that we can do about it. And 22 we have to start by making sure that we don't 23 hide away from this stigma, that we don't hide away this emotion, this issue. And we make sure 24 25 that people that need help and want to talk about

1 it can. 2 And we are setting that example by 3 proclaiming September a month where we're going 4 to recognize the importance of what we can do to 5 prevent suicide in the State of New York. Thank you, Madam President. 6 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: 7 Thank 8 you, Senator Carlucci. 9 Senator LaValle. 10 SENATOR LaVALLE: Madam President, may we please have the noncontroversial reading 11 of the calendar. 12 13 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: The Secretary will read. 14 15 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 16 157, by Senator Marcellino, Senate Print 3047, an act to amend the Tax Law. 17 18 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Read the last section. 19 20 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This 21 act shall take effect immediately. 22 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Call the 23 roll. (The Secretary called the roll.) 24 25 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 55.

1 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: The bill 2 is passed. 3 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 158, by Senator Fuschillo, Senate Print 752, an 4 5 act to amend the Vehicle and Traffic Law. ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Read the 6 7 last section. 8 THE SECRETARY: Section 3. This 9 act shall take effect on the first of November. 10 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Call the roll. 11 12 (The Secretary called the roll.) 13 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Announce the results. 14 15 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 55. 16 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: The bill is passed. 17 18 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 160, by Senator Little, Senate Print 1356, an act 19 20 to amend the Vehicle and Traffic Law. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Read the 22 last section. 23 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This act shall take effect on the 180th day. 24 25 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Call the

roll. 1 2 (The Secretary called the roll.) 3 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Announce the results. 4 5 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 55. ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: The bill 6 7 is passed. 8 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 9 164, by Senator Libous, Senate Print 982, an act 10 to amend the Real Property Tax Law. 11 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Read the last section. 12 13 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Call the 16 roll. 17 (The Secretary called the roll.) 18 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Senator 19 Espaillat to explain his vote. 20 SENATOR ESPAILLAT: Yes, thank you, 21 Madam President. I would like to explain my 22 vote. 23 Every session this chamber takes on a numerous number of legislation to assist the 24 25 farm industry in our state which provides the

1 food that we bring to our table. In fact, many 2 neighborhoods in the City of New York benefit 3 from the green markets that receive on a regular 4 basis produce from these farms, from New York 5 State farms.

And while we do this, we neglect to 6 7 recognize that in these farms, there are many 8 farmworkers that continue to be exploited on a regular basis by many of these farms. They don't 9 10 get a day's rest. They don't get overtime. They don't have the right to collectively bargain. 11 They work under very adverse conditions. And yet 12 we haven't found it within us to address this 13 very serious issue that I think is -- I could 14 15 only characterize it as being one step away from 16 being indentured servants. 17 So I will be casting my vote in the 18 negative for this and other future bills that 19 will bring assistance to the farms until this 20 very serious travesty of justice is resolved. 21 Thank you, Madam President. I will 22 be voting in the negative.

ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Thank

Senator Espaillat will be recorded

2 Announce the results. 3 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 54. Nays, 4 1. Senator Espaillat recorded in the negative. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: The bill 6 is passed. 7 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 8 171, substituted earlier by Member of the 9 Assembly Glick, Assembly Print Number 1049, an 10 act to repeal subdivision 7 of Section 7908 of the Education Law. 11 12 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Read the last section. 13 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. 14 This 15 act shall take effect on the same date and in the same manner as Chapter 444 of the Laws of 2012. 16 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Call the 17 18 roll. (The Secretary called the roll.) 19 20 ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: Senator 21 Kennedy to explain his vote. 22 SENATOR KENNEDY: Thank you, Madam President. 23 First of all, I want to thank my 24 25 colleague Senator LaValle for carrying this

1	important bill regarding the profession of
2	occupational therapy in this house today. I'm
3	proud to support it.
4	As an occupational therapist, I'd
5	like to introduce a group of young occupational
6	therapy students, some of them from my alma
7	mater, D'Youville College, and others from all
8	across New York State, from Buffalo to New York
9	City and everywhere in between. They're learning
10	the process of Albany as they're studying to
11	become occupational therapy students, and they're
12	watching government in progress and really
13	learning the process of that.
14	These individuals are going to go
15	out into the world and help people. As I make
16	the correlation between our jobs as elected
17	officials and what will be their jobs as
18	healthcare professionals and occupational
19	therapists, the common denominator is that we are
20	out there helping people. They're studying the
21	skills to help people learn the job of living and
22	to live their lives with independence and
23	dignity.
24	And with that said, Madam President,
25	I would appreciate if we could extend the honor

of this house to those students today. 1 2 Thank you very much. ACTING PRESIDENT LITTLE: 3 Thank 4 you, Senator Kennedy. And welcome to all of the 5 occupational therapy students and therapists who б 7 are here, and assistant therapists. We appreciate your presence today, and continue your 8 good work.
