job. 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank 3 you, Senator DeFrancisco. 4 Senator Grisanti on the nomination. 5 SENATOR GRISANTI: Yes, thank you, Mr. President. б 7 Thirty-five years working in government, Tony Masiello. And he truly does 8 understand the business of Western New York. 9 The 10 bridge between Canada and Buffalo, vital commerce, economic and trade with our partner, 11 12 Southern Ontario, that bring goods back and forth not only in the State of New York but the entire 13 14 Southern Tier and the southern part of this 15 nation. 16 And there's issues going on right now with the bridge, a five-person board. 17 18 Actually, a 10-person board, five on the Canadian 19 side, five on the American side. One has 20 resigned just recently, leaving only four on the 21 American side. 22 So I urge all my colleagues here to unanimously support Tony Masiello to go onto this 23 bridge authority so you could have a five-on-five 24 25 as far as a voting bloc. He understands the

1 concepts, living in Western New York his entire 2 life, and what needs to be done with regards to 3 the Peace Bridge Authority and having a shared revenue in a shared fashion not only on the 4 5 Canadian side but also on the American side. 6 So I urge his support, and I second 7 the nomination. 8 Thank you, Mr. President. 9 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank 10 you, Senator Grisanti. Senator Maziarz on the nomination. 11 12 SENATOR MAZIARZ: Thank you very much, Mr. President. 13 14 We have Senator DeFrancisco and 15 Senator Grisanti supporting former Senator Masiello. Well, that's not diversity in my 16 17 book. From the Polish perspective, we support 18 Tony Masiello too. 19 This is a great appointment by the 20 Governor at a very critical moment in the history 21 of Western New York. We have waited for many 22 years for something to happen on our side of the Peace Bridge, this major gateway into the whole 23 northeastern corridor of the United States. 24 25 And as Senator Grisanti pointed out,

1 Tony Masiello has the right background, the 2 knowledge about the importance of this and the importance of getting our fair share of resources 3 4 from the Peace Bridge Authority. 5 They spent \$100 million on a beautiful new entranceway on the Canadian side. 6 7 And clearly a lot of the walls on the U.S. side, the barriers that had been put up before as far 8 as obtaining property, have come down recently. 9 10 And we have to take a large leap forward now on the U.S. side. And Governor Cuomo is right, 11 12 Tony Masiello is the individual to do it. So I second his nomination, 13 Mr. President. 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank you, Senator Maziarz. 16 Senator Gallivan on the nomination. 17 18 SENATOR GALLIVAN: Thank you, Mr. President. 19 20 I too rise in support of the 21 nomination of Tony Masiello as a member of the 22 Buffalo/Fort Erie Public Peace Bridge Authority. Many of you have experience in 23 working with Tony in this chamber and in Buffalo 24 25 in his capacity as mayor. I too, back in my days

as sheriff, had a long-standing relationship with 1 2 Tony. And he's just truly an outstanding public 3 servant. 4 As Senator Maziarz mentioned, this 5 is a critical time. We've been waiting for years and years and years to try to move something 6 7 forward that can help to contribute to Western New York and New York State's economy, 8 and the Peace Bridge is vital to that. 9 10 And with the recent issues that they've had there, I can't think of a better 11 12 person that grew up in the shadows, lives in the shadows of the Peace Bridge and has the 13 14 relationships with the people to help advance our 15 interests. So I will vote aye on this, 16 Mr. President, and I thank Tony for serving 17 18 again. 19 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank 20 you, Senator Gallivan. Senator Nozzolio on the nomination. 21 22 SENATOR NOZZOLIO: Thank you, Mr. President. 23 Mr. President and my colleagues, all 24 25 I know is that when Tony Masiello served in the

1 Senate, the Bills were in the Super Bowl. And 2 Gallivan, Grisanti, Kennedy have not stood to that task as following in the legacy of 3 4 Senator Masiello. 5 (Laughter.) б SENATOR NOZZOLIO: But a great 7 appointment, Mr. President. As my colleagues 8 have well stated, it's an important job, and I couldn't think of anyone more qualified for this 9 10 position than the nominee, Anthony "Tony" 11 Masiello. We call him Senator, we call him 12 Mayor. He's a public servant through and 13 through. And we believe certainly this will be a 14 15 very, very important role in the next step as he moves forward in this position. I only hope that 16 he can counsel Senators Kennedy, Gallivan and 17 18 Grisanti on how to get those Bills, the Buffalo Bills, back in the Super Bowl. 19 20 Thank you, Mr. President. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Thank you, Senator Nozzolio. 22 23 Senator Ranzenhofer on the nomination. 24 25 SENATOR RANZENHOFER: Thank you,

1 Mr. President.

16	again, his seasoned approach in the Senate and as
17	mayor will certainly be very good for the
18	Peace Bridge Authority, it will be very good for
19	the United States. And I'm very glad to join in
20	the recommendation and seconding of Mr. Masiello
21	for this position.

1 SENATOR KENNEDY: Thank you very much, Mr. President. 2 3 It is with great pride and 4 tremendous privilege that I stand here to second 5 the nomination of Tony Masiello to the Peace Bridge Authority. Just an incredible man -- a 6 7 statesman, a gentleman, a diplomat, somebody that has the right demeanor to get to the Peace Bridge 8 9 Authority at the right time to, pun intended, 10 create a bridge between the nations, the United States and Canada. 11 Over the course of his tremendous 12 career, he has gone out of his way to help 13 people. He's a civic-minded individual that 14 15 cares deeply about the City of Buffalo, about Western New York, about New York State. And no 16 17 one can argue against that. 18 Between being the mayor of Buffalo, a New York State Senator, a councilman, a 19 20 basketball star on the courts at Canisius College, Tony Masiello has what it takes to lead 21 22 our community of New York State, our community in Western New York, and really our nation on the 23 Peace Bridge Authority. 24 25 It is a tremendous honor to be able

1 to stand on this floor to vote for him today. I 2 congratulate the Governor on a very, very good 3 nomination. 4 I also want to make a very important 5 announcement that with former Mayor Masiello's leadership, the Buffalo Bills will be winning the 6 7 Super Bowl this upcoming season with a new GM, a 8 new coach, a new quarterback, and now a new appointee to the Peace Bridge Authority. 9 10 So thanks for pointing that out, and I'm happy that we in Buffalo can once again 11 12 deliver for the people of New York State. 13 Thank you. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 14 Thank 15 you, Senator Kennedy. 16 The question is on the nomination of Anthony M. Masiello as a member of the Buffalo 17 18 and Fort Erie Public Bridge Authority. In the last eight years, there's been 16 almost 3,000 fatalities, and in the last nine years, about 65,000 alcohol-related injuries in 17 18 the State of New York. 19 While we have some of the strongest 20 anti-drunk driving laws in the nation, we need to 21 continually review this issue and we need to do 22 more. 1 (The Secretary called the roll.) 2 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Senator 3 Krueger to explain her vote. 4 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 5 I find myself voting no on this bill not because of a concern with the underlying 6 7 intention of the bill, which is to make sure that people are not employed in daycare centers or 8 9 volunteer in daycare centers if they have 10 particular kinds of criminal convictions -- I 11 agree with that. 12 But it is also my understanding that this bill would apply to the kinds of care 13 centers that operate out of people's homes which 14 15 are providing childcare to under six children at a time, and that this bill would also apply to 16 any member of the household even if they are not 17 18 working in or volunteering in the childcare 19 provision. 20 So my concern is that there would be 21 an unintended consequence from this law actually 22 disallowing many residences from being able to continue their functions as non-center-based 23 childcare. 24 25 And for example, you could have a

1 three-generation household with a grandmother who 2 had a historic felony involving prostitution and who has absolutely nothing to do with the care of 3 the children, nor is she an employee or a 4 5 volunteer. 1 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Call the 2 roll. 3 (The Secretary called the roll.) 4 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Announce the results. 5 б THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 60. Nays, 1. 7 Senator Hassell-Thompson recorded in the 8 negative. 9 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: The bill 10 is passed. THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 11 739, substituted earlier by Member of the 12 13 Assembly Thiele, Assembly Print Number 6906, an act to amend the Environmental Conservation Law. 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Read the last section. 16 17 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This 18 act shall take effect immediately. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Call the 19 20 roll. 21 (The Secretary called the roll.) 22 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Announce the results. 23 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 60. Nays, 24 25 1. Senator LaValle recorded in the negative.

1 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: The bill 2 is passed. 3 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 740, substituted earlier by Member of the 4 5 Assembly Pretlow, Assembly Print Number 7336, an act to amend the Racing, Pari-Mutuel Wagering and 6 7 Breeding Law. 8 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Read the 9 last section. 10 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 11 12 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Call the 13 roll. (The Secretary called the roll.) 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Announce 16 the results. THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 60. 17 Nays, 18 1. Senator Espaillat recorded in the negative. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: The bill 19 20 is passed. 21 Senator Libous, that completes the 22 noncontroversial reading of the calendar. 23 Senator Gianaris. SENATOR GIANARIS: Thank you, 24 25 Mr. President.

We neglected to mention when we 1 2 passed Calendar Number 728 that I believe that 3 was Senator Latimer's first bill passed in the 4 house. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Congratulations, Senator Latimer. б 7 (Applause.) 8 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Senator 9 Libous. 10 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, I'm disappointed that I have to stand before you and 11 say could we have the reading of the 12 controversial calendar. 13 14 (Laughter.) 15 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: The 16 secretary will place Calendar Number 732 before the Senate on the controversial calendar and ring 17 18 the bells. The Secretary will read. 19 20 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 21 732, by Senator Libous, Senate Print 4001, an act 22 to authorize. 23 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Senator Krueger. 24 25 SENATOR KRUEGER: If the sponsor

would please yield for a question. 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Senator 3 Libous, do you yield? 4 SENATOR LIBOUS: I sure will. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: The sponsor yields. б 7 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 8 So I was looking through a whole package of other land transference bills that 9 10 have moved through this house in the past, and each and every one of them describes the actual 11 12 parcel of land that is going to be transferred or 13 sold. And so I am wondering where that 14 15 information is in your bill. Through you, 16 Mr. President. SENATOR LIBOUS: Senator Krueger, I 17 18 didn't draft this bill myself. But I would tell 19 you that it's a pretty simple bill, and I'll 20 share with you what I know. 21 BOCES of Broome, Tioga, Chenango and Delaware came to me and said: IBM gave us a 22 parcel of property. The property's value is I 23 believe about \$4,000. And even upstate, that's 24 25 not a lot. It must be a shed.

1 They would like very much to get rid 2 of the property, because it's costing them 3 money. And they wanted to avoid the public vote 4 because that would cost more money. 5 That's pretty much what I could б offer you, Senator Krueger, at this time. Ι 7 can't offer you any more. And I don't know how the other bills are drafted. That's how this 8 bill is drafted, and I think it's pretty 9 10 self-explanatory. 11 I'm not sure that we have any 12 pro forma on how we draft certain kinds of bills, but I would hope that that would give you enough 13 14 information to make a judgment on this. 15 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, Mr. President, on the bill. 16 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 17 Senator 18 Krueger on the bill. 19 SENATOR KRUEGER: I appreciate the 20 Senator's explanation of describing the specific property and the market value. 21 Again, for the record, I do think 22 there is a history in both houses that land 23 transfer bills and land sale bills between 24 25 counties and private entities or the state or a

1 municipality of the state and a private entity 2 have in history laid out explicitly what the property is or what the history of the property 3 4 is for identification purposes. 5 And I, like the Senator, don't know why it wasn't in this bill. But I would б 7 encourage in the future people who are bringing these bills to the floor should have the 8 information about the specific piece of land, the 9 10 description of who, what, where included in the legislation. 11 12 Because not only does it I think address our answers without having to ask them on 13 14 the floor, but I think it's an important record 15 of why this Legislature is making specific 16 decisions about the transfer and sale of other governments' lands here in the Senate and the 17 18 Assembly. 19 I will be voting yes. Thank you, 20 Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 21 Thank you, Senator Krueger. 22 Seeing no other Senator who wishes 23 to be heard, the debate is closed. 24 25 The Secretary will ring the bells.

Senators are asked to proceed immediately to the 1 2 chamber for a vote. 3 Read the last section. Section 3. This 4 THE SECRETARY: 5 act shall take effect immediately. THE SECRETARY: In relation to 11 12 Calendar Number 732, absent from voting: Senators Adams, Flanagan, Hannon and Sampson. 13 14 Ayes, 56. 15 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: The bill 16 is passed. 17 Senator Libous, that completes the 18 controversial reading of the calendar. 19 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, at 20 this time, if you can go back to motions, I 21 believe Senator DeGianaris has a motion before 22 the house. 23 (Laughter.) ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 24 Senator 25 Gianaris.

1 SENATOR GIANARIS: Thank you, Mr. President. 2 3 On behalf of Senator DeEspaillat, 4 please place a sponsor's star on Calendar Number 729. 5 (Laughter.) 6 7 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: So 8 ordered. 9 Senator Libous. 10 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, at this time is there any further business before 11 the Senate? 12 13 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: There is no further business at the desk. 14 15 SENATOR LIBOUS: Thank you, 16 Mr. President. 17 There being no further business, I 18 move that the Senate adjourn until Thursday, May 23rd, at 11:00 a.m. 19 20 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: On 21 motion, the Senate stands adjourned until 22 Thursday, May 23rd, at 11:00 a.m. 23 (Whereupon, at 4:58 p.m., the Senate adjourned.) 24 25
