Cuomo to 9 10 proclaim June 10-16, 2013, as Museum Week in the State of New York. 11 12 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Senator Little on the resolution. 13 SENATOR LITTLE: 14 Thank you very 15 much, Mr. President. 16 Once again, this will be our second year in memorializing a week for New York State 17 18 Museum Week. And the purpose of doing so is to 19 make everyone in New York State more aware of the 20 huge number of museums that we have to celebrate 21 the diversity and richness of the museums in our 22 state and to encourage people to visit one of the 23 museums in their locality. Frequently people in their own 24 25 community have not visited the museum that's

right in their backyard, practically. And what we're asking people to do and encouraging them to do is to visit your museum.

There are over 200 museums participating in Museum Week this week. They're having special events, activities, and promotions to give guests a sample of the exhibitions and programs available.

Museum Week 2013 is being cosponsored by the New York State Council of the Arts and Museumwise/the Museum Association of New York and the I Love New York program. There are links on the I Love New York website to all of the museums in New York State and the events that are taking place.

So whether it's in New York City, the Metropolitan Museum of Art or many of the huge museums that they have in that city, to the Hyde Museum in my own hometown of Glens Falls, which this week, in celebration of Museum Week, opens the exhibit entitled "Modern Nature:

Georgia O'Keeffe and Lake George." Georgia

O'Keeffe lived and summered on Lake George for over 20 years. And this exhibition, which is going to be at the Hyde Museum from June 15th to

September 15th, is going to then be a traveling museum that will travel to New Mexico, where Georgia O'Keeffe lived later on.

But it's an outstanding exhibit, and I would encourage you all -- it's kind of right in your own backyard, at least it's here in New York State -- to see it before it travels to other states.

The Empire State Aerosciences Museum will be hosting open cockpit tours, military aircraft, giving people an opportunity to sit in a historic jet fighter or a helicopter. And that's just an example of what our museums are offering.

Many of our smaller museums do not have the financial ability to advertise and to promote themselves, so hopefully this week will do so.

The week is also done in collaboration with the Governor's Path Through History, which took place the last two weeks, highlighting the historically and culturally significant sites and events throughout New York State. And we know that many of those sites are museums.

As the cost of living in New York State continues to rise and we 13 continue to have issues with unemployment, issues 14 15 are created within our families that unfortunately lead to domestic abuse. Many, many 16 of these cases are not reported. 17 18 There are many elders in our 19 communities that are suffering from a great deal 20 of abuse that goes unrecognized and goes hidden. 21 And we need to do more to make the public aware 22 of this. This is an issue that there are many organizations trying to rally around and 23 help our local seniors and elders deal with this 24 unfortunate circumstance. 25

I encourage everyone, if you know 1 2 someone who you think may be in danger of being abused and who is a senior, please reach out to 3 the local authorities. There is assistance 4 5 available. And I would encourage my colleagues here to continue to fight against this in any 6 7 legislative way that we can. 8 Taking care of our seniors is 9 critically important. When we lose our seniors, 10 we lose a valuable part of our communities, and 11 we should do everything we can to protect them. 12 Thank you, Mr. President. We knew that they moved to 8 upstate New York, but we had lost the contact. 9 10 And it was unfortunate that it took this incident for us to reconnect with that family, but it is 11 what life does. It's what life allows, is for us 12 to somehow, in separation, come back together 13 14 with people who mean a lot in our lives. 15 And so I thank all of you for signing onto this and for supporting and giving 16 to this mother and father some recognition by 17 18 this state body that their son was important to 19 someone other than to them. And certainly what 20 he did for his country and for his community 21 shall never be forgotten. 22 Thank you, Mr. President. This bill reverses that pattern by increasing felony penalties for the 11 use of these drugs. 12 13 And frankly, we should not be 14 defining other drugs -- synthetic cannabinoids --15 under the category of law that applies to 16 marijuana in this state, because I at least am still in the hope we might as a chamber or as 17 18 both houses move in a positive direction on marijuana policy this year. 19 20 I'll be voting no. Thank you, 21 Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 22 Senator Krueger in the negative. 23 Senator Hassell-Thompson to explain 24 25 her vote.

SENATOR HASSELL-THOMPSON: Thank
you, Mr. President.

There is mounting evidence that the side effects of synthetic cannabis are substantially more dangerous than naturally grown marijuana. Brand names like Spice and K2 were and are widely used around the world as well as here in the United States.

As the use of this drug increased, there have been mounting medical reports that that drug causes damage to kidneys, causes paranoia, induces high blood pressure, and causes stroke.

As the sponsor indicates, several states have taken action to penalize the possession and sale of synthetic cannabis. And while I agree with the sponsor that possession and sale of this drug should be penalized in New York State, I'm not sure that the sale of any amount of synthetic cannabis should be classified as a C felony.

I do not believe that there is sufficient evidence at this time to justify making the sale of small amounts of synthetic cannabis a felony. And I note that the

memorandum in support lists some of the side 1 2 effects. But additionally, it is not clear to me how the bill concluded that the possession of one 3 4 quarter of an ounce of synthetic cannabis can be 5 a D and that over an ounce of synthetic cannabis should be a C felony. 6 7 Current law around marijuana 8 possession in excess of 16 ounces but less than 10 pounds is a Class D felony and is punishable 9 10 by no more than seven years of imprisonment. 11 Possession of marijuana in excess of 10 pounds is 12 a Class C felony and is punishable by no more than 15 years of imprisonment. 13 I submit that a more critical study 14 15 of the side effects of synthetic cannabis is needed before a citizen can be exposed to up to 16 15 years in prison for possession of an ounce of 17 18 synthetic marijuana, up to 15 years in prison for the sale of one stick of synthetic marijuana. 19 20 Therefore, Mr. President, I shall be 21 voting no. And in my case, in my district, this little girl was able to go testify against her father because she had the assistance of a courthouse facility dog that's specially trained to help these victims testify in really stressful circumstances.

Her father was sent to prison for a very long time, but he's now possibly going to get out because the law itself does not state that these dogs are allowed. Rosie's Law changes that and says that these facility dogs are allowed.

So it's vital that we allow our parents to be involved with these type of decisions to move forward with bioinformatics and science technology. These kids are not even given the opportunity to go to a secondary school and further their education, where we have in Buffalo "Say Yes to Education" that will allow them to have free college tuition through a
