And I think we showed that not every statehouse needs to operate like the U.S. Congress, where gridlock and dysfunction stifle progress on each and every issue.

We came together on issues that matter. We passed meaningful and sensible gun laws. We passed a historic budget that raised the minimum wage, provided tax relief for working families, and extended the lowest middle-class tax rates in 60 years. And I look forward this year for doing even more.

I think it's clear that one of the issues and really the major issues that we have to deal with is really income inequality. More so, figuring out a way that we can get help for working families -- people who get up every morning, put in a hard day's work, raise a family, choose to stay in New York to retire and grow old gracefully. The Independent Democratic Conference released a very simple plan which makes a lot of sense, "Making New York

Affordable."

You know, I had the privilege of growing up in a two-family home in the Bronx with my grandparents. My grandfather was an immigrant who came to this country, worked very hard to make a better life for his family. I also watched my grandfather and my father, who were partners in a small business, work very, very hard each and every day.

But you want to know something?

They worked hard, they were able to buy a house, people in that era were able to have a nice apartment, they were able to save some money to send their kids to school. And you know something, they were able to really put away some money for retirement. That no longer exists.

Those good old days are just that, good old days.

We need to move in a different direction. And the way we can do that is making New York affordable, giving people the ability to take paid family leave to take care of an elderly loved one, to take care of a sick child, for a new mom to be able to bond with that child. We need to make college more affordable for

THE PRESIDENT: Senator Skelos. 1 2 SENATOR SKELOS: Thank you. 3 Welcome. Welcome back. And welcome back, all of 4 my colleagues, to the warm weather of Albany. I 5 understand there's global warming going on. I don't know, it's not exactly right here. 6 7 (Laughter.) SENATOR SKELOS: But it is great to 8 be back for what I know is going to be another 9 10 productive session. 11 Last year, as Senator Klein 12 mentioned, we established really what was historic: The Senate Republican conference began 13 14 a historic partnership with Senator Jeff Klein 15 and members of the IDC. 16 And what's important about that is 17 our bipartisan coalition, working with Governor 18 Cuomo, working with the Assembly, working with Senator Stewart-Cousins and the members of her 19 20 conference, we were able to once again -- three years in a row -- have an early budget. 21 22 And an early budget meant that the people are seeing New York State once again 23 putting dysfunction behind us and having 24 25 bipartisan government, which is what they want.

They want solutions to problems. They don't want rhetoric, they don't want bickering. Although there will always be healthy debate, and there should be. But in the end, they want results.

And we had so many different results last year. And this coming year, with the budget surplus that we anticipate, I think we have to continue to move forward, as Senator Klein has indicated, Senator Stewart-Cousins, making

New York State more affordable.

We have to make it more affordable for the small-business owner who wants to succeed and create more jobs. That's critically important. Letting hardworking taxpayers, middle-class families, keep more of their money to help them meet their budgets. Strengthening our economy and creating more career opportunities for young people so they can stay in New York State. Making our state more competitive by cutting broad-based taxes and eliminating unnecessary regulations that strangle businesses and act as a barrier to job creation. Helping our veterans who have sacrificed so much for our state and our country. And ensuring that we provide the highest-quality education for our

children, from pre-K to college. 1 2 As we prepare for the Governor's 3 State of the State message, let's recognize that 4 we are in a unique position to achieve these 5 goals. By working together, Senate Republicans with the IDC, Governor Cuomo, Senator 6 7 Stewart-Cousins, the Assembly, we can have a very, very productive session, accomplish great 8 9 things, and keep our state moving in the right 10 direction. So I thank you, Mr. President, for 11 12 the opportunity to speak.
