He attended Bennett High School and proudly served our country in an engineering 11 battalion during World War II. 12 13 Richard attained the rank of master sergeant and was awarded the Bronze Star for his 14 15 service in the European Theater. Upon completion of his military service, Richard attended 16 Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. 17 18 When he arrived back in Buffalo, Richard worked for the Republic Steel Corporation 19 20 in the executive development program but left to 21 take over his father's company, C.H. Byron, an 22 industrial steel construction and painting 23 contracting business. Richard Byron's work and his 24 25 family's company helped shape Buffalo and the

is seen on Sundays as we cheer for New York's only NFL team, and the team that we all in this chamber cheer for, the Buffalo Bills. Richard's company was instrumental in helping to transform a plot of land in Orchard Park into Rich Stadium, now Ralph Wilson Stadium, the home of the Bills.

He was deeply involved with the Buffalo Audubon Society and was a founding leader of the Niagara Aerospace Museum. For his work, in 2007 Richard was inducted into the Niagara Frontier Aviation and Space Hall of Fame.

Richard Byron is the type of person Western New York is known for. He worked hard, he cared about his family, he gave back to his community, he served others. Buffalo is the City of Good Neighbors because of people like Richard Byron.

We remember Mr. Byron, we thank him for all he did for our community, and we send our thoughts and prayers to his family.
