24

     presently, or the last numbers that I saw, about
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1 13.5 percent of the Nassau County budget is debt 2 service. And that is a dangerous area. 3 Skelos, the sponsor of the bill, a number of 4 years ago raised these same questions. In 2012, 5 same questions. But I'm going to vote for the bill, 6 7 and let me tell you why. I believe that the City of Long Beach has the right to make its own 8 self-determination, the same way as the City of 9 10 Buffalo or the City of Rochester or the City of 11 Poughkeepsie. These municipalities have the 12 right to determine their destiny, and so does the City of New York. 13 And therefore, it seems to me that 14 15 Long Beach should decide -- if they choose to borrow, and it's up to \$12 million, they should 16 have that right also. 17 18 So I vote aye, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT GALLIVAN: 19 Are 20 there any other Senators wishing to be heard? 21 Seeing none, the debate is closed. 22 The Secretary will ring the bell.
