                  I cosponsored this chapter amendment
     because it addresses some of the concerns I had
22
     with the original bill. While the original bill
23
     to set standards for operating as a pet dealer
24
25
     was well-intentioned, it simply was not strong
```

enough to adequately protect animals from abuse or neglect.

The bill allows local governments to assume responsibility for enforcement and prosecution of violations. It also caps the fine for violations at \$500. And it maintains the penalty as a simple violation of the law, which is basically the equivalent of a traffic ticket. I think we need much stronger penalties than those provided for in this new law.

So in addition to cosponsoring this amendment, I have also introduced companion legislation. Senate Bill Number 6436 would make violations of the Agriculture and Markets Law related to pet dealers a crime, a misdemeanor punishable by up to a year in jail, rather than a violation.

I hope my colleagues join me in supporting the chapter amendment, and I urge my colleagues to also join me and quickly bring my legislation to the floor to give this new law real teeth, to allow local law enforcement to put abusive and negligent puppy mills out of business.
