(Whereupon, the assemblage recited 6 7 the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.) 8 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: In the 9 absence of clergy, may we bow our heads in a 10 moment of silence. (Whereupon, the assemblage respected 11 a moment of silence.) 12 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 13 The 14 reading of the Journal. 15 The Secretary will read. 16 THE SECRETARY: In Senate, Tuesday, 17 March 11th, the Senate met pursuant to 18 adjournment. The Journal of Monday, March 10th, 19 was read and approved. On motion, Senate 20 adjourned. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Without objection, the Journal stands approved as read. 22 23 Presentation of petitions. Messages from the Assembly. 24 25 Messages from the Governor.

Reports of standing committees. 1 2 Reports of select committees. Communications and reports from 3 state officers. 4 5 Motions and regulations. Senator Libous. 6 7 SENATOR LIBOUS: Thank you, 8 Mr. President. 9 At this time I would ask you to call 10 on the Democratic Leader, Senator Andrea 11 Stewart-Cousins. 12 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: Senator Stewart-Cousins. 13 SENATOR STEWART-COUSINS: 14 Thank 15 you, Mr. President. 16 I rise today to just pay tribute to a special guest who's visiting us: Donna 17 18 Zaccaro. 19 Donna, if you would rise. 20 This is Women's History Month. And 21 obviously we have an opportunity to pay tribute 22 to many great women throughout history, and 23 certainly women in New York State. Donna Zaccaro is the daughter of a woman that most of us have 24 had the opportunity to know of and even meet in 25

our lifetime. She's the daughter of Geraldine 1 2 Ferraro. 3 And as we know, Geraldine Ferraro 4 played a significant political role for women as 5 the daughter of immigrant parents who rose to be the very first woman to be on a national ticket 6 7 as vice president in 1984. 8 I often tell the story of how when I 9 was a journalism student on election night in 10 1984, they sent me to cover Geraldine Ferraro and Walter Mondale's election night. And how 11 12 thrilled I was, as were all of the reporters that night, to be at this moment, regardless of the 13 results, with this historic, iconic figure who 14 15 not only worked with such great poise throughout the campaign but certainly showed the attributes 16 of a true winner even on that devastating evening 17 18 for her. 19 Donna Zaccaro is going to be 20 presenting her film, which is a feature-length documentary. I don't suppose any of us will get 21 to see it because it will be this evening at 6:30 22 in --23 24 SENATOR LIBOUS: Now, Senator, you 25 never know.

(Laughter.) 1 2 SENATOR STEWART-COUSINS: We might 3 be, okay. There you go. Hope springs eternal. 4 Senator Libous says that we might be able to get 5 there. So should we get there, we will get 6 7 an opportunity to see footage about Geraldine Ferraro that we've never seen. And it is a 8 powerful documentary -- which will be on 9 10 Showtime, I believe it is, later in the month and for a whole month -- that will not only I believe 11 12 inform us, but inspire us, and certainly inspire so many women who have yet to blaze new trails 13 but can be educated and informed by the life of 14 15 our great Geraldine Ferraro. 16 So I just wanted to welcome Donna 17 Zaccaro, wish you the very, very best of luck in 18 introducing your mother to generations of women who did not have the privilege, and reminding us 19 20 who did the privilege how great she was. 21 Thank you very much. (Standing ovation.) 22 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: 23 Thank you, Senator Stewart-Cousins. 24 25 Certainly a special welcome to

Ms. Zaccaro. Welcome to the New York State 1 2 Senate chamber, and hope you're enjoying your day here in Albany. Thank you. 3 4 Senator Libous. 5 SENATOR LIBOUS: Thank you, Mr. President. б 7 And like I always try to do, is 8 grant wishes for Senator Stewart-Cousins --9 (Laughter.) 10 SENATOR LIBOUS: -- I would ask if there's any further business at the desk. 11 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: The desk 12 is clear, Senator Libous. 13 SENATOR LIBOUS: 14 There being no 15 further business, I move that the Senate adjourn 16 until Thursday, March 13th, at 11:00 a.m. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT VALESKY: On 18 motion, the Senate stands adjourned until 19 Thursday, March 13th, at 11:00 a.m. 20 (Whereupon, at 5:35 p.m., the Senate 21 adjourned.) 22 23 24 25
