All this bill does is protect them from being able to respond to emergencies and then coming back to their place of employment.

And if it's deemed by their employer, which is what one of the changes were, that it places an undue hardship on the employer itself, then the employee is not able to go.

This is not something where somebody could take off for, you know, a month, two months at a time and they're going to get paid. It's somebody that has to respond immediately to help in assistance, moving equipment, do whatever needs to be done. So for somebody in Erie County going to Suffolk County and vice versa, they're protected.

So I vote aye, Mr. President. It's a bill that we need to protect the firefighters and the ambulance and the EMTs that actually go and help out in emergencies.

district because the Southern District 1 Courthouse is in my district in Lower Manhattan, 2 3 and it's in a neighborhood that is surrounded by 4 a growing residential community, by elementary 5 schools -- overcrowded elementary schools -- by a vibrant Chinatown community. And the idea 6 7 that we would not be able to reimburse or spend dollars in order to protect that community when 8 there are trials of terrorists in the Southern 9 10 District Courthouse is of grave concern to me 11 and my constituents. 12 In fact, over the course of the last year since our last debate on this bill, 13 bin Laden's son-in-law Abu Ghaith, Sulaiman Abu 14 15 Ghaith, was tried and convicted in the Southern District, Abu Hamza al-Masri was tried and 16 convicted in the Southern District. And each of 17 18 these cases, based on briefings that I've received from the top levels of the New York 19 20 City Police Department, based on public information and knowledge around Lower 21 Manhattan, required a great deal of local 22

security. If this bill were to pass, that

security couldn't be provided. The NYPD would

be handcuffed from protecting my constituents.

23

Now I understand -- and as we get into a brief conversation, I understand that there are larger issues and questions about enemy combatants and who they are and the appropriate place to try them. I do think that we've seen some convictions on that issue. But, you know, this really can't and shouldn't be about those larger ideological political issues.

Manhattan that's a residential community, a growing community, a community that has recovered from the attacks of September 11th, which for them were not a global event but a local event, are recovering from the effects of the Superstorm Sandy -- not as severe in that community as in others, including in the sponsor's district, but certainly significant. And now we're saying you know what, we're not going to let the NYPD protect you when the federal government tries people in your community.

I think that's dangerous and deeply problematic. And I don't think the larger politics of our view of President Obama and President Bush and Guantanamo and whatever other

while the attacks of 9/11 and the ongoing war that is being waged against America by terrorists abroad is something that has affected each of us in a very unique way, and I understand that his district is the site of where these trials occur, I disagree with the notion that we should ignore the larger politics of the issue, as my colleague has suggested here.

This is personal to each and every one of us. Staten Island lost more of its citizens, disproportionate, than any other place in this country. More of my neighbors, as a percentage of the population of Staten Island, were lost in those attacks. A number of people that I grew up with, who I called friend my entire life, were lost in those attacks.

So this is personal to each of us, but there are larger politics and policy issues that are as important and perhaps more important than the local implications. Because what we're talking about in terms of the larger politics is that of national security.

And so I disagree with the notion that were this bill to become law, that somehow

we would be unable to protect ourselves in terms of the trials that are occurring. And here's what I mean by that.

The reason why I do not want

New York taxpayer dollars to pay for civil

trials for enemy combatants of America is

because I think providing civil trials, with the

civil discovery that comes with it, to enemy

combatants who are committed to destroying

everything we stand for, is both a dumb and

dangerous idea and is an insult to the brave men

and women of the armed services who put their

lives and continue to put their lives on the

line to protect our way of life.

And so what I mean by that is this. Dumb and dangerous. It's dumb and dangerous because while you've pointed out that we've just secured convictions in two cases, we don't know the implications just yet in terms of what that will result in in terms of the safety and security of our country.

And what I point to in that regard is the fact that in 1993, in the first bombing of the World Trade Center, which was funded by Khalid Sheikh Mohammed and carried out by Yousef

and his band of terrorists, there was a civil trial. And there were convictions. And we were assured at that time that this was the right thing to do. And in fact I think our understanding of what was happening was different then. And the Clinton administration and Justice Department treated that as a crime because we were not aware of what was coming together at that time. 

And so when we secured those convictions, as we've just secured two convictions at civil trial, I'm sure a lot of people thought all was well and our system is working to keep us safe. Well, it didn't turn out that way. Because eight years later, Khalid Sheikh Mohammed, armed with information that he secured through the civil discovery that was afforded those terrorists in 1993, was put to use in order to finally do what they had originally intended to do, and that was to bring down those two buildings and to kill those thousands of Americans and to change forever our lives here in America.

And so my concern is that yes, while you point to these two convictions somehow

1 to represent proof that this is a system that 2 works and this is the way we ought to handle these attacks, I think history proves that 3 4 wrong. And that is my concern. 5 And so I believe that by making this a law, those trials won't happen. Or if 6 7 they do, if the Justice Department decides that 8 irrespective of this law in New York they would 9 continue to push for those trials to be civil 10 trials and to be here in New York, then I think at the very least the federal government would 11 be required to offset those costs. 12 13 And so that's the intent of this 14 legislation, is to send a message that it's 15 foolhardy to provide more rights to enemy 16 combatants than we do to the brave men and women who serve in our armed services. 17 18 ACTING PRESIDENT CARLUCCI: Thank you, Senator Lanza. 19 20 Senator Squadron. 21 SENATOR SQUADRON: Thank you. Ιf 22 the sponsor would continue to yield. 23 SENATOR LANZA: Yes. ACTING PRESIDENT CARLUCCI: 24 The 25 sponsor yields, Senator Squadron.

I would hope and I would believe 21 and trust that the President of the United 22 States and the Attorney General of the United 23 States would not press forward with such a 24 25 policy in the face of this law being in place.

If Senator Squadron knows differently, then I'd ask that he share that information. But I truly believe that this law would act to prevent civil trials being afforded to enemy combatants of the United States.

And in one of our past -- for instance, one of our past debates on this issue, it was suggested this law has been made moot by an act of Congress which -- by the way, representing the will of the country -- had said the same thing, which is that there should not be civil trials.

And I said then in response that it seemed as though this administration was hellbent on circumventing the will of Congress as expressed in that act, and by statements of the Attorney General who said that they were going to press forward and find a way. And as it turned out, I was right. And we've seen, as evidenced by the fact that we've just had two trials, that the administration has become very creative in finding a way to bring those trials, by having these two terrorists out there on a ship instead of Gitmo and so circumventing the spirit and I think letter of the law that was

We thought all was well when we secured those convictions, and we learned only eight years later that we provided them with the very means and information during those trials to carry out the September 11th attack.

And so my concern is that we've done that again. And that we should never do that. We should never weaken national security because we somehow want to prove that we're stronger, as the argument I've heard, which I think is a bad argument. I've heard some of my

colleagues say, Well, we're strong enough to 1 2 provide this type of recourse for folks, we're strong enough to have a civil trial, to offer 4 that up. And you know, I just -- I think it's -- it doesn't make sense, it's illogical, for me, to say that we're strong enough to be 7 stupid. It doesn't make sense that we should do 8 that.

3

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And if we believe that this is the best way to provide justice, if you will, or to handle this issue of enemy combatants, if we think this is the forum, this is the most perfect forum, why is it that none of my colleagues across the aisle or anywhere else is crying out for a civil trial for the members of the armed services, for an American Marine, for someone from the Army, from the Air Force, from the Navy?

If that is the perfect system and this is how we ought to be dealing with war and peace and attacks on America, why are we not affording that right to American soldiers? If it's good enough for an American soldier, if a military tribunal is good enough for an American soldier, it's certainly too good for a terrorist

They will be unable to provide protection in the community.

This is an issue in which the sponsor's deep conviction about the type of trials that terrorists should have is overwhelming the need to protect the community today and tomorrow. It's tantamount to putting a gun to your own head and threatening "Don't move or I'll shoot." It doesn't make sense for the state and the city.

There are two possible consequences of this bill if it passed. One is the bill

1 passes, trials move forward, and local law 2 enforcement is unable to protect New Yorkers, is prevented from protecting Lower Manhattan from 3 another attack or another incident related to 4 5 what's happening in the federal courthouse within blocks of hundreds of thousands, 6 7 certainly tens of thousands of New Yorkers trying to make their life here, just like your 8 constituents across the state. 9 10 The other option is the NYPD is unable to provide protection and the President 11 sends in the National Guard to Lower Manhattan. 12 And we've seen the National Guard in Lower 13 Manhattan. We saw them there after 14 15 September 11th, we saw them there after Sandy. And I don't like it when that happens. 16 That is a sign that we are in a pretty bad place. 17 18 So the President sends in the 19 National Guard to Lower Manhattan, this 20 thriving, growing, resilient community that has 21 come back from so much. It is occupied by the National Guard, and then you know who pays? 22 New York taxpayers. The NYPD will be required 23 to reimburse the federal government. 24 25 Neither of these scenarios gets at

the core of the sponsor's concern.

Now, were we in a different legislative body in a different city, we may or may not have a hearty debate over questions of civil liberties, questions of theoretical risk versus openness as a society who we are when we try and punish people for heinous, disgusting and unacceptable acts. But we are not having that debate in this body in this city on this afternoon. We are having the debate as to whether the NYPD is allowed to protect my constituents when some of the world's worst terrorists are tried in their backyard. Which is happening, has happened, has resulted in convictions, will continue to happen.

The idea that the NYPD wouldn't protect my constituents is unacceptable to me. The idea that the National Guard would get sent in and then we would still pay is unacceptable to me. That's why I oppose this bill. I understand the sponsor's intent. I don't believe we're debating the sponsor's intent today, I believe we're debating the impact of this bill that would truly cut off our nose to spite our face.

He did 9 10 so armed with the information he learned through 11 a civil discovery in that civil trial. 12 And so I am adamantly opposed to the notion that we should provide and afford 13 civil trials to enemy combatants of America, 14 15 something we do not afford our own soldiers who are putting their lives on the line every single 16 17 day. 18 If anything is theoretical, it is the concerns that have been raised by my 19 20 colleague Senator Squadron as to what would happen if these trials would occur with this law 21 22 being in place. Those are theoreticals. Because I simply don't believe that this 23 President, or any, would push forward knowing 24 25 that this was the law of the State of New York.

Senator Squadron said that if that 1 2 were to occur, we would be in a very bad place, that that would be like putting a gun to our 3 4 Well, only the President of the United 5 States would be able to have the power to put that gun to our head and to put us in that very 6 7 bad place. And I refuse -- differences aside with this administration, I refuse to believe, 8 as it seems Senator Squadron and those who are 9 10 voting against this bill believe, that this President, that this Attorney General would do 11 12 that. I simply refuse to believe that. 13 I believe that what will happen if this became the law of the State of New York is 14 15 that we would not have civil trials for enemy combatants in the State of New York being paid 16 with taxpayer dollars that could be used for all 17 18 the services and all the things that we tried do 19 for the good of the people of the State of 20 New York. 21 For those reasons and others, as have been expressed, I vote in the affirmative, 22 Mr. President. 23 ACTING PRESIDENT CARLUCCI: 24 Thank
