Unfortunately, this happens quite 1 2 often throughout areas in our state. 3 Unbeknownst to many, gun violence is something 4 that even occurs in school playgrounds as well 5 as parks. That led myself and I know Assemblyman Luis Sepulveda, who I believe is in 6 7 the chamber with us today, to collaborate and put forth legislation which we're calling 8 Luisito's Law. 9 10 One of the things that we have to be very mindful of is that our playgrounds are 11 meant to be playgrounds. They're not supposed 12 to be shooting galleries. And unfortunately, 13 14 gun violence in my borough of the Bronx is on 15 the rise. Just over the past two years, at least four other young children have been 16 17 injured by gunfire in Bronx parks, including 18 another incident at the very same park that Luisito was injured in back in 2012. 19 20 This led us to introduce legislation which I think will go a long way 21 22 towards curbing gun violence. And I think what we're doing by introducing and passing this 23 legislation is sending a very simple but strong 24 25 message to criminals: If you take aim at our

children, we will fire right back. 1 2 This legislation would make it a B felony to injure a child under 10 years old 3 4 with any deadly weapon, with a sentence of up to 5 25 years. It would also increase penalties for violent crimes committed with a gun in or near 6 7 school grounds or playgrounds, and could carry up to 15 years in prison. And that he doesn't even have a functioning shower, works at the local supermarket and uses the local gym early in the morning for his shower.

We haven't always done the right thing by our vets, and this organization is picking up that slack, a lot of good work. But the reason why we've done this, and digging into even if you have a not-for-profit that's willing to donate their time, their services, their money, or if you have individuals that are willing to donate property, even in my district, especially in my district, but in all of our districts, we know the expense of property taxes.

We had a piece of property that was going to be donated, it was 10 acres that was going to be donated for a service-disabled vet, but the taxes on that property over \$20,000. So

And I want to mention the American Heart Association for all their hard work, all the other groups -- police, fire, EMTs, veterans organizations -- that put forth a strong effort to get this passed.

But I'd be remiss not to mention a couple of things first. I want to acknowledge a constituent of mine, Suzy McCarthy, who lost her 5-year-old daughter Madison, who they believe fainted while she was in kindergarten class. She laid there for 16 minutes because they basically just thought she fainted, nobody performed CPR. She ended up passing.

In your districts, I want to
mention Robbie Levine, from Merrick, New York,
9 years old when he died of sudden cardiac
arrest. Louis Acompora, from Northport,
New York, 14 years old, that died.

When they were here in the Well the other day, it was sad, because on one side they had those that survived cardiac arrest because CPR was performed on them, and on the other side

on the banners they had kids that died because CPR was not available.

This is something that can be taught in less time than it takes to watch an infomercial or Gilligan's Island or The Brady Bunch -- I may be showing my age now. But basically, 30 minutes.

And it's not blowing in the mouth anymore, ladies and gentlemen, it's hands-on CPR. It's something that the American Heart Association recognizes. Seventeen other states have enacted this. This is not a mandate. It tells the Board of Regents to go ahead and ask the State Board of Education how to implement this program in a proper fashion. It can be taught in health class, it can be taught in gym, it can be taught after school.

But in my district, in my district Molly Budzinski showed how easy it was. She brought it to her own school by getting volunteers from the fire department, EMTs and ambulance workers that came in with the materials to teach this. In 30 minutes, and then you're on your way.

The problem as I see it is that it could jeopardize some of the professional requirements for degrees. It could jeopardize licensure requirements or accreditation programs, as well as admission to graduate schools or for jobs that require a four-year program.

It also could affect the TAP award and the Rational Tuition Policy. The cost of this bill is capped at \$12,000 for the three-year period, while the average tuition for a year of on-campus learning is approximately \$5500 a year or so. So there's not a large savings, but there is a savings to the student.

However, the student with the online learning is losing the human contact with a professor. And the absence of counseling -- which some students may be suited for online classes, some may not. Some require the human touch.

The last problem that I see as major problem are the out-of-state students, because we have students from out of state who pay an additional tuition charge. And yet a student in Idaho or North Dakota can log on,

Unfortunately, thousands upon thousands of young people, mostly girls, are put into sexual bondage every year in this state. And in fact, our state is the state where it occurs more than any other place in the country.

This bill, the Trafficking Victims
Protection and Justice Act, would change that.

It would finally treat the criminals as
criminals and victims as victims. I told the
story last year that as I researched this
legislation, I came across a story about a young
girl who, because of the stress of life, ran
away from home. She found herself in the
streets, and she was abducted, for all intents
and purposes. And she was not able to come and
go as she pleased. A man decided that her life
and her body belonged to him, and he pressed her
into a life of sexual bondage. And when the
government finally showed up, they arrested her.

And as I read the story, I thought to myself, in which century has this occurred?

In which country has this occurred? And the sad fact is that this is occurring in the here and the now, and we need to do something about it and we need to stop it.

This bill will do that. It is not 1 2 often, my colleagues, that we have the 3 opportunity to pass legislation, to make a law 4 that will actually save lives. What wouldn't 5 you do to save one young girl from this horror? What wouldn't you do to save a hundred or a 6 7 thousand or 10,000? That's what we will be doing if we can make this bill become a law. 8 Wе will save the thousands, hopefully, who are 9 10 being treated this way who don't have their own lives any longer, who are pressed into this 11 12 horror. And I think we will go a long way in ensuring that girls of tomorrow will not endure 13 this hell. 14 15 And so, my colleagues, I thank you for the bipartisan support we've had on this 16 legislation. In particular, I want to thank 17 18 Assemblywoman Paulin, who, because of 19 misdirected politics, is having to move 20 mountains in order to achieve what is a very 21 common-sense, long overdue, and critically important piece of legislation in the Assembly, 22 and she's doing it. There are 10 bills out there, nine of them which we have passed in the past. 8 Nine bills that could have prevented people from 9 10 being taken advantage of, young women, whether 11 it's here, whether it's people who are recently 12 arrived in the country, from being taken advantage of. These bills can make a 13 14 difference, and yet they're being held up. 15 have colleagues in the Assembly who have supported each one of these nine bills in the 16 past, but they can't get an opportunity to vote 17 18 for them because leadership in the Assembly won't allow them on the floor. It's wrong. 19 20 I join my colleagues here in supporting this bill -- obviously it's 21 22 unanimous -- and some of our colleagues in the Assembly who are calling for it. Let me add my voice to the chorus of those who are congratulating Senator Lanza on this great bill. And I think none of us disagree about how important it is to protect, you know, particularly women but all members of our society from sex trafficking and the illegal sex trade in not just this state but around the country. So we certainly stand in support of this bill, and I'd like to see us go further.

However, I don't think that the women, whether they have been victims of sex trafficking or other crimes, think that it is just politics to protect them from housing discrimination. They don't think that it's just politics that they receive 77 cents on the dollar to every man as they work right this minute and hear this debate. I don't think they think it's just politics when they are denied their reproductive health rights or they are

1 told that they have to go through all these 2 extra hoops to receive reproductive health care in this state. 3 4 And so I think when we talk about 5 the whole 10 points of the Women's Equality Agenda, those women want to see all of those 6 7 things being done. Including the women who are being protected by this act, who want to see 8 that entire package go forward. 9 10 So I join with my colleagues who 11 have been championing the cause of women's 12 equality, not just on the selective morality that we sometimes hear about, but on all the 13 14 things that are important for women in the State 15 of New York. a Heavy Lift" has demonstrated that there are too many situations, far too many situations, where pregnant women are often forced to choose between their health and their job when both could be maintained with modest adjustments, such as bathroom breaks, water breaks, seating accommodations. Reasonable accommodations.

Some examples that have been shared with me include a fast-food restaurant worker who was denied permission to drink water and eat during an eight-hour shift. Or a cashier who could easily have been accommodated merely with a stool to sit on.

People think that this whole situation had been addressed by a combination of federal and state laws, but it's not. It's a glaring omission. And you think that in the absence of this statute what we're doing is saying to somebody who is pregnant: No, you can't continue to work. No, you can't continue to have your usual routine. And that just puts an economic burden on the rest of society.

So I would urge that this measure be passed and it be passed in both houses.

Focused on the merits of the measure alone, it

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will be a substantial addition to the laws of

It also requires some responsibility on the part of the employee that they show the need for these reasonable accommodations. But it's really a very good bill and very considerate.

It takes me back to I did a paper on the history of women in the Legislature, and a very, very long time ago, women legislators, one in the Assembly, one in the Senate, proposed a bill that would require a stool for all retail clerks who may be on an eight-hour shift in a store and never had a chance to sit down, and for elevator operators. And until our elevators were automatically operated, you must have
