     Bianco -- and I'll be as brief as I can, knowing
```

the time constraints -- the story of Luigi Del Bianco is a story about an individual, but it's a story that has resonance to lots of other individuals in this state of ours. Luigi Del Bianco was an Italian-American immigrant who came to New York, and he came with skills as a stonemason.

And in the 1920s and 1930s, when

Mount Rushmore was conceived and created in

South Dakota, he became part of a team of people
and ultimately became the chief carver for the

four faces of the four great Americans on

Mount Rushmore.

There's certainly something

symbolic about an Italian-American immigrant who

comes to this country and winds up being the

person who finalizes, as the chief carver, the

images of four great Americans -- President

Washington, President Jefferson, President

Lincoln, and President Teddy Roosevelt.

And the story of his work, dangling thousands of feet in the sky above the ground to ultimately ensure that those four faces looked like those four great Americans, would be an accomplishment story in and of itself. But his

1 work as a stonemason exposed him, in that day 2 and age, to the types of problems that ultimately caused his life to be lived briefly. 3 4 He died at a young age because of what he 5 inhaled as a stone carver in that kind of 6 proximity. So in many ways he gave his life for 7 his art. 8 The happy side of the story has a sad side, and that is that the United States 9 10 Department of Interior has not recognized Luigi Del Bianco for his achievements as chief carver, 11 12 treating him as part of the 400-member team, as if he was just any one of the members that 13 14 accomplished that great task. And the further 15 sad news is that I believe, as does his biographer, Doug Gladstone, that he was denied 16 the proper respect for his accomplishment 17 18 because he was an Italian-American immigrant. 19 Now, in this chamber we have spoken 20 in many, many ways very effusively about people from many different ethnic backgrounds, because 21 22 it is a wonderful mosaic that makes up New York.

It is hard to remember in 2014 the prejudice

that Italian Americans faced in the 1920s.

was the era of Sacco and Vanzetti. That was the

23

24

era when those who were Italian American were all presumed to be part of organized crime.

And this talented artisan, in my judgment and the judgment of many people, has been denied the respect that he deserves because he was an Italian American. And in this day and age, there are people of other ethnic backgrounds who face the same kind of prejudice.

This resolution says, from the standpoint of the New York State Senate, that we want to redress that unfairness. We want a person -- although of immigrant status, born in another country -- who came to this land and made a contribution to our American heritage, that he deserves the respect of a grateful nation. That is what this resolution does, Mr. President.

And I know Senator Libous will say in a few seconds that it will be open for everybody's involvement. As we have stood here and the honored the role of African-Americans, those who are Latino, those of Irish-American background, those of Polish-American background, it is part of my proud heritage, Mr. President, as it is part of your proud heritage, that the

     Italian-American community in this country has

     produced great work. And the work of Luigi Del
     Bianco recognized in this resolution, a resident

Eve served Buffalo and Western 5 New York with great distinction in the New York State Assembly for 37 years. 6 7 A founding member of the New York 8 State Black and Puerto Rican Legislative Caucus, Arthur O. Eve was a leading champion for 9 10 educational and economic opportunity throughout his career and dedicated his life to serving the 11 12 underprivileged throughout our state. Assemblyman Eve was instrumental in establishing 13 14 the Educational Opportunity Program within the 15 SUNY system and worked tirelessly to provide new educational and job training opportunities for 16

As deputy speaker of the State
Assembly, Assemblyman Eve served as the
highest-ranking African American in the entire
New York State Legislature. And back in
Buffalo, Arthur Eve was a predominant figure in
the local civil rights movement, often a key
organizer and negotiator who was able to improve
both local and statewide opportunities for

New Yorkers in need.

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minorities. He led nonviolent protests to ensure minorities had access to union membership and the rights and protections they deserve.

his first term as an Assemblyman, Mr. Eve led the effort to obtain the initial \$500,000 needed to establish the Educational Opportunity

Program, a truly life-changing program. Since the 1970s, colleges in New York have administered the Arthur O. Eve Higher Education Opportunity Program, the primary objective of which is to improve a provide a broad range of services to New York State residents who, because of socioeconomic circumstances, may be unable to pursue higher education.

Assemblyman Eve's contributions to educational equity and opportunity is vast and spans nearly four decades of service to New York State government. For these accomplishments and his commitment to serving the community, the University Council and the University at Buffalo have taken a much-deserved action to honor this great man in a meaningful and lasting way for generations to come. The Honorable Arthur O. Eve's name will soon be prominently displayed on

the University at Buffalo's Educational
Opportunity Center, a fitting tribute to the
exceptional work and passion for expanding
higher educational opportunities in Western
New York throughout this state and throughout
this great nation. We all owe Mr. Eve a

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studying her craft at the American Negro 1 Theatre, the renowned and historic company that 2 nurtured the talents of many African American 3 4 greats, including Sidney Poitier and Harry 5 Belafonte; and "WHEREAS, Ruby Dee had her first 6 7 career breakthrough in 1946, when she took the title role in the ANT's Broadway production of 8 Anna Lucasta; she met actor and future husband 9 10 Ossie Davis while co-starring in the 1946 Broadway play Jeb, beginning the six-decade 11 12 creative and romantic partnership that contributed to the actress's tremendous legend 13 14 and legacy; and "WHEREAS, She received national 15 recognition for her role in the 1950 film The 16 Jackie Robinson Story; in 1959, she landed a 17 18 starring role on Broadway in Lorraine Hansberry's play A Raisin in the Sun, earning 19 great acclaim for her portrayal of Ruth Younger, 20 which continues to be one of her best-known 21 roles; two years later, she reprised her role 22 in the film version of the play; and 23 "WHEREAS, In 1961, Ruby Dee 24 25 co-starred with her husband in his Southern

comedic play Purlie Victorious, one of the many 1 2 creative projects the couple worked on over the years; they reprised their roles for the 1963 3 4 film adaptation; and 5 "WHEREAS, In 1965, Ruby Dee performed in lead roles at the American 6 7 Shakespeare Festival as Kate in The Taming of the Shrew and Cordelia in King Lear, becoming 8 the first black actress to portray a lead role 9 10 in the festival; and "WHEREAS, During this time Ruby Dee 11 12 grew increasingly active in the civil rights 13 movement, participating in marches and speaking 14 out for racial equality; in 1963, she emceed 15 the March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom, and she was a member of Congress of Racial 16 Equality (CORE), the NAACP, the Student 17 18 Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, Delta Sigma 19 Theta sorority, and the Southern Christian 20 Leadership Conference; both she and her husband were friends of Malcolm X and Martin Luther 21 King, Jr.; and 22 "WHEREAS, Throughout the 1970s and 23 '80s, Ruby Dee continued to give stellar 24 25 performances; she earned Drama Desk and Obie

awards for the 1970 play Boesman and Lena, and 1 she wrote the book and lyrics for the musical 2 Take It from the Top! In addition, she won a 3 4 Drama Desk Award for her role in Alice 5 Childress's Wedding Band, and an Ace Award for her performance in Eugene O'Neill's Long Day's 6 7 Journey into Night; and "WHEREAS, On the small screen, in 8 9 the 1960s Ruby Dee appeared on the popular 10 prime-time soap opera Peyton Place, and later 11 had her own series on public television with her 12 husband, With Ossie & Ruby; she garnered an Emmy Award nomination for her role in the 1979 13 miniseries Roots: The Next Generation; and 14 15 "WHEREAS, Ruby Dee's film credits also include Uptight (1968), which she also 16 co-wrote, Buck and the Preacher (1972), Do The 17 18 Right Thing (1989) and The Delany Sisters: The First Hundred Years (1999); she won an Emmy 19 20 Award for her performance in the Hallmark Hall 21 of Fame production Decoration Day; and "WHEREAS, Her published works 22 include the humorous My One Good Nerve, and 23 various recordings for young people; in 1998 she 24 25 and her husband, the late Ossie Davis, co-wrote

And she came in all of her 17 18 elegance and all of her beauty, and she 19 delivered these extraordinary lines. And of 20 course everyone gave her a standing ovation. But what was most important to Ruby is that they 21 22 supported this local theater group that gave birth to so many dreams. 23 24 When you look at the fact that she

began her career in the 1940s, you have to

contextualize it. Again, that wasn't a time where black actors and actresses were able to get much work. And yet because of the talent of Ruby, she was able to do stage and she was able to do screen.

But then in the 1960s, she got involved with the civil rights movement. She was a friend, as was Ossie, of Dr. King and of Malcolm X. She talked about civil rights. She moved the ball forward. And they weren't afraid of what would happen to their careers, because they understood the larger picture. And if she was going to be what was called blacklisted or whatever because of her activism and because of Ossie's activism, the love that they had for each other and the community far outweighed what could happen to them.

And as we see, they were on the front line of a movement, and they continued such a rich and loving career.

Ruby Dee once said "The kind of beauty I want most is the hard-to-get kind that comes from within -- strength, courage, dignity." As I offer condolences to her family, I say to Ruby, you accomplished all those

More accurately, they're hoping that only those with a vested interest in seeing the proposal approved will bundle up and remember to vote."

You can't blame schools for trying to improve their odds. But you can blame a State Legislature that could require that these elections take place in a more convenient fashion, coupled with other public decisions to ensure the maximum participation.

I don't think that I would say because we made improvements to Central Park in one year we don't need to deal with the fact that we might sell off St. Catherine's Park in my district but say "But Central Park's getting taken care of very well."

So I have a serious concern about the precedent of allowing a law to be passed where there is parkland alienated and sold for commercial purposes without replacement of new parkland and investment in parks of the money from that.

Private Pernatt now joins the ranks of American servicemen and women who have received the Purple Heart, one of our nation's most prestigious awards and proud honors.

Private Pernatt served with distinction, honor and bravery. The Purple Heart is awarded in the name of the President of the United States to any member of the armed forces who, while serving with the United States armed services, has been wounded or killed. He made great sacrifice for our nation, and now he's receiving the full recognition that he is due.

Bob and his family made the trip to the State Capitol today, and they're joining us here on the Senate floor. He's joined by his son Wesley, his brother George, and his nephew Glenn.

I'd like to take this time to honor the service of this great American hero. Born and raised in South Buffalo, Bob Pernatt bravely fought alongside his comrades in the 3rd Infantry Division during the Korean War. As a member of the 3rd Infantry Division, Private Pernatt proudly served with one of the most successful and decorated divisions in the Army.

The 3rd Infantry Division is well 1 2 known for their courage, and the high cost of 3 their bravery has been thoroughly documented. 4 More than 2,000 members of their unit were 5 killed in the Korean War, and nearly 8,000 were wounded. Private Pernatt was one of those 6 7 soldiers wounded. On April 19, 1951, Private Pernatt's squad came under attack. As they 8 battled against the enemy's gunfire, Private 9 10 Pernatt was wounded in both of his legs. 11 After several months of recovery, 12 Bob was finally able to return home to his worried family in South Buffalo. He came back a 13 battle-tested veteran, an American hero. 14 15 After his service, Bob started a family and worked for years at National Fuel 16 Gas. He's been a loving husband and father. 17 18 Bob and his wife raised two sons, Wesley and 19 Robert. His late son Robert followed in his 20 father's footsteps and served in the U.S. Army 21 as a captain and airborne paratrooper. 22 The freedoms and security we cherish as Americans come at a very high price 23 for those that serve in the military. And it's 24 25 moments like this when we should reflect on this
