I would ask for some order in the 1 2 house as members are proceeding to various committee meetings. 3 4 The Secretary will read. 5 THE SECRETARY: Legislative Resolution Number 5848, by Senator Kennedy, 6 7 commending John Cleary upon the occasion of his retirement after 40 years of distinguished public 8 service to the New York State Police, Erie County 9 10 District Attorney's Office, and Erie County Community College. 11 12 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator Kennedy on the resolution. 13 14 SENATOR KENNEDY: Thank you very 15 much, Mr. President. 16 I rise today to commend John Cleary upon the occasion of his retirement after 17 18 40 years of distinguished public service to the 19 New York State Police, the Erie County District 20 Attorney's Office, and Erie County Community 21 College. Mr. Cleary stepped down as senior chef investigator in the Erie County District 22 Attorney's Office on Thursday, June 5, 2014. 23 Born in South Buffalo in 1952, 24 25 John Cleary graduated from Bishop Fallon High

School in 1970, after which he attended the 1 New York State Police Academy. He went on to 2 3 graduate from Canisius College. Mr. Cleary then 4 joined the New York State Police, where he 5 enjoyed a successful career. John's demonstrated commitment to 6 7 excellence was recognized by his superiors when he was promoted to sergeant in 1985. In 1986, he 8 9 was made an investigator in the narcotics 10 division. In this capacity, he worked on several 11 high-profile cases in Western New York. In 12 addition, Mr. Cleary coordinated and participated 13 in several major investigations with the DEA, the 14 IRS, the FBI, United States Customs, and local 15 law enforcement agencies, resulting in the arrests and convictions of multiple criminals. 16 He completed his Master of Science 17 18 in education at Buffalo State College in 1996, after which he taught criminal justice courses at 19 20 Erie Community College as an adjunct professor. Also in 1996, this dedicated man 21 retired from the New York State Police and became 22 an investigator with the Erie County District 23 Attorney's Office, where he worked on special 24 25 investigations, domestic violence cases, and

1 felony trials.

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2	As a result of his hard work in the
3	DA's office, he was promoted to chief
4	investigator in 2006. In 2011, he was promoted
5	again, this team to senior chief investigator,
6	where he was in charge of the Erie County DA's
7	Task Force at the Erie County Crime Analysis
8	Center.
9	Mr. Cleary's meteoric rise with the
10	New York State Police and then the Erie County
11	District Attorney's Office is a testament to his
12	hard work and persistence. Strong, courageous
13	and incredibly caring individuals like John
14	Cleary and his family have made Buffalo and
15	Western New York the strong and great community
16	that it is today.
17	John's spirit of excellence carries
18	over into everything he does. An avid baseball
19	fan and softball player, he was inducted into the
20	Western New York Softball Hall of Fame in 1996,
21	and in 2011 was awarded the Buffalo Bisons
22	Irish-American of the Year Award in recognition
23	of his dedication to the City of Buffalo and his
24	outspoken pride in his Irish heritage.
25	John has been married for nearly

40 years to his wife, Christine. Together they 1 2 have three daughters, Colleen, Kate and Robyn, 3 and five grandsons: Bradan, Rory, Graeme, Warren 4 and Colin. A loving and devoted husband, father 5 and grandfather, John Cleary plans to teach his grandsons how to play baseball this summer and 6 7 ski in the winter as he enjoys retirement. 8 On a personal note, John is a dear friend of mine. I'm honored to stand here today 9 to wish him a happy retirement and to personally 10 thank him for his outstanding service to our 11 12 great City of Buffalo community, the State of New York, and to our nation. 13 I'd like to open up this resolution 14 15 for cosponsorship, Mr. President. its entirety. 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The 3 Secretary will read Resolution 5822 in its 4 entirety. 5 THE SECRETARY: Legislative Resolution Number 5822, by Senator Peralta, б 7 commemorating the 2014 FIFA World Cup Brazil, 8 taking place June 12-July 13, 2014. 9 "WHEREAS, It is the sense of this 10 Legislative Body, in keeping with its time-honored traditions, to recognize and pay 11 tribute to those events which bring the world 12 together and foster national pride; and 13 14 "WHEREAS, Attendant to this concern, 15 and in full accord with its long-standing traditions, this Legislative Body is justly proud 16 to commemorate the playing of the 20th FIFA World 17 18 Cup in Brazil; and 19 "WHEREAS, The quadrennial FIFA World 20 Cup is an event which draws hundreds of millions of viewers from across the globe and inspires 21 22 nations to join together in common interest; and "WHEREAS, The nation of Brazil, 23 winner of five past World Cups, the most of any 24 25 nation, will play host to the 2014 World Cup,

1 which will be played between the 12th of June and 2 the 13th of July, 2014; and 3 "WHEREAS, Thirty-two nations from 4 all six inhabited continents will be represented 5 and vying for the title of World Champions; and "WHEREAS, The popularity of world 6 football in the United States and New York has 7 8 continued to grow at a rapid pace; and 9 "WHEREAS, In keeping with New York's 10 status as a true national and cultural melting pot, the 2014 World Cup is of special and abiding 11 12 interest to our diverse population; and 13 "WHEREAS, Outside of Brazil there is 14 no more fitting a place than New York to 15 experience the passion and pride that only the world's game can stir in the hearts of fans and 16 non-fans alike; now, therefore, be it 17 18 "RESOLVED, That this Legislative Body pause in its deliberations to commemorate 19 20 the 2014 FIFA World Cup Brazil commencing on 21 Thursday, June 12, 2014." 22 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator Peralta. 23 24 SENATOR PERALTA: Thank you, 25 Mr. President.

We often hear soccer referred to as 1 2 a religion because it has stirred such strong and postural emotions in millions and millions of 3 people all over the world. And that's certainly 4 5 the case in my community. I am lucky enough to represent the 6 7 most diverse Senate district in New York and one of the most diverse in the entire country. 8 There are 32 nations represented in this world's 9 10 World Cup, and I'm pretty sure I have people from pretty much all 32 of those nations, plus many 11 12 more, living in my Senate district. In an immigrant community like mine, 13 14 el rey del deporte is about much more than 15 cheering passionately for your home country. Ιt is about bringing people together. 16 The language of soccer is spoken 17 18 every day in the parks, playgrounds and blacktops 19 of my district and other communities all across 20 this great state of ours. That universal language makes it easier for newcomers to 21 communicate and socialize and to learn about and 22 appreciate the diversity of this great state. 23 Soccer isn't just a connection to the home 24 25 country, it is a hugely important tie to this

1	country, the United States, the new home country.
2	The 2014 World Cup is being played
3	in Brazil, but soccer is the world's game, and
4	New York is the world's city. And in my
5	district, at least, we plan on giving Brazil a
6	run for its money when it comes to excitement.
7	Across the world, more than
8	800 million people are expected to watch this
9	World Cup. A couple hundred thousand of these
10	people will be right in my district, in bars and
11	coffee shops and private homes, and people will
12	join together to cheer for the country the
13	country of their birth and their new home
14	country. And kids will be inspired to take up
15	the world's sport, and soccer will continue to
16	grow in this country.
17	For one month this summer, the eyes
18	of the world will be focused on a singular event,
19	and we will all be better for it. Let us all
20	speak the language of soccer and join together to
21	celebrate our diversity and the strength it
22	brings us. Que viva the World Cup!
23	ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Thank
24	you, Senator Peralta.
25	The resolution was adopted on

June 17th of 2014. 1 2 Senator DeFrancisco. 3 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes, would 4 you now take up previously adopted Resolution 5 Number 5821, by Senator Peralta, and read the title only. 6 7 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The 8 Secretary will read. 9 THE SECRETARY: Legislative 10 Resolution Number 5821, by Senator Peralta, commemorating the 204th anniversary of Colombia's 11 12 Declaration of Independence on July 20, 2014. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 13 Senator Peralta. 14 15 SENATOR PERALTA: Thank you, 16 Mr. President. This year marks the 204th year of 17 18 Colombian independence. Colombia celebrates 19 Independence Day each year on July 20th. This 20 day commemorates the Declaration of Independence 21 made on that date of 1810. Even though it took 22 another nine years to achieve full independence from Spain, Colombians annually celebrate the 23 first Grito de la Independencia, or the "Cry for 24 25 independence."

1 Colombian independence is an 2 occasion of great celebration in my district, 3 which is home to La Pequeña Colombia, or Little 4 Colombia, and generations of Colombian families, 5 including that of actor and comedian John Leguizamo, who grew up in Jackson Heights. 6 The 7 festivities in Queens include a celebration in Flushing Meadows Park, where tens of thousands of 8 New Yorkers gather to enjoy Colombian food, song 9 10 and dance, and are witness to see many elected officials that are present. 11 Like the United States, Colombia has 12 a long tradition of constitutional government. 13 The United States and Colombia are good friends 14 15 and allies, the relationship forged by a love for democracy, the rule of law, and liberty. 16 By way of this resolution, we extend 17 18 our best wishes to our Colombian-American friends across the state in advance of this important and 19 20 joyful day. 21 Thank you, Mr. President, and 22 que viva Colombia! One thing, colleagues, that we -- in 17 18 fact, there are two things that we learn about freedom. One of them is that freedom is not 19 20 free, that you're going to pay greatly for it. And another one is that it can't be repressed, 21 22 you can't hide it. 23 We need only to look at what's 24 happening in Iraq today to understand that 25 freedom is under attack and it will have to be

paid for in blood and treasure and every other 1 2 way. But to the people who are trying to keep 3 freedom from the people of Iraq, let them be 4 aware you can't repress it. 5 We have the example of America for At the end of a great civil war in this 6 that. 7 country, the American South was devastated and a new economy had to come about. There were many 8 who were captives of the old way, the old way of 9 10 doing things. And many of these people decided 11 that they were going to keep the enslaved on the 12 plantations, they would not tell them that they were free. 13 14 So the enslaved continued to work 15 not knowing that they had been legally freed. However, freedom cannot be repressed. The word 16 of their freedom finally got to them at different 17 18 times and different places. These days that they got, we lump them together and we call them now 19 20 Juneteenth, Juneteenth. Somewhere in June they got the word that they were free, and a whole new 21 22 American South was brought into existence. It cannot be hidden, and we have 23 learned this. And we encourage the people all 24 25 over the world that when you hear of this great

1 freedom, to go for it. Juneteenth is a 2 celebration of freedom, and I encourage everyone in this country to realize it and to participate 3 4 in it. 5 Thank you very much, Mr. President. This bill addresses the very tragic 6 7 incident that occurred in New York City just a few days ago, on June 1st, when Daniel 8 St. Hubert, recently discharged from a state 9 10 correctional facility, brutally stabbed and murdered a little boy, P.J. Avitto, in a New York 11 12 City elevator, and his friend Mikayla Capers, age 7, stabbed her 15 times. P.J. was just 13 6 years old. 14 15 Obviously there was a massive system failure in that this person, this violent 16 mentally ill person, diagnosed with 17 18 schizophrenia, tried to kill his mother -- that's why he was in prison -- had 12 incidents of 19 20 violence while he was incarcerated, attacked a police officer, attacked a corrections officer, 21 22 and yet he was dumped on the street with barely any follow-up attention. 23 This bill today would address a 24 25 small piece of that situation, because the parole

officer in this case allegedly was going to the 1 2 supervisor and saying that this person needed to have involuntary inpatient treatment, and no one 3 listened. No one listened. 4 5 So this is a way to allow parole officers to petition for involuntary inpatient б 7 treatment. But this is just a small piece of it. 8 Just this week we passed Kendra's 9 Law, which would close every single loophole. 10 Let's face it, we have a crisis in this state. We have a crisis with the untreated mental 11 12 illness of people who have violent tendencies, and we're not taking action. 13 So today is a step forward. 14 I'm 15 glad we're passing this legislation. 1 This legislation would complement 2 what the Justice Center is already working on in making sure that we end abuse, neglect, 3 4 maltreatment of our most vulnerable populations. 5 What this legislation does is requires the Justice Center to have procedures in б 7 place when they are investigating abuses of 8 activity when dealing with someone with special 9 needs and making sure that their clinical 10 information is used in that case, to make sure 11 that the investigator can do their investigation 12 the most effective way while making sure that it's done in a safe manner that doesn't adversely 13 affect our most vulnerable populations. 14 15 Thank you, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Thank 16 you, Senator Carlucci. 17 18 Senator Krueger. 19 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you, 20 Mr. President. If the sponsor would please 21 yield. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 22 Senator 23 Carlucci, do you yield? SENATOR CARLUCCI: 24 Yes. 25 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator

1 Carlucci yields. 2 Senator Krueger. SENATOR KRUEGER: 3 Thank you. I 4 appreciate the sponsor's explanation, but I feel 5 I need some more detail. I agree we should be moving 6 7 legislation that allows and ensures the 8 Justice Center can meet its mandate by completing effectively and quickly its investigations of 9 10 complaints. But my understanding from some 11 parents --12 SENATOR CARLUCCI: I'm sorry, I can't hear Senator Krueger. 13 14 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 15 Krueger, could you talk into the mike? 16 And can I have some order in the chamber again. And I'm going to ask one more 17 18 time so the members can hear each other as they 19 converse and debate. 20 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 22 Carlucci -- Senator Krueger, you want to ask 23 another question, right? 24 SENATOR KRUEGER: No, I was going 25 to try to answer so that he could hear me.

ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: All 1 2 right, go ahead, Senator Krueger. 3 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 4 I have some parents who have raised 5 issues of concern that this bill might allow providers of services to avoid being investigated 6 7 because they will argue that interviewing the 8 person who we believe has been harmed would be 9 problematic. 10 So would the sponsor explain to me how we can assure people that this bill won't 11 12 unintentionally prevent the Justice Center from doing what they need to do by allowing the 13 provider of services to claim that the 14 15 Justice Center shouldn't interview the victim? 16 SENATOR CARLUCCI: I thank the Senator for bringing up that point, because it's 17 18 a very important point to point out. 19 On page 2 of the legislation, lines 20 13 to 19, it explains exactly that issue. That's 21 something that we want to prevent against and why we put it specifically in the legislation. 22 23 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to 24 25 yield.

1 SENATOR CARLUCCI: Yes. 2 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The 3 sponsor yields. 4 SENATOR KRUEGER: And that's in the 5 new A-print modification of the bill, amended bill, is that correct? 6 7 SENATOR CARLUCCI: That's right. 8 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 9 And through you, Mr. President, if 10 the sponsor would continue to yield. SENATOR CARLUCCI: 11 Yes. 12 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The sponsor yields. 13 14 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 15 I understand also in the bill that 16 there's a timeline for the department I guess to come up with protocols and procedures for how to 17 18 go forward with investigations in the future. I 19 certainly do agree it's important that there be 20 written protocols and procedures so that everyone 21 can know exactly what kind of process will be 22 used when going forward with investigations. 23 Is there a time frame by which the Justice Center or the affiliated agencies must 24 produce these protocols and procedures? 25

1 SENATOR CARLUCCI: So on page 3 of 2 the legislation it details lines 3 through 8 that detail exactly the time frame. We want them to 3 4 be developed by January 1st. We want them to be 5 finalized by April 1st of 2015. SENATOR KRUEGER: 6 Through you, 7 Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to 8 yield. 9 SENATOR CARLUCCI: Yes. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 10 The sponsor yields. 11 12 SENATOR KRUEGER: Again, some people who have raised concerns to me feel that 13 14 as family members of someone who may be in an 15 institutional setting and may have been abused and had an investigation opened into what 16 happened, that they the family members should be 17 18 immediately notified that this has happened and 19 that there is investigation taking place. 20 Is there anything in this bill that 21 requires notification of the family members about 22 the circumstances of what's happened? 23 SENATOR CARLUCCI: The Yes. And 24 Senator brings up another excellent point. 25 that's on page 2, line 20, the notification of

family relatives. 1 2 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, Mr. President, on the bill. 3 4 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 5 Krueger on the bill. SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 6 7 I think there's a lot of questions 8 many people in the State of New York still have 9 about the Justice Center, where it's gone and 10 where it's going, what's happening. And the certainly the concerns I was hearing from 11 constituents were on the earlier version of the 12 bill that has now been amended. 13 And I have to say I think that we 14 15 are making progress. This may not be the 16 solution or a full solution to concerns, but I have no problem with supporting the bill. 17 18 Thank you, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 19 Is there 20 any other Senator wishing to be heard? 21 Senator Tkaczyk. 22 SENATOR TKACZYK: Thank you, Mr. President. 23 And I want to thank Senator Carlucci 24 25 for recognizing that we need to protect our very

1 vulnerable citizens. I think this legislation 2 moves in the right direction. I voted no initially, but with the changes I'll be voting 3 4 yes. 5 But I do have a concern that the protocols and procedures described in this bill 6 7 will not be put into effect until April 15th. 8 And until that time I think it would be very important that parents, legal guardians or a 9 10 representative of the Mental Hygiene Legal Services be connected to that resident who's 11 being interviewed. 12 13 And I actually have legislation that does that, and it would start immediately. It's 14 15 Senate Bill 7671A, which I think would be a strong companion to this legislation today. 16 Because I agree we have to protect our vulnerable 17 18 citizens, and making sure that they have the 19 appropriate person with them when they're being 20 interrogated or interviewed is really critical. 21 So I applaud Senator Carlucci for 22 moving this legislation forward and urge my colleagues to also move forward 7671A. 23 24 Thank you. 25 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Is there

any other Senator wishing to be heard? 1 2 Seeing none, hearing none, debate is The Secretary will ring the bell. 3 closed. 4 The Secretary will read the last 5 section. THE SECRETARY: Section 4. This 6 7 act shall take effect immediately. 8 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Call the 9 roll. 10 (The Secretary called the roll.) ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 11 Some 12 order in the chamber, please. 13 I'm going to ask members to stay close to their desks because we have two 14 15 remaining bills on the controversial calendar and 16 the votes will be coming quickly. The Secretary will announce the 17 18 results. 19 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 57. 20 Absent from voting: Senators 21 Sampson and Young. 22 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The bill is passed. 23 Senator Libous. 24 25 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, I

believe -- I believe, I believe. We will take up 1 2 1101, by Senator DeFrancisco. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 3 The 4 Secretary will take up Calendar 1101, by Senator 5 DeFrancisco. Again, I urge members to remain 6 7 close to the chamber. 8 The Secretary will read. 9 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 10 1101, substituted earlier by Member of the Assembly Magnarelli, Assembly Print 9864A, an act 11 12 to amend the Alcoholic Beverage Control Law. 13 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 14 Krueger, why do you rise? 15 SENATOR KRUEGER: If the sponsor 16 would yield to some questions. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 18 DeFrancisco, do you yield to questions? 19 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. 20 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 22 Krueger. 23 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. My understanding is this is a bill 24 25 that would allow an exception or exemption from

New York State tied house laws to allow an 1 2 establishment who has ownership of some liquor companies to also operate a retail on-premise 3 4 site that sells liquor and food. Is that 5 correct? SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: 6 Yes. 7 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, Mr. President, if the sponsor will continue to 8 9 yield. 10 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The 11 12 sponsor yields. 13 Again, the chamber is getting a little noisy. I want the members to be able to 14 15 hear each other, particularly Senator DeFrancisco 16 and Senator Krueger. 17 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 18 And for the record, I've actually 19 supported a bill that's not exactly the same, to 20 allow a company to sell wine that that company 21 also owns a winery but they agreed. And in the 22 bill it says we will not be selling wine made by our winery, only other people's products. 23 Does this bill allow the company 24 25 running the restaurant/bar to sell their own

liquor products? 1 2 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: No. 3 SENATOR KRUEGER: Just to repeat, so this bill does not allow them to sell their 4 5 own liquor? SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: 6 I thought you 7 said does it prevent them from selling their own 8 liquor. 9 SENATOR KRUEGER: I'm sorry, does 10 it allow them to sell --SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: The answer to 11 12 the first question is no. The answer to the second question is yes. 13 14 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 15 So through you, Mr. President, if 16 the sponsor would continue to yield. 17 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. 18 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The 19 sponsor yields. 20 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. So it 21 would allow them to sell their own liquor 22 products if this became the law? 23 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. But the special -- this is Margaritaville, by the way. 24 25 Their specialty drinks, however, are only

approximately 5 percent of the alcohol sales. 1 2 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, 3 Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to 4 yield. 5 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 6 The 7 sponsor yields. 8 SENATOR KRUEGER: The other thing that stood out to me when I saw the bill was that 9 10 rather than it naming the company, which the sponsor just did name, and a specific address for 11 a specific company, it describes the boundaries 12 of a specific piece of land within a much large 13 shopping center. 14 15 Are there any other bills relating 16 to SLA or tied house where it's not the bill for a specific company for a specific activity but 17 18 rather the geography where that company might be at this moment? 19 20 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: If you Yes. look at the bill, the boldface parts of the bill 21 22 are the parts that deal with this particular entity. There are several others within the bill 23 that will have metes and bounds descriptions. 24 Ι 25 don't know what they're for specifically, but

they're described in a similar fashion. 1 2 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, 3 Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to 4 yield. 5 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: б The 7 sponsor yields. 8 SENATOR KRUEGER: So the bill 9 describes multiple metes and boundaries. Are 10 they all to allow this type of exemption from the 11 tied house laws, or just this one set of metes and boundaries specific to alcohol? 12 13 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: This particular metes and bounds description sets 14 15 forth that portion of an existing mall in 16 Syracuse, New York, that would be leased by Margaritaville if they're allowed to sell the 17 18 product as they sell the product in every other 19 Margaritaville facility. 20 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, 21 Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to 22 vield. 23 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The 24 25 sponsor yields.

1 SENATOR KRUEGER: So do they have 2 other Margaritaville facilities in New York State 3 where they already have the right to do this? 4 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: I have no 5 idea. 6 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, 7 Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to 8 vield. 9 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 10 The sponsor yields. 11 SENATOR KRUEGER: And do we know of 12 any other situations in New York State law where 13 other companies, not Margaritaville, have been 14 15 allowed this exemption from the law? 16 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: I don't know the specific circumstances behind each of the 17 18 exemptions. But as you can see, there's many 19 exemptions in the bill. This simply adds one 20 additional one. 21 I didn't go forward to check out the 22 descriptions of each to determine, well, who else 23 had the description, who had the exemption, I just believe that this was a legitimate reason 24 25 for an exemption and to bring in a large business

1 to our community. 2 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, 3 Mr. President, if the sponsor would continue to 4 yield. 5 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 6 The 7 sponsor yields. 8 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. 9 So this section of the bill with the 10 metes and boundaries specific to this Margaritaville within this shopping mall says 11 12 that it will be applicable to the entity having this lease. I'll just look for the exact 13 sentence while I say that to you. I think it's 14 15 page 10, starting with line 22 and going down. 16 Does that mean that if the lease changes at some time in the future they could 17 18 expand to a different geography either within the 19 mall or apply it to the whole mall if there was a 20 change in the lease language? 21 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Page 10 from 22 line 22 down, that basically deals with a previous exemption, not the one we're dealing 23 with today. As you can see, it's an exemption 24 25 that was granted to somebody in the borough of

1 Manhattan, of which you may be familiar. 2 SENATOR KRUEGER: You know what, I 3 think we are -- excuse me, Mr. President, a 4 clarification. I am looking at what's called 5 page 10 in the center middle of the bill, but it in printout does appear to be page 12 of 49. So 6 7 I think we're just talking about which page number we're looking at. You're looking at the 8 9 A print and we're looking at the original. 10 So, excuse me, it's the section that says --11 12 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: I apologize, I was looking at the print that was on the 13 calendar today. 14 15 SENATOR KRUEGER: You know what, I 16 apologize. Mr. President, through you, I apologize, I don't think this --17 18 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Apologies accepted. 19 20 (Laughter.) 21 SENATOR KRUEGER: It's the 22 section --23 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 24 Krueger, are you asking the sponsor to yield, to 25 continue to yield?

1 SENATOR KRUEGER: I am asking him 2 to continue to yield, thank you. 3 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes, I yield. 4 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The 5 sponsor yields. Continue. At a moment like this, one can only 6 7 wonder what would Jimmy Buffett do. 8 (Laughter.) 9 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 10 DeFrancisco yields. Senator Krueger, you may continue. 11 12 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Mr. President, what did you say? I wasn't paying 13 14 attention to you. 15 (Laughter.) 16 SENATOR KRUEGER: I think the ball is in my court. Would the sponsor continue to 17 18 yield? 19 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes. 20 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The 21 sponsor yields. 22 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you. So the section of bill that I intend 23 to be referencing -- and the page number has 24 25 changed between the A print and this print -- is

1 that all that certain piece or parcel of land 2 situated in the City of Syracuse, County of 3 Onondaga, State of New York, lying generally 4 northwesterly of the West Hiawatha Boulevard, 5 et cetera, being a portion of Lot 11I and 11J of the Carousel Center Subdivision, et cetera, 6 7 et cetera, et cetera. Are we are looking at the same text 8 even if not the same page? 9 10 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yeah, I --11 generally, yes. Okay. 12 SENATOR KRUEGER: So it 13 seems to apply specifically to a lease agreement. 14 So my question was if they change 15 the lease tomorrow, three years from now, five years from now, does it suddenly in statute apply 16 to whatever that lease might say for whomever and 17 18 wherever? Because I'm not sure I can find any other SLA exemption law specific to the lease. 19 20 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: The answer is If they change the location in the mall or 21 no. decided to move someplace else, they would have 22 to apply for an additional exemption. 23 In fact, that was a very big concern 24 25 of mine, because I wanted to make sure that this

1 particular lease wasn't a floating lease, as 2 some -- well, I'd better not say it. That it was specific so it would not be misused and used for 3 4 other things later on. 5 We checked with the SLA. They double-checked the language. And it's specific 6 7 to where this facility will go in that mall, and it's location-specific. It can't float around. 8 9 SENATOR KRUEGER: Through you, 10 Mr. President, on the bill. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 11 Senator 12 Krueger on the bill. 13 SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank the sponsor for his answers. 14 15 The tied house laws are intended -and they're very old, and so sometimes you might 16 say why do we even bother with such old laws. 17 18 But the part of the tied house laws that I actually like and support is the concept that if 19 20 you are in the liquor-manufacturing business, you can't control bars and restaurant liquor such 21 22 that you could develop monopoly control over a market. Where if you went and bought up all the 23 bars in a certain geography or in the entire 24 25 State of New York, you could actually figure out

1	how to only sell your liquor products in the
2	locations, and you had all the locations.
3	That's actually happened in some
4	states and some countries who have highlighted
5	that you end up with an enormous monopoly power
6	of a very small number of companies. Some people
7	would say that actually for beer, that's almost
8	already happened in this country when you look at
9	the variety of major beer manufacturers actually
10	all being owned by one of two companies.
11	And that the tied house laws
12	actually help to protect almost the mom-and-pop
13	restaurants and bars from a Walmart model, so to
14	speak, for bars and restaurants, and help protect
15	that there can be competition by people who
16	manufacture and sell liquor and beer.
17	Now, we have some exemptions to that
18	in law. Some of them are referenced in this bill
19	of Senator DeFrancisco. Some have actually been
20	discussed quite recently, with the various small
21	brewery and hard cider and craft beer exemptions
22	that we have made in law in New York State
23	recently, all of which I support and think are
24	very good ideas.
25	I also don't think it's the

intention of the sponsor to open up that door 1 2 widely to the possibility of monopoly control by Jimmy Buffett or anyone else. But my concern is 3 4 this can be seen as a precedent in the future for 5 someone else to argue, Well, now New York State has said you can get an exemption from tied house 6 7 laws and sell your own product in that location. And I think that that is a slippery slope. 8

9 I'm also concerned that the way the 10 bill is written, in respect and disagreement with the sponsor, it could be interpreted that the 11 12 entire mall somehow can be exempted if the language in a future lease was changed, a lease 13 that would not have to come before us or the SLA, 14 15 perhaps not even be filed anywhere. And that the way it's written, it could be a different company 16 who took over the lease and the space in the 17 18 future who would also be grandfathered into this exemption from our law. 19

And so while I am not saying that I oppose any and all changes in tied house law -- I am not -- and I am not saying, as I said before, that I have a problem with exemptions to tied house rules that make explicit if part of your company is involved with liquor production, then

1 you can never have a bar or a restaurant. Ι 2 don't think that the two should mingle. So that 3 if you agree that you're going to have a 4 restaurant or a bar and you're also in the liquor 5 industry, fine, just agree not to have that liquor sold in that bar or restaurant. 6 7 And again, the sponsor volunteered 8 that he believed that only 5 percent of the liquor sold in Margaritavilles is owned by 9 10 companies also owned by Mr. Buffett or his corporate entity. Maybe he decides to buy eight 11 12 other liquor companies tomorrow and then a hundred percent of the liquor being sold in 13 14 Margaritaville is owned by the same company. 15 So to get my point, I think that there's a slippery slope. I think that the State 16 of New York should think very carefully whether 17 18 it wants to open that door and have this as the example of how we make a decision and then can't 19 20 really say no to anyone else. 21 So I'll be voting no on the bill. Thank you, Mr. President. 22 Thank ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 23 you, Senator Krueger. 24 25 Senator DeFrancisco.

SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: 1 Yes. Senator 2 Krueger is correct in my intent is to make this will very specific for one location in one 3 4 specific mall. I did not -- I had the same 5 concerns as her in drafting this bill, that it would be used to support a facility or a company 6 7 like this anyplace in the mall, and that we shouldn't create monopolies. 8 9 And even in the mall itself, this 10 would not be a monopoly. There's many, many 11 restaurants, many, many bars in those restaurants 12 selling many, many drinks. And the chance that this would become a monopoly even in a mall is 13 slim and none. 14 15 As far as this particular lessee buying up other properties or going to other 16 locations in order to get a monopoly, the reason 17 18 they can't is this bill, basically, that you have to have an exception passed by the Legislature 19 20 before you can start eating up other locations. And that's precisely why these are exceptions, 21 22 not granting general authority to do what is prohibited by the original bill. 23 So I think the safeguards are here, 24 25 and I think the bill is a bill that should be

1 passed. 2 Thank you, Mr. President. 3 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Thank 4 you, Senator DeFrancisco. 5 Is any other Senator that wishes to 6 be heard? 7 Seeing and hearing none, the debate 8 is closed. The Secretary will ring the bell. Read the last section. 9 10 THE SECRETARY: Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 11 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Call the 12 13 roll. (The Secretary called the roll.) 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Announce 16 the results. 17 THE SECRETARY: In relation to 18 Calendar 1101, those recorded in the negative are 19 Senators Krueger, Perkins, Rivera, Sanders and 20 Stavisky. 21 Absent from voting: Senator 22 Sampson. 23 Ayes, 53. Nays, 5. 24 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The bill 25 is passed.

1 Senator Libous, that completes the 2 controversial reading of the original active 3 list. 4 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, 5 could you call on Senator Gianaris, please? Go back to motions and call on Senator Gianaris. 6 7 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: We will 8 return to motions. 9 Senator Gianaris. 10 SENATOR GIANARIS: Mr. President, on behalf of Senator Espaillat, please remove the 11 12 sponsor star from Calendar 1090. 13 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The star is removed and is so ordered. 14 15 Senator Libous. 16 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, in trying to keep things moving along -- which we've 17 18 done a good job, and I want to thank all the members -- we have a little downtime in the 19 20 schedule right now. So the Senate will stand at 21 ease until 3:00 p.m. 22 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The 23 Senate stands at ease until 3:00 p.m. SENATOR LIBOUS: 24 I'm sorry, 25 Mr. President.

1 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: One 2 The Senate will come back to order. minute. 3 (Laughter.) 4 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, I 5 was going to ask you if you could un-ease the ease and call on Senator Serrano, please. 6 7 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: It's 8 5 o'clock somewhere, right, Senator Serrano? 9 SENATOR SERRANO: Yes. 10 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator Serrano. 11 12 SENATOR SERRANO: Thank you, Mr. President and Senator Libous. 13 I would like to announce that the 14 15 Senate Democratic Conference will meet at 2:30 in 16 Room 315. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: The 18 Senate Democratic Conference will meet at 2:30 p.m. in Room 315. 19 20 The Senate stands temporarily at 21 ease until 3:00 p.m. 22 (Whereupon, the Senate stood at ease 23 at 1:37 p.m.) (Whereupon, the Senate reconvened at 24 25 5:07 p.m.)

point out we're living in a world where more and 1 2 more frequently we give someone a credit card, we 3 sign a piece of paper, and suddenly we're paying 4 for life. And unless you actively realize and 5 stop the service, you're paying for life. And in this example, it's elderly 6 7 and disabled people who, to be honest, are the most likely to get confused, to get lost in the 8 process and the paperwork. And it's forcing them 9 10 into a situation where they may end up paying for a service they don't use for years at a time. 11 12 I vote no, Mr. President. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 13 Senator 14 Krueger to be recorded in the negative. 15 Senator Ranzenhofer to explain his 16 vote. SENATOR RANZENHOFER: 17 Thank you, 18 Mr. Chairman. Just very briefly on the bill. 19 As Senator Krueger pointed out, 20 we've debated this bill extensively over the last couple of years. 5	at the liability that the State University of
6	New York is facing in relation to Long Island
7	College Hospital, the State University has
8	frankly done a terrible, terrible job here. And
9	it has cost the university system and my local
10	community enormously.
11	The truth is over the last 16 or
12	18 months, we have had a hospital in crisis run
13	by SUNY in the heart of Brooklyn, in the heart of
14	my district. And rather than work
15	collaboratively, rather than work transparently,
16	rather than protect the students from the kind of
17	liability that could lead to tuition increases,
18	and rather than protect the community from the
19	loss of healthcare and its replacement with
20	hundreds or a thousand units of luxury condos, we
21	have had an agency that has thumbed their nose
22	again and again and again.
23	The mistakes and the over
24	\$100 million that SUNY has racked up here should
25	not be put on the students, must not be done with

1 tuition increases. But I also don't feel comfortable sitting here today and saying you 2 3 know what, after SUNY has operated in this way, 4 after SUNY has caused these challenges, they 5 should be let go free and clear. The state needs to come in and work 6 7 with SUNY. Senator LaValle has already shown a great deal of leadership working with them, 8 pressuring them, making sure this works. But the 9 10 idea that SUNY can operate this way, essentially saying we don't care about the costs we're 11 12 racking up for the students and we don't care 13 about the healthcare needs for a community, is 14 unacceptable. 15 So I'm going to vote no today because SUNY can't be let off free and clear. 16 What we should be doing is we should be figuring 17 18 out how to protect the students and how to reform 19 SUNY so that in the future they can never do this 20 aqain. I think this is half of what we have to do. I also would like to see the other half. 21 So with a thank you to 22 Senator LaValle and a lot of respect for moving 23 this forward, I'm going to vote no on this bill 24 25 today because we need to see the reforms as well.

15	in the circumstances described through this
16	legislation, we should not leave it to collective
17	bargaining.

SENATOR GIPSON: 1 Thank you, 2 Mr. President. I just want to take a brief moment 3 4 to state how much this bill exemplifies 5 everything that we should be doing here in this State Senate. And today we are doing the one 6 7 thing that I know we were all brought here to do, 8 which is to help people. 9 And I want to thank Senator Hannon 10 for his efforts in bringing this bill to the 11 floor. 12 I know in my district, people that have been suffering from chronic Lyme disease, 13 tick-borne illness, and other forms of Lyme 14 15 disease, have been asking us for a long time to 16 pass a bill like this. This will offer a great amount of relief to families that are truly 17 18 suffering, that are going bankrupt, they're 19 mortgaging their homes, trying to find a way to 20 deal with this devastating disease. 21 This lays the foundation for more work that we have to do in the future, and I will 22 be voting aye. 23 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 24 Senator 25 Gipson to be recorded in the affirmative.

Senator Hannon to explain his vote. 1 2 SENATOR LIBOUS: Mr. President, I'd 3 like some order in the chamber, please. 4 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: May we 5 have some order in the chamber, please. 6 Senator Hannon. 7 SENATOR HANNON: Thank you, 8 Mr. President. 9 Today the Task Force of the Senate 10 Majority on Lyme and Tick-Borne Diseases made its 11 full recommendations public. Among those 12 recommendations are this very bill before us. There will be also a resolution to the federal 13 14 government. And very importantly, there are 15 recommendations to be implemented by the state. This bill -- and it was a result of 16 conversations by the members of the task force at 17 18 our meeting, with Senator LaValle and Senator Little, Senator Carlucci, Senator Grisanti, 19 20 Senator Marchione, Senator Ball and Senator Larkin -- embodies a set of principles that have 21 been adopted by the Office of Professional 22 Conduct as to how they would proceed in regard to 23 investigations, and basically says that they will 24 25 not go after any physician if that physician is

just solely pursuing a course of medical 1 2 treatment that, while not everybody believes in it, that doctor does believe in it. 3 4 And for that reason we think it will 5 calm many fears, it will allow people to proceed with fighting a very tough disease. Most people 6 7 who have to put up with the plague of ticks that we find in New York are easily cured by either 8 removal or a short course of antibiotics; others 9 10 don't. And it's those other people who don't get quick relief that suffer. We have advanced a 11 12 broad array of recommendations in order to try to get an action plan for this state, deal with 13 14 prevention, deal with treatment, deal with 15 research. So there's a lot more to do, but 16 this is the only piece of legislation from the 17 18 recommendations, and I'm glad we're passing it tonight. 19 20 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator Hannon to be recorded in the affirmative. 21 22 Senator LaValle to explain his vote. SENATOR LaVALLE: Mr. President, I 23 want to take this opportunity to thank 24 25 Senator Hannon for his leadership.

1 And as part of that leadership, he 2 provided each member giving their input so that 3 there was, in the report that was issued today, 4 unanimity. And that's a great thing of 5 leadership. And on that bill that we are passing 6 7 today, it's a very simple but effective approach to a very, very knotty problem that impeded 8 physicians from moving forward to use a modality 9 10 that they felt or feel is a proper one. You know, for years in 6 7 Lower Manhattan there's been a school overcrowding task force convened by Speaker 8 Silver in which folks have participated. 9 The 10 reason we've had that is we have a residential population that is expanding enormously and with 11 12 it, in a way that I think people may never have predicted, a school-age population that is 13 expanding enormously. 14 15 In fact, when you talk about the prediction of that school-age population 16 expansion, the Department of Education and the 17 18 School Construction Authority literally did not 19 predict it. Again and again and again, their projections vastly underestimated the 20 21 expectations of what we were going to have for a 22 school-age population in Lower Manhattan. 23 But someone did predict it accurately. A local constituent, a guy named 24 25 Eric Greenleaf, again and again and again over

1	
1	the last seven years has predicted the population
2	growth of the school-age population much more
3	accurately than the School Construction
4	Authority. He didn't do it through wizardry or
5	magic, though it sometimes appeared to be, he did
6	it by using data from the Department of Health
7	and Mental Hygiene and the Department of City
8	Planning and the Department of Housing
9	Preservation and Development, the Department of
10	Buildings. And he actually looked at what we
11	should expect in Lower Manhattan when it came to
12	the school-age population.
13	For years the School Construction
14	Authority and the Department of Education ignored
15	his projections. More recently, to their great
16	credit, they have started to use some of the same
17	methodology that Eric Greenleaf has been using
18	through the school overcrowding task force that
19	Speaker Silver has convened.
20	But well beyond Lower Manhattan,
21	across the bridges in my district in Brooklyn,
22	we're seeing overcrowding that breaks any
23	expectation and prediction. In the districts of
24	many of my colleagues across the City of
25	New York, we have seen school-age populations

where the Department of Education and the School 1 Construction Authority seem shocked and 2 unprepared for the kind of school-age population 3 4 we have. 5 What this bill does is it requires for the first time that all of those other 6 7 agencies, all of the best information on the school-age population is used when the five-year 8 capital plan for school construction comes out. 9 10 It requires that when school sitings happen, that same data is used. 11 12 And it goes beyond that. For the first time that data is going to be distributed 13 not just for school districts -- and school 14 15 districts are pretty wacky lines. They cross neighborhoods, they across all over the place --16 it's going to be done on the community board 17 18 level. That means that community boards and 19 communities are going to know what the projection 20 for school population is in their neighborhoods for the first time ever, on the five-year capital 21 22 plan and on individual sitings. And when those public hearings 23 24 happen, when the plans are being finalized, for 25 the first time the School Construction Authority

is going to have to respond to the public comment 1 they get. So that people like Eric Greenleaf or 2 3 the other experts, local community members that 4 are doing a better job of projecting school-age 5 population than the agency is, can no longer be ignored and can no longer be forgotten. 6 7 Look, we have a good problem. We have more and more families who want to stay in 8 New York City, more and more families who want to 9 10 send their kids to the public schools in New York 11 City. But that's a problem that means we need to 12 do a better job as a government of predicting where we're going to have a need to educate those 13 14 kids. Overcrowded schools damage every student's 15 education who attends those schools and begin to tear communities apart. 16

People like my wife and I, whose oldest son is three, the knowledge that you're going to have a seat in your local school is fundamental to your ability to make a life and invest in your community in New York City. This bill will make the projections and the plans for school population much better.

I want to thank all the members of this house forsupporting this bill. I want to thank Senator

1 Golden for working with me on this bill. I'll be 2 voting aye. And for all of us who worry about 3 4 school overcrowding, not just in our families but 5 in our communities and our districts, this will hopefully make it a lot clearer, a lot better and 6 7 a lot less likely we have overcrowded schools. 8 Thank you, Mr. President. 9 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 10 Squadron to be recorded in the affirmative. 12	New York State where judges have determined that
13	it was clear to them the abuses took place but
14	unfortunately, because the intern doesn't receive
15	a paycheck, there was nothing the court system
16	could do.
17	So happily, after this becomes law,
18	we can all be assured that unpaid interns have
19	the same rights and protections as paid interns.
20	Unhappily, we will probably discover we need this
21	law, because unfortunately we still find cases
22	where people treat interns without the respect
23	they are due.

1 outside or certainly in our own homes, that a 2 call is made, at a minimum. Steven Kovacs would have been 3 4 27 years old today.
