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1 PROCEEDINGS 2 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: The 3 Senate will come to order. 4 I ask everyone present to please 5 rise and repeat with me the Pledge of Allegiance. 6 7 (Whereupon, the assemblage recited 8 the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.) 9 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: In the 10 absence of clergy, may we please bow our heads 11 for a moment of silence. 12 (Whereupon, the assemblage respected a moment of silence.) 13 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: 14 The 15 reading of the Journal. 16 THE SECRETARY: In Senate, Monday, 17 January 25th, the Senate met pursuant to 18 adjournment. The Journal of Sunday, 19 January 24th, was read and approved. On motion, 20 Senate adjourned. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Without objection, the Journal stands approved as read. 22 23 Presentation of petitions. Messages from the Assembly. 24 25 Messages from the Governor.

Reports of standing committees. 1 2 Reports of select committees. 3 Communications and reports from state officers. 4 Motions and resolutions. 5 Senator DeFrancisco. б 7 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes, 8 Mr. President. I move to amend Senate Bill 9 Number 5949B by striking out the amendments made 10 on January 21 and restoring it to its previous print number, 5949A. And that's for Senator 11 Griffo. 12 13 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: So ordered. 14 15 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Thank you. 16 Can we now have the noncontroversial -- excuse me, I forgot the 17 18 Resolution Calendar. One second. (Pause.) 19 All right, thank you. Now could we 20 please adopt the Resolution Calendar in its 21 entirety, except for -- nothing. Except for 22 nothing. Move to adopt the entire calendar. 23 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: All in favor of adopting the Resolution Calendar 24 25 signify by saying aye.

(Response of "Aye.") 1 2 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Opposed, 3 nay. 4 (No response.) 5 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: The Resolution Calendar is adopted. б 7 Senator DeFrancisco. 8 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: All right. 9 Now I believe there is a privileged resolution 10 previously adopted, by Senator Amedore -- that's Number 3244 -- at the desk. I ask that it be 11 12 read in its entirety and to call on 13 Senator Amedore. ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: 14 The 15 Secretary will read. Legislative 16 THE SECRETARY: 17 Resolution Number 3244, by Senator Amedore, 18 memorializing Governor Andrew M. Cuomo to 19 proclaim January 31, 2016, as Omphalocele 20 Awareness Day in the State of New York, in 21 conjunction with the observance of National 22 Omphalocele Awareness Day. 23 "WHEREAS, It is the custom of this Legislative Body to recognize official days that 24 25 are set aside to increase awareness of serious

health issues that affect the lives of citizens 1 2 of New York State; and 3 "WHEREAS, Attendant to such concern, 4 and in full accord with its long-standing 5 traditions, it is the sense of this Legislative Body to memorialize Governor Andrew M. Cuomo to 6 7 proclaim January 31, 2016, as Omphalocele 8 Awareness Day in the State of New York, in conjunction with the observance of National 9 10 Omphalocele Awareness Day as part of the Birth 11 Defects Prevention Month; and "WHEREAS, An omphalocele is a birth 12 defect that occurs early in pregnancy in which 13 14 the abdominal wall does not close properly and 15 some or most of the abdominal organs protrude on 16 the outside of the fetus' body through the umbilical cord; and 17 18 "WHEREAS, It is estimated that a 19 small omphalocele occurs in about 1 out of every 20 5,000 pregnancies, and a large or giant 21 omphalocele occurs in about 1 out of every 10,000 22 pregnancies; and 23 "WHEREAS, An omphalocele may be isolated or may be associated with other defects 24 25 or chromosomal abnormalities; and

1	"WHEREAS, Despite the challenges a
2	baby born with an omphalocele may face, many
3	babies who are born with an omphalocele survive
4	and go on to live happy, healthy lives; and
5	"WHEREAS, Mothers of Omphaloceles
6	(MOO) is a group of over 1,400 parents from
7	around the world that was created to provide
8	hope, support and information to families with
9	babies diagnosed with an omphalocele; and
10	"WHEREAS, It is the sense of this
11	Legislative Body to recognize MOO for their
12	courageous efforts to advocate for their children
13	and raise awareness that an omphalocele is a
14	treatable condition; and
15	"WHEREAS, It is imperative that
16	there be greater public awareness of this serious
17	health issue, and more must be done to increase
18	activity at the state, local and national levels
19	to support the patients, as well as their
20	families; now, therefore, be it
21	"RESOLVED, That this Legislative
22	Body pause in its deliberations to memorialize
23	Governor Andrew M. Cuomo to proclaim January 31,
24	2016, as Omphalocele Awareness Day in the State
25	of New York, in conjunction with the observance

1 of National Omphalocele Awareness Day; and be it 2 further "RESOLVED, That copies of this 3 4 resolution, suitably engrossed, be transmitted 5 to the Honorable Andrew M. Cuomo, Governor of the State of New York, and Mothers of Omphaloceles." 6 7 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Senator 8 Amedore. 9 SENATOR AMEDORE: Well, thank you, 10 Mr. President. 11 And today I am pleased to introduce 12 to this chamber a champion, who is a mighty champion because she is three years old, and 13 14 Reegan Crawford is one that has been diagnosed 15 with omphalocele when she was born. And that is, as we just heard, literally having some of your 16 organs -- your intestines, liver -- kind of 17 18 outside of your body. 19 But through the advancements of 20 medicine and our great physicians we have, there are cures. And we can announce today that along 21 with Reegan Crawford are her dad, Jacob; her mom, 22 Kellen; and her one-year-old sister, Delaney, 23 along with the MOOs up in the gallery. 24 25 And the MOOs are Moms of

Omphaloceles, fighting for the awareness and 1 2 making sure that we all are aware of this disease, because it does happen in births. And 3 we can make sure that we are aware of this and do 4 5 everything we can to help fight this scary diagnosis and disease for our future generations. 6 7 So to the Crawfords, thank you so 8 much for your mighty endeavor and continuing your 9 advocacy. 10 And to all the MOOs up in the gallery, thank you for your travels here and for 11 12 your support. 13 Thank you, Mr. President. 14 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Thank you, 15 Senator. 16 (Applause.) 17 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Floor 18 Leader. 19 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: 20 Mr. President, would you now recognize Senator 21 Stavisky. 22 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Senator 23 Stavisky. SENATOR STAVISKY: 24 Thank you, 25 Mr. President.

1 Very briefly, I too want to commend 2 the Crawford family. I've known Jake Crawford 3 from his days when he was a student -- in fact, 4 Student President at SUNY Albany. And he has 5 shown tremendous leadership on this issue, which I'd like to think he learned from his days 6 7 working in the State Senate. 8 We lead by example. And I know the 9 Crawford family has been through difficult times, 10 but I congratulate them on helping other people, because that is what we do. 11 12 Thank you very much. ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Thank you, 13 14 Senator. 15 Floor Leader. 16 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Would you now take up the noncontroversial reading of the 17 18 calendar. 19 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: The 20 Secretary will read. THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 18, 21 22 by Senator Martins, Senate Print 6387, an act to amend the State Finance Law. 23 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Read the 24 25 last section.

1 THE SECRETARY: Section 3. This 2 act shall take effect immediately. 3 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Call the roll. 4 5 (The Secretary called the roll.) ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Announce 6 7 the result. 8 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 46. 9 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: The bill 10 is passed. THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 23, 11 by Senator Little, Senate Print 6392, an act to 12 amend the Insurance Law. 13 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Read the 14 15 last section. 16 THE SECRETARY: Section 6. This act shall take effect on the same date and in the 17 18 same manner as Chapter 536 of the Laws of 2015. 19 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Call the 20 roll. 21 (The Secretary called the roll.) 22 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Announce the result. 23 THE SECRETARY: Ayes, 46. 24 25 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: The bill

1 is passed. 2 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 52, 3 by Senator Lanza, Senate Print 3709A, an act to 4 amend the General Municipal Law. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Read the last section. 6 7 THE SECRETARY: Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately. 8 9 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Call the 10 roll. (The Secretary called the roll.) 11 12 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Senator Golden to explain your vote. 13 14 SENATOR GOLDEN: On the bill, thank 15 you, sir. 16 Without this property tax cap, in New York City the property tax levy rose 17 18 7.7 percent in 2014. Property taxes increased by 19 6.3 percent in the last two years, and 20 conservative estimates see them further increasing by an average of over 6 percent each 21 22 for the next three years. 23 In the city fiscal year 2019, the city will collect \$27 billion in property taxes, 24 25 \$4.5 billion more than the city currently

receives and at least \$4 billion more than if 1 New York City had been subject to the provisions 2 3 of the cap. 4 This bill means at least \$1,000 more 5 per year per each residential homeowner if these 6 taxes were capped. 7 New York businesses will get hit with another \$3.5 billion more in property taxes 8 without the cap. Rising property taxes are the 9 10 biggest impediment to economic growth in the city. The cap provides certainty for investment 11 12 and growth in New York City and will help keep us more competitive with our neighboring states. 13 14 If we look at what's going on today 15 with the Governor trying to -- going after Medicare \$200 million this year, CUNY 16 \$400 million plus -- almost a billion dollars 17 18 that the state is trying to claw back. And if you look at the clawbacks over the next two to 19 20 three years, it goes up to \$2 billion to That means the state is taking this 21 \$3 billion. 22 money back and giving it out across the state. This money belongs in the taxpayers' 23 pockets in the City of New York. And if we'd put 24 25 that money in the taxpayers of the City of

1 New York and give them the edge that they need to 2 be able to stay and live and raise their families in the greatest city and the greatest nation in 3 4 the world, that's what they deserve, and nothing 5 less. I will be voting yes, sir. 6 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Senator 7 Golden in the affirmative. 8 9 Seeing no other Senators wishing to 10 speak, announce the result. THE SECRETARY: In relation to 11 12 Calendar 52, those recorded in the negative are Senators Breslin, Comrie, Gianaris, Hamilton, 13 14 Hassell-Thompson, Parker, Peralta, Sanders, 15 Serrano and Squadron. 16 Ayes, 38. Nays, 10. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: The bill 18 is passed. 19 Senator DeFrancisco. 20 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes, 21 Mr. President. I'd just like to acknowledge a former colleague that's in the chamber disrupting 22 the proceedings here --23 (Laughter.) 24 25 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: -- former

Senator Byron Brown, now mayor of the City of 1 2 Buffalo. 3 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Welcome, 4 Mr. Mayor. 5 (Applause.) ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: б Floor Leader, that completes the noncontroversial 7 8 reading of the calendar. SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: 9 Is there any 10 further business at the desk? (Pause.) I believe there's more business at 11 the desk. We should return to motions and 12 resolutions. 13 14 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: Motions 15 and resolutions. 16 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: And we would like to indicate that Senator Amedore's 17 18 previously adopted resolution that he discussed 19 today should be opened up to all members of this 20 body. And if you do not want to cosponsor it, 21 please notify the desk. Otherwise, you'll be on. 22 ACTING PRESIDENT BOYLE: The 23 resolution is open for cosponsorship. If you do not wish to cosponsor Senator Amedore's 24 25 resolution, please notify the desk.

1 Senator DeFrancisco. 2 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: And now is 3 there any further business at the desk?
