     this important milestone, we celebrate too and

     reflect the special bond our state has with our
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neighbors to the north.

As someone who gets to represent a 175-mile stretch of the Canadian-New York border, it affords me a special opportunity and a relationship with our friends from the north. I know many times when people ask where my district is, they have no idea until I say I live practically in Canada, three miles to the border.

And I often joke that I can make it to the nation's capital in Canada in under an hour, but it takes me 4½ hours to get to work in Albany.

13 (Laughter.)

SENATOR RITCHIE: So that usually gets the point across.

But not just to our area, though, our partnership with Canada is important for all of New York State, because Canada is our number-one trading partner and the relationship that exists drives the economy in both areas.

I know at home, growing up there, we would think nothing of jumping in the car and going across the border for dinner or to hockey practice or many other events that are there.

And on any given occasion when I

have to go, unfortunately, to the grocery store, 1 2 my ritual is to drive up and down the aisles to make sure to see how many of our Canadian 3 4 friends are over either at dinner, shopping at 5 our shopping centers, or are participating in some of the tourist attractions that are there. 6 7 So we are very lucky to have such special friends that come here from Canada but 8 also who welcome us on any given day when we 9 10 travel across the Canadian bridge. So for all of my colleagues who 11 haven't been to Canada, I would offer it's a 12 great place to go. This past year the New York 13 14 Times named Canada the number-one place to go in 15 2017. But as you go to Canada, I would ask that you take a trip and stop in the North Country and 16 see what we have to offer there too. 17 18 And to our Canadian friends, once again, thank you being here today, thank you for 19 your partnership, and we look forward to working 20 together in the future. 21 Thank you, Mr. President. 22 Thank ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 23 you, Senator Ritchie. 24 25 Senator Little.

1 SENATOR LITTLE: Thank you, 2 Mr. President. I too would like to speak on this 3 4 resolution and thank our consul general, Phyllis 5 Yaffe, for being here today. I represent the northeast corner of 6 7 New York State, Clinton County and Franklin County and parts of St. Lawrence County which 8 border the Canadian border. And I too actually 9 live in Glens Falls, closer to Montreal than I am 10 to New York City. 11 12 But more importantly to that and its location is what an important partner to the 13 United States Canada is. We have within my 14 15 district so many Canadian companies. We have Bombardier; Nova Bus, making New York City buses. 16 We have subway cars that come down the Northway. 17 18 I have to say I toot the horn when I see them go by, just to rejoice that they're being made in 19 20 Plattsburgh. We have Irving Tissue that makes 21 Scotties tissue. It also makes tissue for 22 Wegman's, for Target. It has contracts all over 23 the country and employs about 400 people in the 24 25 tiny village of Fort Edward, New York. So it's

very, very important to me.

The city of Plattsburgh calls itself Montreal's suburb, because it is. We see so many visitors who come from Canada to spend time in Plattsburgh. I will tell you that T.J.Maxx in Plattsburgh is the greatest place to shop because the turnover is tremendous -- more turnover there than anyplace.

It is just a real, real partnership and something that we are very fortunate for. In Plattsburgh alone, 15 percent of the workforce gets up and goes to work for a Canadian company.

So I can't say enough about it,
about our relationship and to have the
Consul General come down and be here at the
beginning of the session before we get started so
that we all know her, can have a relationship,
can discuss things and stay in contact with her.

I also want to commend our

Constable Cormier from the Royal Canadian Mounted

Police. I had the pleasure of having my picture

taken with him last night at the reception. My

daughter-in-law is from Vancouver and has a

nephew who's in the Mounted Police, so it was fun

to be able to text the picture and say this is

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what we're doing here, honoring RCMP in New York

And in Syracuse, New York, among other things, is a big mall. It used to be 21 called Carousel, and now it's the Destiny. to come anytime you'd like and do the same.
