You may not get to be 6'10" and be able to dunk a basketball, but whatever you really want to do, you're going to be in a situation where you can accomplish it.

a man should not place his hand on a woman. And when a man does so, they violate not only their mothers, their sisters, their nieces and even their own children.

These orders of protection are not taken very seriously as they presently stand in New York State. We must amplify the penalty for violating an order of protection with a higher charge for committing such a crime. People are not being deterred from the consequences of what will happen if they violate an order of protection. It is only in the extreme cases that these orders of protection are taken seriously or even looked at.

This is the main reason we should raise the penalties against offenders of orders of protection, so that these violators could be deterred from committing these egregious acts.

The guidelines for orders of protection should be taken very seriously so that we will not notice a problem against women in our state. So what we will do now is increase the penalty from a D felony to a C felony, and the charge for the penalty will go from 7 to 15 years.

In New York City the amount of people violating orders of protection has been increasing on a yearly basis. In 2013, 5,056 intimate partners violated an order of protection. In 2015, the number increased to 6,313 people violating orders of protection.

According to data analyzed by the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services, for the year 2008 there were 91 intimate partner homicides committed statewide. This figure represents an alarming 25 percent increase from 2007. Counties outside of New York City experienced a 45 percent increase.

The high recidivism rate in domestic violence unfortunately means that there's a likelihood that some defendants are going to violate the terms and conditions of an order of protection. Personally, I don't think any man should lay his hand on a woman. I think it's egregious, it goes against the sanctity of man and woman, husband and wife.

So I stand here today as a proud father and husband and protector of women in my family to say that this law is long overdue and
