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1 PROCEEDINGS 2 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: The 3 Senate will come to order. 4 I ask everyone present to please 5 rise and repeat with me the Pledge of Allegiance. 6 7 (Whereupon, the assemblage recited 8 the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.) 9 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: In the 10 absence of clergy, may we please bow our heads in a moment of silence. 11 12 (Whereupon, the assemblage respected a moment of silence.) 13 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: 14 The 15 reading of the Journal. 16 THE SECRETARY: In Senate, Sunday, 17 April 30th, the Senate met pursuant to 18 adjournment. The Journal of Saturday, 19 April 29th, was read and approved. On motion, 20 Senate adjourned. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: Without 22 objection, the Journal stands approved as read. 23 Presentation of petitions. Messages from the Assembly. 24 The Secretary will read. 25

1 THE SECRETARY: On page 32, 2 Senator Serrano moves to discharge, from the Committee on Health, Assembly Bill Number 5287 3 and substitute it for the identical Senate Bill 4 5 4811, Third Reading Calendar 413. ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: б The 7 substitution is so ordered. 8 Messages from the Governor. 9 Reports of standing committees. 10 Reports of select committees. Communications and reports from 11 state officers. 12 13 Motions and resolutions. ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: 14 Senator 15 DeFrancisco. 16 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Madam President, on page 18 I offer the following 17 18 amendments to Calendar 121, Senate Print 1296A, 19 by Senator Marcellino, and ask that said bill 20 retain its place on the Third Reading Calendar. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: The amendments are received, and the bill retains 22 23 its place on the Third Reading Calendar. SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: I'd also 24 25 request that on page 29, I offer the following

SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: I also wish 6 7 to call up Senator Croci's bill, Senate Print 8 933, recalled from the Assembly, which is now at 9 the desk. 10 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: The Secretary will read the title of the bill. 11 THE SECRETARY: Calendar Number 12 383, by Senator Croci, Senate Print 933, an act 13 to amend the Public Health Law. 14 15 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: I now move to 16 reconsider the vote by which the bill was passed. 17 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: Call the 18 roll on reconsideration. (The Secretary called the roll.) 19 Ayes, 50. 20 THE SECRETARY: 21 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: The bill is restored to its place on the Third Reading 22 23 Calendar. 1 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Madam 2 President, could we take up previously adopted 3 Resolution 1273, by Senator Tedisco, read the 4 title only, and call on Senator Tedisco. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: The Secretary will read. б 7 THE SECRETARY: Legislative Resolution Number 1273, by Senator Tedisco, 8 9 congratulating the Union College Men's Basketball 10 Team and Head Coach Chris Murphy upon the 11 occasion of capturing the 2017 Liberty League 12 Men's Basketball Championship on February 25, 2017. 13 14 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: Senator 15 Tedisco. SENATOR TEDISCO: Thank you, Madam 16 President. 17 18 And my colleagues, I ask you to join me in welcoming and saluting and congratulating 19 an outstanding group of student-athletes. 20 They hail from Union College, which happens to be my 21 alma mater, in Schenectady, and from the 22 49th Senatorial District. They are the Men's 23 Varsity Basketball Team of this past year. 24 25 And joining them, believe it or not,

are three of the players who played with me many 1 years ago, who are excited to be here with me and 2 with you to honor them and salute them for the 3 4 tremendous and unbelievable season they have had. 5 And the reason why we're excited about this is because we got the opportunity to 6 7 see several of their games this year. And we're proud of the fact that we're Union graduates, 8 we're proud of the fact that we competed 9 10 athletically as they did, but what we're most 11 proud of is the way they came together and jelled 12 as a team and got to that place, that sweet spot, where everything will go right if no individual 13 14 cares who gets the credit, and they work for the 15 team. And they did that in an unbelievable way this year. 16 To let you know what they've 17 18 accomplished, they had 17 wins this year, which is great. They got to the Liberty League 19 20 Tournament because of the place they had. They beat St. Lawrence in the first round in double 21 22 overtime, with a shot by Deshon Burgess. And I told them they could have made it a little bit 23 more dramatic; there was 0.9 seconds left when he 24 25 hit a three-point shot in double overtime to win

1 that game to get them into the finals. I said, 2 "You could have made it 0.5 seconds or something like that." 3 4 But that was a tremendous win in 5 double overtime. Then they went on to the championship game. They beat Hobart 71 to 67 to 6 7 win the Liberty League Championship. And it's Division III, but a tremendous competitive 8 9 league. Very competitive. 10 And when I spoke to them today, I talked about the fact that anybody who plays 11 basketball -- and Senator DeFrancisco knows that, 12 and I told him earlier I went to see a few games 13 14 with the Syracuse team. In fact, I got to the 15 finals. Unfortunately, it was when Smart hit that shot, Senator, and that wasn't a good thing, 16 in New Orleans. 17 18 But this is a team that we're very proud of. Wins are good, winning a championship 19 20 is good, but anybody who plays basketball knows they want to get to the NCAA tournament, the big 21 22 dance. They not only got there, but they won one of their games; they beat Wesleyan in the first 23 round, 89 to 83. 24 25 So this is something historic for

1	them. They'll remember this for the rest of
2	their lives. They'll come back like my
3	colleagues do every year. And believe it or not,
4	there's three of my colleagues, but this year
5	we're having the 45th reunion of our varsity
6	team, and 11 out of 12 of the players will be
7	coming back to that to have a reunion.
8	It's bittersweet for us, and that's
9	why we live vicariously through a team like this.
10	We had a tremendous year back when I was a
11	senior. We were picked to go to the tournament,
12	which is the number-one thing you want to do.
13	What happened is somebody read the rules of our
14	league, and the rules of our league said we could
15	not compete in post-tournament play.
16	I have to tell you, not only were we
17	disappointed, but the school itself and the
18	student body almost burnt down the president's
19	house. And they closed down the field house for
20	a while.
21	So we went to a lot of games, we saw
22	them go up and down, but we saw them compete at
23	the end when they should have.
24	And here with me are my three
25	colleagues: Bob Pezzano and Mike Doyle, who went

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to Linton High School in Schenectady now, and 1 2 Geoff Walker, from Colonie. 3 And we can't say how proud we are of 4 this particular team and the coaching staff, who 5 did an unbelievable job. This is something they'll remember for the rest of their lives. 6 7 And I hope they continue to come back, and I know they will. Watching them play, we saw the guys 8 9 on the bench, saw the guys who were playing --10 they were one team acting as one group. 11 And they're up for a lot of 12 successes in the future -- the coaches are, the future teams are, but so are these players, in 13 14 anything they attempt, because I think they 15 learned some tremendous lessons. Let me just tell you who is here. 16 Their head coach is Coach Chris Murphy, who was 17 18 the starter on the 2004-2005 Union team, which was the last one to make it to the NCAA finals. 19 20 So he had some experience, and he brought this team to the tournament. Assistant Coach Nick 21 Ciresi, and Eric McDowell, assistant athletic 22 director for sports information. 23 24 And these are the team players, 25 which I'd like to put in the archives so they're

remembered: Deshon Burgess, who was First Team, 1 2 All Liberty League; Wade McNamara, Second Team, 3 All Liberty League; Zachary Bouton, Benjamin Lee, 4 Kevin Weckworth, Aaron Gordon, Shiraz Mumtaz, 5 Greg King, Mike Palleschi, Garrett Johnson, Kevin 6 McNoble, Matt Liquori, Martynas Simanavicius, 7 Brendan Laing, Kevin Jefferson, Weston Hannon-Bogosh, and Guiseppe de Spuches. 8 9 Congratulations for a great season, 10 something you, us, the Union College alumni and the student body over there will always remember. 11 12 Madam Speaker, I ask you to welcome them, congratulate them, and offer all the 13 14 cordialities of this august body. 15 Congratulations, and have a safe trip back. 16 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: 17 Senator 18 DeFrancisco on the resolution. 19 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: Yes, first of 20 all I've got to supplement what Senator Tedisco 21 said. First of all, Syracuse University 22 did lose to the last-second shot by Keith Smart 23 in New Orleans. I happen to have been there, and 24 25 I haven't stopped crying since.

1 (Laughter.) 2 SENATOR DEFRANCISCO: But they won 3 a national championship since, so I want to be clear on that. 4 5 Secondly, I'm glad the three former teammates of Senator Tedisco are here, because 6 7 all I hear about is his seven or nine records 8 that he set when he was there and all of this stuff that he did. 9 10 So my name is John DeFrancisco. If you send a letter to the Capitol, Senator John 11 DeFrancisco, I want to know some other stuff so 12 that I can discuss this issue with him about his 13 expertise in the game of basketball with a little 14 15 bit more detail. 16 (Laughter.) 17 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: However, with 18 all that said, congratulations. Being a member 19 of a championship team is just the most 20 incredible thing in the world. You will be 21 friends forever. Your stories will be embellished. Each year they get more and more, 22 23 just like Senator Tedisco. (Laughter.) 24 25 SENATOR DeFRANCISCO: But enjoy

1 that, because that's part of the fun of winning a 2 championship. So congratulations, and best in 3 4 everything you do. 5 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: Thank б you. 7 To the coaches and team members of 8 the Men's Union College Basketball Team, I extend to you, on behalf of the New York State Senate, 9 10 all of the privileges and courtesies of this house, and I congratulate you. 11 12 I ask that all the Senators please rise in recognition of the Union Men's Team. 13 (Standing ovation.) 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: Senator 16 DeFrancisco. SENATOR DEFRANCISCO: 17 Can we now 18 please take up previously adopted Resolution 427, 19 by Senator Marchione, read the title only, and 20 call on Senator Marchione. 21 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: The 22 Secretary will read. 23 THE SECRETARY: Legislative Resolution Number 427, by Senator Marchione, 24 25 commemorating the 66th Annual Observance of the

National Day of Prayer in the State of New York, 1 2 Thursday, May 4, 2017. 3 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: Senator 4 Marchione on the resolution. 5 SENATOR MARCHIONE: Thank you, Madam President. I rise for the purposes to 6 7 speak on this resolution. You know, every year a different 8 9 theme is selected, and this year's theme for our 10 National Day of Prayer is "For Your Great Name's Sake! Hear Us ... Forgive Us ... Heal Us." The 11 theme is from Daniel 9:19. 12 13 You know, in the upcoming 66th 14 Annual National Day of Prayer, millions of 15 Americans will join together and pray together at thousands of events that are held across our 16 great nation. Prayer has always been an 17 18 important part of our heritage, our history, and our national identity. 19 20 The National Day of Prayer is a tradition that was first proclaimed by the 21 22 Continental Congress in 1775. And then in 1983, in Marsh v. Chambers, the United States Supreme 23 Court affirmed the right of state legislatures to 24 25 open up their sessions with a prayer -- a proud,

honorable tradition that we carry forward here in 1 2 the New York State Senate. 3 By observing the National Day of 4 Prayer in New York on May 4, we acknowledge our 5 blessings and express our profound gratitude for them. We can ask that God hears us, forgives us, 6 7 and heals us, and help strengthen our religious 8 and moral values in our state and in our nation. 9 Thank you, Madam President, and my 10 colleagues. Thank you. ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: 11 Thank 12 you. This act shall take effect immediately. 11 12 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: Call the roll. 13 (The Secretary called the roll.) 14 15 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: Ι recognize Senator Young. 16 17 SENATOR YOUNG: Thank you, Madam 18 President. And this bill, Kendra's Law, was 19 20 first enacted several years ago in honor of 21 Kendra Webdale, who grew up in Fredonia, New York. 22 23 She was on the platform and was all of a sudden pushed in front of an oncoming 24 25 N train, and her life was ended that day. The

person who pushed her was Andrew Goldstein, who 1 2 had a long history of schizophrenia. And her family worked tirelessly to 3 4 get Kendra's Law passed. And since that time it 5 has provided so much support, so many positive things to people who have severe mental illness, 6 7 because it allows for a court-ordered mechanism for people with serious mental illness to get 8 assisted outpatient treatment. 9 10 And this is an extraordinarily important bill because study after study has 11 proven that Kendra's Law has decreased 12 homelessness, decreased violence, decreased 13 14 suicide, and really put people on a much better 15 path toward a better quality of life. So, Madam President, I vote aye and 16 I encourage all of my colleagues to vote aye 17 18 also. 19 ACTING PRESIDENT HELMING: Thank 20 you, Senator. Senator Young to be recorded in the 21 affirmative. 22 23 Senator Krueger to explain her vote. SENATOR KRUEGER: Thank you, Madam 24 25 President.

I want to thank the sponsor for her 1 2 bill and her explanation. 3 I am not opposed to the goals of 4 Kendra's Law, but I am very concerned that having 5 implemented it X number of years, and now this bill would make it permanent, we haven't 6 7 completed the assignment. Unfortunately, there isn't yet research showing us that coercive 8 9 assisted outpatient treatment is effective. 10 And unfortunately, we are seeing over and over again -- particularly in the City 11 12 of New York, where that terrible incident did happen -- larger numbers of people with mental 13 illness who are homeless on the streets who are 14 15 not getting the kinds of services we should be requiring -- and that I believe, if they were 16 included in this bill, I could support. 17 Issues 18 such as assuring that people being released from our prisons, our jails, our state programs, would 19 20 be guaranteed both access to immediate Medicaid to cover mental health services, access to 21 outpatient mental health care, and of course 22 housing. Because if you are mentally ill and 23 left on the streets homeless, you know things are 24 25 going to go wrong.

1	So I respect that the goal here is
2	both to assure that people with severe mental
3	illness and of course the vast majority of
4	mentally ill people are not violent to themselves
5	or others. But that percentage of severely
6	mentally ill people in the State of New York are
7	still desperate for the kinds of services and
8	access to health insurance that would make it
9	more likely that they could be taken care of and
10	that we wouldn't see the incidents that
11	unfortunately, despite the existence of
12	Kendra's Law, we see.
13	So I will vote no and continue to
14	hope that we, working together, can move forward
15	with the kinds of programs, services, and
16	legislation that truly address the problems we're
17	seeing.
18	Thank you, Madam President.
