     publicly laud Senator Patrick Gallivan, who is

     the chair of the Crime Victims, Crime and

     Corrections Committee, for his professionalism

     and for the fact that we were able to do -- in a
20
     very tight timeline, were actually able to
21
     actually see these seven folks.
                  I would say to whomever is listening
22
     that we have been ready for these nominations for
23
     a while. It would be good if you got them to us
24
25
     in a more timely fashion. That is certainly true
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of many of the other nominations we will see in the mere three days that we have left.

So that is generally about the process, but I want to speak specifically about this nominee.

While I am certainly thankful that the Governor has sent us five new nominations, many of whom -- who have just gotten appointed, I both congratulate them, as well as one of reappointments, who I believe are certainly going to -- particularly the new reappointments I think are going to do a fantastic job on the board. They have an understanding of the law, but they also have a vision of criminal justice which goes beyond merely being a punitive one in nature.

Which is why I wanted to speak specifically on the reappointment of this last Parole Board commissioner, which I will oppose, Mr. President.

And I will oppose it because I believe that we are in a place where, when we think about criminal justice, we have to think about whether rehabilitation is possible. We have to think about the individuals that are incarcerated that have acknowledged their crimes,

acknowledged responsibility for their crimes, and tried to atone for the mistakes that they've made.

If you have a vision of criminal justice that says that certain crimes deserve no mercy and no forgiveness, then certainly we can't have a conversation further. You will disagree with the rest of what I have to say.

But if you believe that an individual that commits a crime but acknowledges that crime, acknowledges responsibility, and does everything in their power -- everything that we allow them to do while incarcerated -- to be able to rehabilitate themselves, to be able to atone for their sins and to say, I want to go back into society and be a productive member of it -- if you believe that that is something that can happen, then I believe that you should also oppose this nomination. Because unfortunately, I believe that the record of Mr. Smith demonstrates that he does not believe in rehabilitation.

As I said during the hearing on Thursday, when I go up for reelection every two years, I have to ask that my constituents judge me based on what I've done, based on the actions

that I have taken, based on what my record is. 1 And if we are to see that -- if we are to take 2 the same amount of -- if we are to look at 3 4 Mr. Smith's record over 20 years on the Parole 5 Board, serving longer than any other commissioner, I think it is clear that, sadly and 6 7 unfortunately, he does not believe that rehabilitation, and furthermore he in many 8 instances has violated the role that he is 9 10 supposed to have as a commissioner. 11 I believe that it is demonstrated, 12 if you just read some of the transcripts of 20 years of Parole Board hearings, that his 13 unprofessional conduct, his condescending 14 15 conduct, his humiliating conduct to some individuals who have acknowledged their crime --16 and I want to make sure that this is made clear, 17 18 because one question that was asked of me by a Senator last week is do I believe in the rights 19 20 of victims. Absolutely I do. But if I see an individual that has 21 acknowledged that their crimes -- if someone is 22 unrepentant, then certainly they should remain 23 incarcerated. But if somebody acknowledges their 24 25 crimes, acknowledges responsibility, and does

everything under the sun to rehabilitate themselves, to be educated, to be a better person, should we not give that person the opportunity to come outside and be a productive member of society?

There's many formerly incarcerated folks that I've gotten to know in my time in the Senate. I am not -- I don't have much contact with the criminal justice system myself. I've never been arrested. I do not have family members who have been incarcerated. I am not an attorney, nor do I have family members who are.

But in the time that I've been in the Senate, particularly during my first two years in the Senate, as I was the Crime Victims, Crime and Corrections ranking member, I met many individuals who are formerly incarcerated who have done incredible things with their lives.

And so when I look at the conduct of Mr. Smith over the time that he has been inside, in particular -- there's many instances that I can mention, but I will only mention one, Mr. President, since I know that a couple of my colleagues want to speak as well. There's one gentleman in particular who over a period of time

was denied parole 10 times. This gentleman did commit a crime, and committed a serious crime, but it is a crime that he atoned for, that he asked for forgiveness for, and ultimately was denied parole 10 times strictly because of what he had done originally. And everything that he had done while incarcerated was ignored. After the tenth time that he was denied parole, he committed suicide.

And I think that that is particularly important to understand, that not only did he do that -- this is Mr. John

MacKenzie, who when 29 years old was convicted of the murder of a police officer. And that is a heinous crime. But if you acknowledge that you committed that mistake and over a period of 40 years tried to atone for it, should you not be given the opportunity to be a member of society, a productive member outside? I believe you should. If you've proven that you acknowledge your mistake, I think that you should be given that opportunity.

In the case of Mr. Smith -- I will finish with this. In the case of Mr. Smith, unfortunately he was -- in the eighth and ninth

time that this person, John MacKenzie, was denied parole, he was on that board. After the ninth time, a judge threw out that decision and ordered a de novo hearing, ordered a new hearing to be held, and was very specific about who should not be in that hearing. Specifically, the judge ordered that no person that had been on the prior two boards be on that board. Yet Mr. Smith was there.

On Thursday, he acknowledged that that was the case, but said that he is assigned where he goes. I believe that someone who had taken their job a little bit more seriously, or somebody who had acknowledged there was a judgment -- there was an order from a judge not to go on that tenth board, would have said: I cannot be there, I am conflicted out, and so I will not sit on that board.

He did. He sat on that board, and after the tenth time, John MacKenzie's parole was denied and he committed suicide while in prison.

Bottom line, ladies and gentlemen, I believe that this is not the type of person that we should have in the Parole Board. We have individuals that were appointed and were

     confirmed today who both recognize a

     responsibility to public safety, but who also
     recognize that you have to take into
 3

     consideration what a person has done to rebuild

     their own lives.

     one second to dismiss those victims who are
     impacted by the actions of this person. But if

     those individuals do everything in their power to

     accept responsibility, to atone for that
     mistake -- if you believe that they should not be

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Mr. Smith. But before I state why, I also want
to publicly cite Senator Patrick Gallivan for his
leadership as the chair of the Crime Victims,
Crime and Correction Committee, not just
throughout the Parole Board process but
throughout the entire year, keeping me abreast of
what was happening.

I had a family emergency, so I was

I had a family emergency, so I was not able to appear this past Thursday. But I also want to thank my colleagues in the Senate Democratic Conference for stepping up -- Senator Rivera, Senator Montgomery, Senator Hoylman -- for their line of questioning.

If we're talking about victims'
rights, the first bill I passed in this very
house was concerning the rights of victims,
making sure that we define what a necessary court
appearance is so that victims can make sure that
they are able to get to their appearances.

So make no mistake about it, my stance is not anti-victim. Again, my first bill in this house is concerning victims. But what I am concerned about is the original offense being a life sentence.

I do have some concerns about

Mr. Smith and his record, but to save some time, Senator Rivera kind of dug into those very well.

Frequently denying individuals

parole when they have availed themselves of all

opportunities to rehabilitate themselves, despite

the original offense, does nobody any good.

Period. If we are truly going to incarcerate

people for the purpose of rehabilitation, then we

must look at the totality of the circumstances.

If we're not going to rehabilitate, we should just say that up-front. But if we are looking to rehabilitate, we have to take into account everything that individual is doing to avail themselves educationally, vocationally, spiritually, emotionally, to become a better person. If that's what they're trying to do inside, we need to give them better consideration.

And I'm not saying open up the jails and let everybody out. That's far from what I'm saying. Let's be very clear about what I am saying: That individuals like this, in the current climate that we're in, I do not believe should be on the Parole Board.

You know, looking at the other

And when my colleague Senator Rivera talks about qualified people to be appointed and talks about the qualifications of the person that he was talking about, the thing that comes to my mind, did the Governor really search among

New York State residents and among the Hispanic community to find qualified people?

But every time that they need our support they come to our community, they use us and they abuse us. And this time they are again abusing us. Out of 108, only three will be appointed by the Governor.

So that's why I'm voting no. I'm voting no because I'm angry, I'm upset, I am disappointed for all these nominations ignoring our community. I know that everybody here, everyone here are proud of their heritage, and everyone here promotes their heritage as long as they are qualified. And I believe that in our Hispanic community we have a lot of qualified individuals, men and women, that could be appointed. But to do 108 and only three is more than I can swallow.

                  The candidates collectively come

     from diverse professional, geographical, ethnic

     backgrounds. I think the Governor has done an
23
     outstanding job in putting forward the slate of
24

     candidates, and he should be commended for them.
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And I would like to personally congratulate Otis Cruse, who is with us today, and his family on his reconfirmation to a second term on the Parole Board. So congratulations to you, and thank you for your service.

So Commissioner Cruse was one of the two individuals who was nominated for reappointment by the Governor. Walter William Smith, whose nomination is under consideration right now, is the other. I would say that the Governor, in putting both of these individuals forward, did so in recognition of the jobs that they do, of the record that they have.

In the case of Commissioner Smith, he has served on the Parole Board over 20 years. He is the senior member of the Parole Board. He has been nominated by both Republican and Democratic governors. This is Governor Cuomo's second nomination of Commissioner Smith to this position for an additional term.

The Executive Law governs the operations of the Parole Board. And in the Executive Law, it also governs the standards of release and the factors that must be considered when the Parole Board is making a decision on

whether or not to release an individual who is eligible for parole. And I would like to remind all of my colleagues that the Executive Law states in part that parole shall not be granted based on good conduct alone, or a positive record while confined.

But the Executive Law then lays out a series of standards that must be met. Not all of the standards have to do with the individual conduct of the person being considered for parole. The community's interest must be considered as well. I acknowledge that that is an objective standard -- or, I'm sorry, a subjective standard, that the human beings and the individual members of the Parole Board must consider.

The Executive Law lays out the things that the Parole Board must consider, the factors. And essentially, without going into all of them, it's a look at the crime of conviction -- it's the past, present, future. The crime of conservation; the individual's prior criminal record, if any; their accomplishments while they are incarcerated and then what the future plans for release might be.

They must also consider comments from the sentencing judge, comments if any from the district attorney, defense attorney, and of course from victims.

So the record that gets established in each and every case is supposed to touch on all of these different things, and then the parole commissioners must deliberate and make a subjective decision, to the best of their ability, based upon the factors they consider, whether or not the individual meets the standard for release.

In the case of Commissioner Smith, I have known him professionally and personally for many, many years. Many know I was also a member of the Parole Board, and I worked with Commissioner Smith, among some others that are still serving in that capacity.

I think that -- I concur with the Governor that Commissioner Smith merits reappointment. While there is disagreement with my colleagues, I believe that he pays attention to the law, looks at the totality of circumstances, as he is supposed to, and makes decisions accordingly.

Separate from that, my colleague
Senator Rivera spoke about a particular case and
a judge's determination in granting an appeal or
new hearing. And during the testimony of
Commissioners Cruse and Commissioner Smith, it
was established that the individual members of
the Parole Board do not have any control over
their schedule. They are told where to go, and
they do not know until the day of the actual
hearing what individuals they are going to be
interviewing.

So they're not at liberty to tell the chairman of the board that they're not going to a particular place nor interviewing an individual person that's up for parole.

So in a case of any scheduling and whether or not a commissioner should be on or not on a panel, there is a forum for that. I believe that it is being litigated, and ultimately time will tell. But in my belief, that cannot be put on the back of the individual commissioner.

Those are the points that I did want to discuss. With all due respect to my colleagues, I know that we have some differences on this. I want to thank them again for their

Their 9 10 response and their duty is 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year. The volunteer fire 11 12 service saves millions of taxpayer dollars across this state. 13 Those who serve in the fire service 14 15 have no idea when they're going to be called for duty. Yesterday I had packed the car to head up 16 here and ended up responding to a fire alarm 17 18 before I left. 19 There's a great deal of risk 20 associated with what we do. That risk begins at 21 the time of the alarm when we respond. 22 members getting to fire stations and crossing the street to the firehouse being hit by cars because 23 people fail to yield the right of way to them. 24 25 This particular bill has been up

here in Albany for an extended period of time. 1 2 This house has always supported the fire service. 3 It's critical that we recognize that these men 4 and women who are voluntarily serving this 5 community have significant risk and exposure from 6 a health standpoint. They say that firefighters 7 are in one of the most dangerous occupations. But when we think of occupations, those 8 9 individuals are always compensated for their 10 service. Our volunteers in this state are not. It is critical, ladies and 11 12 gentlemen, that we recognize the service these 13 individuals provide to this community and we 14 stand in support of them on this measure and 15 finally, finally pass this legislation in this 16 state. When we measure how effective the 17 18 fire service is, we always look at a measurement called response time, how long it takes you to 19 20 get to the scene of a call. Albany's response time on this cancer bill has been far too slow. 21 22 I'm voting for this, Mr. President, and I ask the members to do so also. 23 Thank you. ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: 24 Senator Brooks to be recorded in the affirmative. 25

We 6 7 have an unwritten compact in our society that says when our firefighters have made a commitment 8 to leave their families in the middle of the 9 10 night -- under any circumstances -- to come protect ours, we need to be there for them. 11 I had a relative from another 12 13 country, from another hemisphere, come and visit 14 us a few years ago. And when he learned in 15 Long Beach about the volunteer fire department, he didn't understand. He said, "I don't get it. 16 How do you know they're going to come? You don't 17 18 pay them at all." And I told him, "Oh, you better bet they come. They always come." 19 20 These are our heroes, and they're 21 coming down with cancers. And I've spoken to actual oncologists about this, that these are 22 young men getting tumors that have no doubt 23 resulted from years of exposure to the toxins 24 25 that result in furniture and other household

1 goods going up in flames. 2 They're there for us; we need to be there for them. Presumptive cancer coverage is 3 the right thing to do, and that's why I'm going 4 5 to vote in the affirmative. This is the year to get it passed in New York State. Let's keep 6 7 moving forward. A 12-year-old, male or female, is statistically unlikely to have completed puberty. That means they're still particularly -- young men age 12, 13, 14, 15, before puberty, are quite small compared to the size they will become post-puberty. They have much less body strength than they will have later post-puberty. Their hormones are likely raging, which always gives question to good judgment, for any people who have dealt with prepubescent youth and teenagers going through puberty.

And frankly, putting them in the woods with dangerous weapons, even if a parent is nearby, does not assure me that they won't harm themselves or others.

I'm actually concerned that we have it as young as 14. But I think it's a huge mistake to take the leap to allow hunting large game with dangerous weapons starting at age 12. This bill would allow 12- and 13-year-olds to participate in these activities.

There are so many wonderful sports and other activities that parents can participate in with their young children. Surely they can

Will Smith -- The Fresh Prince of Bel-Air, as many know him --23 started out as a rapper, saying "Parents just 24 25 don't understand." Then he became a TV star and

then a movie star and one of the greatest actors of our generation. Hip-hop did that.

The rap group Three 6 Mafia, while I don't necessarily like the name, they won an Oscar for their performance for the soundtrack in Hustle & Flow. Ludacris, a rapper from Atlanta, Georgia, was in the top-grossing movie this year, one of the Fast & Furious -- Fast & Furious 39, I don't know.

(Laughter.)

SENATOR BAILEY: But the funny thing is that when I was growing up, people would talk about the viability of hip-hop, is hip-hop here to stay. And I think I've proven that it is.

I just remember that -- well, one of the best things about hip-hop is that no matter what age group you are, you can understand a certain thing about it. I remember one of the first times I heard "Eric B. is President" -- "make 'em, make 'em, make 'em clap to this" -- and it was a pivotal moment in my mind that the fusion of -- soul, R&B, jazz was all fused in one song, and I was able to hear that expression.

Growing up, my era was Notorious

B.I.G., Jay-Z and Nas. Then hip-hop went west to California: Dr. Dre, Snoop Dogg, E-40. Then it took a trip down South, where we met OutKast, IT, Ludacris, Young Jeezy, to name a few.

And there's a moment in every hip-hop fan's life where there was a certain line or a certain message was pivotal to you, and for me that was college. Up here at the University at Albany from 2000 to 2004 is when I really started to understand what rappers were saying and understand that it wasn't just nonsense, it wasn't just gobbledygook, it was metaphor. Beats, rhymes and life, as I had mentioned earlier.

And many people don't believe that hip-hop is more than violent lyrics and sexually explicit lyrics. And I would say to them, to quote Jay-Z, "Scarface the movie did more to me than Scarface the rapper did to me."

We don't talk about Breaking Bad as -- we don't talk about Brian Cranston being a deleterious effect to society, and he's doing some not-so-nice things on that show.

1 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 2 Jamaal Bailey. 3 Senator Comrie. 4 SENATOR COMRIE: Mr. President, I 5 rise to support this resolution that Senator Jamaal Bailey put together to acknowledge Black 6 7 Music Month and also the origin of hip-hop from 8 1973. 9 Now, hip-hop, it means so much to so 10 many people. As Senator Bailey has told you, it's created careers, it's given people 11 opportunities. But it stemmed out of a cultural 12 need to make sure that young people that were not 13 14 getting music in schools, that were not getting 15 opportunities to express themselves -- they found 16 their own way. They used the streets, they used the 17 18 elements around them to create a music genere, to 19 create opportunities, to give themselves 20 expression and also pride in themselves that they 21 could create music and within themselves to also 22 create an opportunity for pride, create an opportunity for sincerity. And as Senator Bailey 23 said, beats, rhymes and life -- utilizing the 24 25 hip-hop venue, utilizing the musical venue within themselves to create things that could express
their feelings and emotions in a way that young
people could start.

I come from a generation earlier in

hip-hop, with Run-D.M.C., Kid 'n Play, LL Cool J. We have, you know, Queens -- while the Bronx started hip-hop, Queens solidified it with those groups. See, I'm going to start now.

(Laughter.)

SENATOR COMRIE: Now, we also had Jam Master Jay, Nicki Minaj, 50 Cent, Ja Rule, Kid 'n Play. Queens hip-hop goes deep, it goes solid, and it goes all the way to the Hall of Fame in Cleveland, Ohio, where we have hip-hop legend LL Cool J, who's got a gold opportunity to be in the Music Hall of Fame. But we also have, you know, other people that have made it to the Hall of Fame -- Run-D.M.C., who is in the Hall of Fame as well.

So since hip-hop got its start, it's grown and spread from city and state. It's become a multi-billion-dollar industry today.

The Old School paved the way. So we have Global Hip-Hop Day, we have Black Music Month this month. From 1520 Sedgwick Avenue and Cedar Park

playground, the four elements of hip-hop have continued to stay around. Rapping and tagging, DJing and breaking, the path it's taken is nothing short of amazing. Commercials, TV shows, movies, Broadway shows and more -- and yes, occasionally in our esteemed chambers, right here on the Senate floor. Whether you're black or white or native, Latino or Asian, hip-hop is represented by every nation.

I dedicate this to my colleagues who come from Queens -- James Sanders, Joe Addabbo,
Toby Stavisky, Mike G., our fearless deputy.

Finally, let me end with this. We have a situation. We must deal with the nonsense, the malice, the poor public policy. Therefore, we must challenge fighting and fussing; we can do so much more if we bring back some trusting. We can't get together because we're falling apart. We need to come together because our country is in trouble. We need to make sure that we can do the things necessary to stop the negativity. It breaks my heart, I don't understand the difficulty.

We need to work together. Here are

It was about a group of folks in the South Bronx that found that a wall could be not just a piece of wall, but could be a canvas, that a sidewalk could be a dance floor, that electricity off of a light pole could actually be hooked up to music, and then music, as it was repeated, could actually have somebody spitting rhymes over it.

And the idea that you could actually transform things that were in rubble into a party tells you everything that you need to know about the resilience of the people of the Bronx, and it is the reason why this is an art form that I think is magnificent.

There certainly have been many folks that have demonstrated their skills in this art form. I'm not so sure that Senator Squadron is one of them, lovely human being that he is. But I will join my colleagues in saying that I'm thankful to Senator Bailey for bringing this to the floor, because this is again a quintessential art form that we must celebrate.

SENATOR HAMILTON: Mr. President, I rise, I want to thank Senator Bailey for bringing this bill.

And I grew up in the South Bronx, and I grew up when rap was just starting. And it started because we didn't see ourselves on television, the music we were listening to didn't really reflect the conditions we were living under. I grew up in NYCHA houses. And when rap fist came out, it was sort of saying that we're sick and tired of being sick and tired of living in these conditions. But we loved the conditions that we lived under at the time, because we didn't know nothing else.

And I remember seeing Grandmaster
Flash, Kool DJ AJ, Busy Bee. And at the time,
rap was a cultural movement as far as expressing
what we were feeling at the time in the South
Bronx. There was arson going on, the Bronx was
burning. There was an artistic form with rap at
the same time, graffiti -- often the graffiti
happened at the same time.

So I didn't think it would become international the way it is today. But the true

1 rap was really a message reflecting what was 2 happening at the time and what we were going 3 through in the South Bronx. 4 So I just want to thank Senator 5 Bailey for bringing this up and acknowledging rap for its origins in the Bronx -- I mean, Queens 6 7 did eventually get to it -- and letting people know that the area that had the lowest economic 8 level as far as households could create an art 9 10 form that would resonate throughout the world. 11 So I'm happy to say that I grew up 12 in a place that -- it was hard to live at, but the creative thought process of the people at 13 that time created an artistic form of music now 14 that permeates music in all countries. 15 you go, you hear rap. 16 17 Thank you very much. 18 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator Benjamin. 19 20 SENATOR BENJAMIN: I will be very 21 brief, but I found it impossible for me to sit down and not stand up on behalf of Harlem and 22 Harlem's role in hip-hop. 23 I want to thank Senator Bailey for 24 25 bringing this to the floor. And I know that Joe Risi and Senator Onorato were 23 24 very, very close friends. And I know that George 25 is smiling right now because Joe Risi has worked

hard. 1 2 He has been doing one of the most 3 difficult jobs in the world -- without pay, no 4 less -- and that's chairing a community board, 5 where people from all walks of life, all kinds of interests, come together with totally different 6 7 agendas and they try to work out agreements. And 8 that's really what a judge is going to do also. 9 Joe Risi had been a Deputy 10 Superintendent of Insurance at one time. counsel to Senator Onorato when Senator Onorato 11 12 was the ranking member on the Insurance 13 Committee. 14 So I congratulate all of the 15 honorees, all of the judges, and I'm sure that they are going to make everybody proud. 16 Thank you, Mr. President. 17 18 ACTING PRESIDENT AKSHAR: Thank you, Senator Stavisky. 19 20 Senator DeFrancisco to close. This would be a shocking change in policy. For some reason, somebody is under the impression this is just a grammatical fix for a law we've already passed several years ago. It is not a grammatical fix, it is doing extreme damage to the affordability of hundreds of thousands of units in the City of New York.

It also claims to do something under Loft Law, extending from two years to four years the registering of interim buildings.

There is an effort by loft tenants to change Loft Law. This is not it. This is not what they're asking for. And I'm advised that the bill they were hoping to see this year absolutely won't be coming to the floor of the Senate.

So it's ten after 10:00 the night before the end of session, perhaps, and it's a one-house bill that somebody likes. I think it's one particular housing association, the RSA. But it would be terrible public policy. So thank goodness we don't have to worry about it becoming the law of New York State.

They need not just an extension of the existing law, but some corrections to real 16 problems made in the past. This also fails to do 17 18 that. 19 And, you know, I wish we were seeing 20 a bill here nearly in the eleventh hour, 21 certainly in the second or third to last day of session that (A) had a chance of becoming law and 22 (B) more importantly, actually helped those 23 people it was impacting instead of hurting them 24 for some reason that I don't understand. 25
