25	recognize Older Americans Month and take the time

to reflect on the countless contributions our seniors have made to our communities, our state, and our country.

Having the opportunity to serve as the Senate's Aging chair has been one of the greatest honors of my time here, because each and every day I get to be involved with people who use their extensive knowledge and the unparalleled wisdom that they have garnered over the years to help me make New York better. And they're never afraid to speak their minds, which I absolutely love.

Earlier today I had the pleasure of being able to address a roomful of older

New Yorkers who were invited to Albany today by the State Office for the Aging to be recognized for their extensive volunteerism. It's an event that serves as a poignant reminder of all that our seniors have done to build up the communities we know and love, and all that they continue to give back.

Through their service, the honorees have not only touched the lives of countless individuals, but have inspired citizens of all ages to get involved.

One individual in particular has truly gone above and beyond, and today I am also honored to recognize Mr. John Thomas of Hyde Park, who was honored at the reception as the 2018 Older New Yorker of the Year.

A Navy veteran, an avid runner, family man and machinist, John has spent his life working to improve the communities he's been a part of and others.

He was nominated for our local awards by his daughter Cari, who is here on his behalf today with her husband Steve. Please stand and be recognized.

(Applause.)

SENATOR SERINO: Cari's father John is someone who has gone above and beyond to use the skills he learned in the Navy, and later in his job at Turbo Products, a manufacturing company, to impact those around him, teaching his own children and their network of friends the value of a hard day's work.

I understand that John and his wife Nancy actually spent much of their lives in Connecticut and moved to New York in 2006 to be with their daughter and their grandchildren.

And for those of you -- the people 1 2 that are watching that live in my district, you can see John running around. Because back in 3 4 1979 when he realized he couldn't keep up with 5 his son, he started to run. So he's been logging his miles and he's run 50,000 miles, which is the 6 7 equivalent of running around the world twice. 8 Can you imagine that? 9 So since then, you can also find him 10 around our local town, always on volunteer missions. And I know he's especially involved in 11 12 helping low-income seniors and veterans in our community rebuild and improve their homes through 13 14 Rebuilding Together, which is a great 15 organization. We are also thankful for all that 16 John has done and continues to do to help move 17 18 our community forward, and it is my honor to be able to recognize him in the chamber today. 19 20 Cari, on your father's behalf, we welcome you here today. And please know that we 21 consider ourselves very lucky to count your 22 father and your family among our neighbors. 23 Thank you, Mr. President. 24 25 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Thank

On behalf of all the members of the 2 3 house, we want to remind everyone that this 4 resolution was adopted on May 1st of this year. 5 And to all our guests who are present today, as we recognize and extend our 6 7 appreciation and gratitude to all of the seniors in New York for what they do each and every day 8 and what they have done throughout their lives to 9 10 make our state and communities a better place, we extend a warm welcome. And also the privileges 11 12 of the house are extended to all of our guests 13 today. 14 Once again, let's applaud those in 15 attendance. 16 (Standing ovation.) 17 ACTING PRESIDENT GRIFFO: Senator 18 DeFrancisco, Senator Serino has opened up the resolution for cosponsorship.
